Onancock Man Wins Millions in State Lottery

Addison Matthews of Onancock is a winner. A big winner.

The semi-retired Accomack-Northampton Electric Cooperative worker recently took a \$20 chance that netted a \$2,808,989 victory.

He was in Virginia Beach on Easter Sunday and bought a "50X the Money" scratch-off Virginia Lottery ticket at the Rite-Aid on Virginia Beach Boulevard, which will receive a \$10,000 bonus for selling the winning ticket.

That ticket yielded the top prize of \$5 million. The 72-year-old opted for the cash payout instead of taking the money over 30 years. "That is too long for me," he explained Tuesday.

"A lot of times I buy a \$10 scratch off," Mat-

thews continued. "That ticket was a \$20 one. I was just passing by and I thought I'd try my luck and it was a good one, I guess."

"I really haven't made plans" as to how to spend the money, he said. "We're just relaxing a little bit now.

We've got to sit down, my wife and I, and figure out what we're going to do."

He could be gathering material for a comedy routine.

"Right now everybody is hyped up," Matthews said. "One guy who called me said. You know you're my daddy. My mama says you're my daddy."

Matthews laughed. He's been at his job for

Northampton Will Try To Consolidate Zoning Ordinance Proposals

Northampton supervisors once again focused their attention on the county's Zoning Ordinance Monday.

When the two newest supervisors took office in January, the board voted 3-2, that it would work to overturn the 2015 Zoning Ordinance and re-instate the 2009 ordinance. A resulting joint public hearing with the Planning Commission elicited comments from scores of citizens, some supporting the 2015 ordinance and others urging that it be overturned.

Chairman Spencer Murray suggested starting with the 2009 ordinance and selecting portions of the 2015 ordinance that the entire board could accept. He stressed the need to ensure that neighboring property owners can address proposed uses via the special-use permit and

public hearing process.

Throughout the evening, the board reviewed dozens of requests from citizens seeking to have the zoning on their property changed to reflect what would be allowed under whichever version of the ordinance the board adopts.

The board moved to have the county staff continue developing one clean version, thereby eliminating the need

to search through previous versions to determine if a use is allowed.

The supervisors also discussed the

Motorcyclist Killed in Thursday Morning Crash

A motorcyclist was killed in a crash on Lankford Highway near Birdsnest Thursday morning.

The victim was identified as Mark Steven Cousineau, 56, of Falling Waters, W.Va., who died at the scene, according to 1st Sgt. Ben E. Jeffrey Jones, State Police area commander for the Shore.

The collision was reported at about 8:30 a.m. at the intersection of Red Bank Road and Lankford Highway. An investigation determined the Harley Davidson motorcycle entered the intersection from Red Bank Road and "failed to yield the right of way to oncoming traffic," Jones said. He added

that the motorcycle was attempting to go across the highway when it was struck by a northbound 2008 Saturn SUV.

The driver of that vehicle was Christopher Damian Tolbert, 33, of Chesapeake, Va. Neither he nor any of his three passengers was injured.

Jones said all northbound lanes and one southbound lane of Lankford Highway were closed while the State Police Reconstruction Team investigated. The Virginia Department of Transportation detoured northbound traffic onto Red Bank Road.

Trooper Ryan Dougherty investigated. Officers from the Northampton County Sheriff's Office assisted.

He didn't scratch the ticket until after he got home Sunday. Then he realized he won. "I was excited. I couldn't sleep that night," he admitted.

On Tuesday, two days after he purchased the ticket, he went back to the store to pick up his winnings and an exaggerated \$5 million check.

"No," he said he hasn't made any big purchases yet. Matthews is known for having a fantastic display of Christmas lights in the yard. It appears to be a competition with the neighbors. "I've got to have more lights," he said.

Matthews has three real children and a "bunch of grandkids" to spread the wealth among.

Middle-School Teacher Found Not Guilty of Sexual Abuse of Students

A Pocomoke Middle School teacher who lives in Parksley was acquitted of sexually assaulting students earlier this month and is seeking to be reinstated with Worcester County Public Schools (WCPS) in Maryland.

