# Another Fatal Shooting, This One Near Mappsville

A homicide a week; that's what June has been like this year on the Eastern Shore of Virginia.

The most recent killing involved a shootout on Lankford Highway near Mappsville and

a continuing search for suspect Tyqon Demetrius Robins, 24, of Nelsonia.

alerted to gunshots being
fired between
the occupants

of two vehicles traveling on Lankford Highway near Mappsville.

A few minutes later, a second caller reported that a gunshot victim was on Nathaniel Street in that town. Deputies, troopers and rescue personnel arrived at the site to find Fardale (also known as Fairdale) Antonio Johnson, 39, of Mappsville. He had been hit with the gunfire and was pronounced dead at the scene.

"Based on the investigation into this incident," Godwin said, "arrest warrants have been issued" charging Robins with first-degree murder, use of a firearm in a felony and discharging

# Details on Recent Slayings Disclosed

More details have surfaced about a Portsmouth man shot to death in Exmore June 18 with a .22 caliber Beretta handgun.

Ronald Graves, 30, was found wounded in Capeville and taken to Sentara Norfolk General Hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

Mona Jones, age and address not available, who also was injured in the Exmore incident and found in Capeville, was taken to Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital in Nassawadox.

Sgt. Jason Campbell of Exmore Police Department wrote in documents filed in Northampton General District Court that Alexander Picott-Cleveland, 22, of Arlington Road in Capeville shot people in the roadway.

"I was dispatched to Frederick Douglass (Road) for a shooting," wrote Campbell. "Based on witness statements, I was able to identity ... Picott-Cleveland as the person who shot Mona Jones twice in the neck, Ranquise Coston (numerous) times in the body and Andre Johnson once in the face. He shot all three people in the roadway of Madam C.J. Walker Road, during a large party attended by kids and adults with a .22 caliber Beretta handgun. The gun was turned over to the office by Alexander's sister, a witness to this incident."

According to Northampton Sheriff David Doughty, Picott-Cleveland fled the scene. Police from his department, Exmore and Cape Charles, as well as aircraft from Virginia Beach Police Department and Maryland State Police searched the surrounding areas for about eight hours, until 3:30 a.m. Picott-Cleveland was apprehended by deputies at 6:45 a.m.

Coston and Johnson (ages and addresses not available) were taken to the hospital from the

# Northampton County Considers Fate of Surplus Property

"For Sale" signs soon may begin to spring up on some properties owned, but deemed as surplus, by Northampton County.

The Board of Supervisors has compiled a list of surplus properties, all of which at one time served a variety of purposes for county residents and visitors.

665-5967 • 665-5023 800-772-5023 **Parksley, VA**  Board Chairman Spencer Murray divided the properties into those that likely need to be sold, those that could be rented, and those that might have some future use by the county.

Smaller parcels, such as one just south of the Cape Charles traffic signal, that had once been a picnic area, will be offered for sale once a request for proposal (RFP) is advertised. Also included in this group are two former greenbox sites, one in Cheapside and the other in Bayview. The board agreed that these three sites have few potential uses other than possibly as communication antenna sites.

The property adjacent to Occohannock Elementary School, once the home of Exmore-Willis Wharf School but currently a vacant lot, was reviewed with an eye to its possible reuse by the school system. It was agreed to discuss the property with the School Board to see if it might be feasible for future expansion by the school.

The former county jail adjacent to

the County Administration Building my well be on the list of buildings to be razed. A small structure that also once served as a jail might be spared, assuming funding can be obtained for its renovation.

At least one property is a potential source of revenue. An area behind Kiptopeke Elementary School is suitable for raising crops and, as such, could be rented out to an area farmer.

The former Northampton Middle School in Machipongo is one of the larger properties and continues to be used by multiple county departments. If other sites are found to meet the needs of these departments, the county would need to decide the best use of the school. The structure dates to the mid 1950s, although a wing was added in 1993.

The board briefly discussed the possibility of obtain property at Wise Point, should the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service opt to divest itself of the site. The property backs up to the southern end of the Virginia Inside Passage, near the northern end of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel and contains a boat launching facility and other amenities.

Should the RFPs produce interested buyers or renters, it will be up to the supervisors to decide if they wish to sell or rent the properties.

Johnson was no stranger to local law enforcement. He pleaded guilty in December 1995 to malicious maiming and was given a suspended five-year prison

term. In September 2010, Johnson was convicted of distribution of cocaine and given 20 years, with 15 suspended.

Robins was found guilty in absentia earlier this month for not having his driver's license in his possession when he was pulled over on May 5. He was fined \$10. He also was convicted in his absence for going 82 miles per hour in a 55-mile-per-hour zone and fined \$260.

## ACCOMACK SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER NOT RE-APPOINTED

The Accomack County School Board Selection Commission met in a closed session for 40 minutes Thursday afternoon and then voted unanimously to oust School Board member Janet Martin-Turner of District 7 with no public explanation.

The panel also unanimously re-appointed Naudya Mapp of District 9, who did not attend either the public hearing or the voting session.

In a separate vote, the board unanimously turned down candidate Peggy Drewer, a former teacher and school volunteer from Davis Wharf. Drewer also was seeking the District 9 seat.

Member Aaron Kane of District 3 was returned for four more years. The former music teacher was unopposed and has served on the board for over a decade.

The unanimous vote against Turner means District 7 will not be represented on the board until someone else