Twelve charges against William Albert Cathell Jr., 43, of Parksley Road were dismissed on March 17 in Worcester County Circuit Court. A jury found the 10-year foreign-language teacher not guilty of the other 12 counts the next day.

The judge "said he read from transcripts of my cross-examination," defense lawyer Thomas Morrow of Hunt Valley, Md., said Tuesday. Two of the four girls "could not say that his (Cathell's) contact was intentional or accidental. They couldn't say if it was from his knee, hip or something he was carrying," Morrow added. The judge dismissed those charges.

Once the evidence regarding the rest of the charges was presented, the


jury deliberated for about an hour and 45 minutes.

"I can't imagine anybody would want to be a teacher when all they have to do is say he touched my butt and they are gone," Morrow continued. "The atmosphere in the schools is very unsupportive of the teachers. The teachers are given no presumption of innocence whatsoever."

"Kids lie about stuff all the time," the lawyer said. "Anybody who has kids knows that. ... I have a theory that these students really don't realize or comprehend that. ... His life was really going to be turned around ... even when exonerated it's still lingering like a bad odor in the community."

WCPS spokesperson Carrie N. Sterrs said now that the court case is over, the school "administration will be evaluating Mr. Cathell's employment status. Mr. Cathell remains on administrative leave until the school system reviews these circumstances."

Accomack Circuit Court

Judgment was withheld in Accomack Circuit Court last week in the felony case of a Virginia Beach animal activist who admitted to stealing a dog from an Eastern Shore man's yard in January 2015.

Bettina Cuce Rodriquez, 40, of Inlet Road pleaded not guilty to the charge. She claims the dog was not being properly taken care of and that her action was justified. When she was stopped by police after leaving the Shore, she lied to authorities about the animal, she also admitted.

Also indicted for the theft are Charlene Boyajian, 46, of Virginia Beach and Gordon "Shotgun" A. Shell, 46, a former MMA (mixed martial arts) fighter from Detroit, Mich. Shell's trial is set for May 26. Boyajian's will be on Aug. 11.

Daniel Melendez of Hopeton told a Spanish interpreter for the court that

the dog in question was his pet, a pit bull named Chico. He testified that he took care of the dog.

Animal Control Officer Fairy McPherson of Accomack County Sheriff's Office said Monday she checked on Chico after getting complaints in November 2014 and she found the dog to be healthy. There was no physical evidence to the contrary shown by the defense, she reported.

Judge W. Revell Lewis did not explain why he didn't come to a conclusion in Rodriguez's trial. He continued her bond and set Aug. 1, 2016, as the deadline for a presentence report to be completed.

A capias was ordered for Melendez earlier this month when he left the trial before testifying. The case was continued when officers couldn't find him. He was later picked up and released on bond. Melendez will have a hearing after he retains a lawyer.

Northampton Circuit Court

A Birdsnest woman, convicted of two felonies in connection with a fight that broke out in Northampton Circuit Court in 2014 after her brother was convicted of beating a teenager with a baseball bat, was sentenced to three years in prison Monday.

All but six months was suspended for 24-year-old Caitlyn Carpenter Rowley. She was given the concurrent terms for assault and battery of Sgt. Jason Campbell of the Exmore Police Department and destruction of property when she kicked his police cruiser.

"She was out of control," Commonwealth's Attorney Bruce Jones said just after the Oct. 20, 2014, incident. "This went all the way down the stairs. Her brother was convicted of a serious crime and she lost her grip ... you'd think it was a situation where she could keep control of herself ... this actually occurred while circuit court was in session."

Campbell was one of the key witnesses in the case involving Rowley's brother, Elijah Jordan Carpenter, 22, of Birdsnest.

Rowley was ordered to pay \$1,137.50 in restitution.

In another case, Bonnie Lou Thomp-

son, 55, formerly of Onley, was sentenced for possession with intent to distribution of a Schedule I or II drug and distribution of the Schedule I or II drug to 10 years with seven years and six months suspended, on each count. For distribution of a Schedule IV drug on Jan. 6, 2015, she got five years, with two years and six months suspended. Her driver's license was suspended for six months.

Cordella Aretha Smith, 45, of Exmore was sentenced for unlawful wounding, occurring Aug. 2, 2015, to five years, with three years and six months suspended She was initially charged with the more serious offense of malicious wounding. Both crimes are felonies.

Sean Alexander Burton, 27, of Keller pleaded guilty to eluding and assault of a police officer in connection with a fight that involved gunfire last April at the former Sage Restaurant in Exmore. A presentence report was ordered.

Manolo Salas, also known as Manolo Salas Perez, 32, of Exmore was sentenced to five years for strangulation, with all but four years and seven months suspended. The crime occurred Oct. 4, 2015.

A third offense was added recently to a list of charges against Nicholas Martinez White, the suspect being held without bond in Accomack Jail, charged with the murder of a 13-year-old boy in October 2015, according to court records.

In addition to second-degree murder and use of a firearm in the killing, White, 23, of Bayside Road in Onancock is accused of using a sawed-off shotgun or rifle in the crime.

The charge was filed in Accomack General District Court but will be transferred to the Juvenile and Domestic Relations Court where a preliminary hearing for all three felonies will be heard in April.

The victim, Breonya Collins, a seventh-grade Nandua Middle School student, died of a gunshot wound to the head that day. While warrants give White's address as Onancock, defense lawyer Shannon Dunham said the defendant was living at the Keller Pond

shooting occurred.

Another man with the name Nicholas (Rufus) White was indicted on unrelated sex counts with a child. The 21-year-old Salisbury, Md., man was extradited from Maryland on March 25 and is also being held without bond in Accomack Jail.

The two have been confused because the warrant for the Maryland suspect was not included with his file until he was arrested and there was no way to tell how old he was nor his address. He is charged with rape and sodomy without force involving a child 13 to 15 years old between July 1 and Aug. 31, 2015.

An Onancock woman charged with two counts of "felony dog attack" waived her right to a preliminary hearing Monday in Accomack General District Court. Judge Gordon Vincent certified the allegations to a grand jury, which will convene next week.

The charges involve two young sisters who were grabbed and bitten by the canines while waiting for the school bus near their home on Jan. 4.

Authorities said Tuesday that Edna Lenae Parker, 38, of Circle Drive surrendered the two dogs because of the aggression and they were euthanized by Accomack Animal Control.

Meanwhile, the victims' mother, Tonya Hernandez of Mink Farm Road, said Parker still has another dog and recently acquired two puppies. All are pit bulls. She said she fears for her children who wait at the end of a half-milelong driveway to catch the bus.

Parker is accused of being "the owner of a canine ... commit(ting) willful act(s) of omission in the care, control or containment of such animal so ... culpable as to show a reckless disregard for human life and was the proximate cause of such animal attacking and causing se-

Road house near Keller where the rious injury to a person." She remains free on a \$2,000 secured bond.

> Hernandez identified her daughters as Victoria Hernandez, a 17-year-old Nandua High School student, and Mariana Hernandez, a sixth grader who attends Nandua Middle School, Mariana was hospitalized for several days. Victoria was bitten in the leg by the female dog while trying to help her sister, the mother said. It was the first day back to school after the holidays.



Northampton School Budget May Have To Be Chopped

The Northampton School Board focused on the FY17 budget when it met last week.

Superintendent Eddie Lawrence reported that the budget presented by the General Assembly provides funding for a 2 percent salary increase for teachers, but does not support funding for two additional staff members for each school system in the state.

Lawrence emphasized that if the state's budget is approved, the school system's budget will need \$100,000 in additional local funding beyond what had been planned, or an equal amount will need to be chopped.

School Board Chairman Skip Oaklev asked the finance sub-committee to review the proposed FY17 school budget, cutting \$100,000 from the priority list, in the event that the Board of Supervisors does not provide the additional local funds. He added that the com-

mittee should move quickly in order to meet the supervisors' timeline for completing the entire county budget.

In other business, Northampton High School band instructor Kevin Schwenk estimated how much it would cost to fix damaged musical instruments at the various schools. The board agreed to fund repairs up to \$9,000.

The School Board approved the results of the survey regarding the 2016-17 school calendar. New staff will begin work on Aug. 15 and the last day for students will be June 14, 2017.

Also during last week's meeting, students entertained members of the public as well as the School Board. performing skits they created for the Odyssey of the Mind competition earlier in the month. The skits provided involved a water-related problem that they had to solve, each approaching the challenge in a different way.

Wachapreague Councilman Joeckel Seeking Another Term

John W. Joeckel, who has served on Wachapreague Town Council since 2011, is running for re-election May 3.

Citing his accomplishments, Joeckel said he has been responsible for town finances since FY2013 and, with the support of council, balanced the budget each year and reduced property taxes by 25 percent. "With prudent management of town expens-

es, town cash assets have increased over 13 percent from the end of FY2012 through February 2016," Joeckel said.

Responsible for the town marina, Joeckel noted that he managed the 2014 town marina dredging project for no compensation while previous councils



According to Joeckel, after decades of unsuccessfully trying to get the waterway dredged, he alone worked with the Army Corps of Engineers and Coast Guard staff, along with the governor's office, to gain approval and funding in 2012 for dredging Wachapreague Channel, which was completed in 2013.

Joeckel said he also worked with the Corps of Engineers to dredge Bradford's Bay Channel, which was completed in 2014.

He noted that in 2013, he led the fight against the Coast Guard's plan to remove 135 Aids to Navigation over the 100 miles of the seaside Virginia Inside Passage, has since been working with the Coast Guard to maintain them, and worked with supervisors to implement a bi-county approach to waterway issues.

According to Joeckel, with support from the majority of council, he created the Wachapreague Business and Tourism Advisory Board to manage the tourism funds appropriated from a portion of the town's transient and meal taxes.

Asking for residents' support through their votes, Joeckel noted that he:

- •is the town's representative on the Accomack-Northampton County Planning District Commission;
- •acquired necessary information and authored 69 pages of the final Town of Wachapreague Comprehensive Plan;
- •led and wrote an in-depth review of the town's garbage collection program;
- •authors the annual "Year End in Review" that is included in the property tax mailings to town residents.

Joeckel has proposed a fishing/crabbing pier with parking on the south side of town to provide public access to Wachapreague's working waterfront. He said approximately 94 percent of the projected costs will be covered by various grants.





Health Matters Rabies Poses Real Threat on Eastern Shore

On March 23, a raccoon behaving strangely was found roaming

near the parking lot of the Community Services Board in Exmore. Town police officers immediately killed the raccoon, which was sent for analysis and confirmed to be rabid.

This is only the latest of several rabies cases that

have been confirmed in raccoons in Northampton County this year.

The Eastern Shore Health District urges residents to make sure the rabies

vaccinations are up-to-date on all their dogs, cats, ferrets and livestock. If they are not, arrangements should be made with a veterinarian to administer a booster shot.

Children should be instructed not to approach wild or stray animals.

If a wild or stray animal attacks you, immediately wash the wound with warm,

soapy water and/or alcohol, then notify the health department and your doctor.

If your pet is attacked, immediately notify the health department and call your veterinarian. If you handle your pet after an encounter, wear gloves and immediately wash your hands with warm, soapy water and/or alcohol.







n 2015, the Office of the Attorney General completed a one-year review of all the jurisdictions whose concealed handgun permits were recognized as valid in the commonwealth. That reidentified view several jurisdictions that cur-

rently fail to meet the statutory requirements for recognition of the concealed handgun permits they issue.

In response to this review, Gov. McAuliffe and the Virginia General Assembly have reached a legislative solution to ensure the continued recognition of concealed carry permits. Action to terminate existing agreements and mutual recognition has been delayed to allow the new provisions to take effect on July 1, 2016, making revocation unnecessary.

EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2016

The holder of a valid concealed handgun or concealed weapon permit or license issued by another state may

carry a concealed handgun in Virginia provided:

•the holder of such permit or license is at least 21 years of age;

•the permit or license holder carries a photo identification issued by a government agency of any state or by the U.S. Department of Defense or U.S. Department of State:

•the holder displays the permit or license and such identification upon demand by a law-enforcement officer;

•the permit or license holder has not previously had a Virginia concealed handgun permit revoked.

The legislation also provides that the Virginia State Police, in conjunction with the Office of the Attorney General, will work with the various jurisdictions to secure reciprocal privileges for Virginia citizens desiring to carry concealed in other states.

Please note, however, although the new law will require Virginia to grant recognition to all states that issue permits, those states may not authorize Virginia permit holders to possess a firearm in their state. You will need to contact each state to determine if they will recognize your Virginia permit.

county's debt to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) revolving around the sale of the former Sustainable Technology Industrial Park (STIP) several years ago. It left the county owing the USDA approximately \$600,000 as a result of the original grant agreement.

Over the past several months, County Administrator Katie Nunez, county staff, and the supervisors hashed out an agreement by which the county would spend an equal amount on public projects in order to settle the matter. With nearly \$500,000 of the amount spent and accounted for the board had proposed to install an emergency generator at each of the county's two elementary schools at a budgeted cost of \$50,000 each. But the bid for each generator came in at twice the budgeted amount, leaving the board with the option of obtaining only one generator or seeking permission from the USDA to substitute other projects. In the end, the board agreed to scrap the generator option and seek approval of the USDA to purchase two patrol vehicles for the Sheriff's Department and several automated external defibrillators (AEDs).

Murray briefly addressed the 2016 property reassessment process and noted that many of the reassessment notices that property owners had received reflected a sizable decrease in their property values. Once the supervisors receive an estimate of revenue projections, it will be their job to determine the new tax rates needed to generate the funds the county's needs for FY2017 budget. Requests from the various county agencies as well as the school system far exceed current revenues.

Once the budget process has been finalized, there will be a public hearing on the document prior to a vote.

I shore Little League, says it is amazing what three volunteers who spend a half hour each at the park can accomplish.

"Everybody thinks volunteering means spending lots of time here and maybe stays away because they think it is a huge commitment. But it doesn't have to be," said Ferebee, who spent six hours at the Randy Custis Memorial Park this past Tuesday. "We will accept any amount of time a volunteer is willing to give, even if it is a half hour."

Then there is Thomas James, who recently completed a five-month project building two concrete 12'x20' dugouts for the softball field.

James, a project estimator at Bayshore Concrete, planned and supervised every step of the process of erecting two of the finest dugouts I have ever seen at a youth facility.

The spacious dugouts have hooks for bats, gloves and helmets and a great line of sight to the field behind the screen that protects the players from foul balls. One dugout has a press box with controls for the scoreboard perched above it.

Roger Eitelman, executive director of the Randy Custis Memorial Park, estimates the dugouts would cost \$25,000 to build if the league had to buy the materials and hire the labor. Yet the only cost to the league was about \$1,800 in fencing, thanks to James and his employer, Bayshore Concrete of Cape Charles.

"Bayshore allowed me to use excess concrete from different jobs, and I precast the walls of the dugouts at the plant," said James. "We started the foundation last August and finished up over the winter."

It's a family affair at the park for

James. His son, Dunton, completed an Eagle Scout project by expanding the concession building. Dunton, 17, once played ball at the park, but is now responsible for mowing the grass at the complex.

James' two daughters, Branham, 16, and Yeats, 13, both play softball at the park.

Opening day Saturday, April 9, will be the 60th opening day for Shore Little League, which started in 1956 with one field behind the funeral home in Nassawadox, a little more than a long fly ball from the current location.

At that time, only boys 9 to 12 played Little League baseball on that field, rented year after year by the league.

Today, there are more than 800 boys and girls from ages 4 to 18 playing five sports — baseball, softball, soccer, volleyball and football — on five different fields spread out over 31 acres owned by the Randy Custis Memorial Fund.

Northampton and Nandua middle-school teams also have used the facility for their games, and Ferebee says the league welcomes any school team that wants to use the facility.

There is also a playground enjoyed by kids of all ages at all times of the day since the park is always open during daylight hours. And many area residents can be found walking through the park for recreation and exercise.

Night baseball is now being played with the addition of lights costing \$75,000 at the Major League field four years ago.

"The kids think it is really cool to play under the lights," said Phil Custis, president of the Randy Custis Memorial Park Board of Directors.

Plans are in place to install lights at the softball field, only now those same lights will cost \$105,000.

"We hope to have district and state tournaments here once we get the second set of lights," said Custis.

District and state tournaments

bring as many as eight teams from other locations and hundreds of fans who eat at local restaurants and stay at local hotels.

Some 20 banners from district and state competition are displayed at the park, with the girls winning all but two of the banners, including several for state championships. Last year's 14-18 girls finished third in the state.

The Randy Custis Memorial Park is a tribute to the son of Phil and Barbara Custis. As a 9-year-old, Randy played Little League baseball on that old Nassawadox field. Later in that summer of 1978, he was killed in an automobile accident when struck by a drunk driver while visiting relatives in Montana.

His parents established the Randy Custis Memorial Fund so that other children could benefit from the game and grow to love baseball as much as Randy did.


In 1988, Little League players threw out the first pitch. Among the players in those early years were Randy's two brothers, Spen and Parke, who hit the first home run ever at the new complex.

Hundreds of youth play ball at the park and never participate in sports again, moving on to other interests. But many more play high-school sports and beyond. Eitleman notes that this past year, six high-school seniors who first participated in a sport at the park signed to play in college. They include Derek Bjorlo, Sydney Parks, Dontae Weatherly, Jake Guy and Taylor and Kennedy Webb. There's also noted alumnus Tyler Webb, who was a scholarship athlete at the University of South Carolina and today is one step away from the major leagues in the New York Yankees organization.

"That's quite a return on the investment," says Custis.

As for James and his volunteer work, he's not finished. He's already planning similar dugouts for the Major League and the T-ball fields.

"We will have to lower that front wall a bit so the T-ball players can see the field," said James, always thinking one step ahead, just like a good coach.





Focus Will Be on Cancer April 10

Dear Editor:

One Sunday after the "prayer concerns" part of the service, Pastor Don Blagg at Downings U.M. Church in Oak Hall remarked, "It seems like every week someone has a prayer concern for a loved one with cancer." The congregation decided to set aside a day for those with cancer. On Sunday, April 10, at 7 p.m., Downings will open its doors to anyone who wants to come and pray for cancer victims.

I know prayer works. In July 2012, I was diagnosed with ovarian/uterine cancer. As my diagnosis became known to family and friends, people started praying for me. Several local churches on the Shore, friends around the country and world — those I knew and many I didn't know — prayed for me.

In August that year, I had surgery. Dr. Im removed a grapefruit-sized tumor, as well as some lymph nodes to see if the cancer had spread. He highly recommended chemotherapy. As I waited for the test results, I met with an oncologist, chatted with folks on the cancer network and did research. Nowhere could I find "surgery and nothing else" — it was all "surgery and various types of chemicals/radiation."

I began to pray about the next step. Did I really want to put my body through chemo/radiation treatment? The lab results came back and indicated that the cancer had not spread.

I prayed again with my pastor's wife, Nancy. She added, "Give Amy a sign to let her know she is making the right decision." I was leaning toward not going through chemotherapy. One Saturday in October, as I was weeding under the rosebush, I looked up and saw two rosebuds. They weren't supposed to be blooming this time of year! I woke up Sunday morning realizing the two rosebuds were a sign from God that I made the right decision. I decided not to get the chemo, but just monitor with mammograms and blood tests. It has been almost four years now and still no signs of cancer! Thanks be to God and all the prayers.

Although my story of "no-chemo" is rare, there may be those who need chemo treatment. In any case, those with cancer need prayers.

It is my hope that all places of worship on the Eastern Shore will join Downings and open their doors to the community on April 10 and/or say a prayer for cancer victims during service. Those who can't make it to church can pray where they are, any time during the day. Pray for cancer victims, their family, friends, caregivers, medical staff and researchers working on finding a cure. Pray that those touched by cancer find comfort and peace. Light a candle. Read scripture. Sing songs.
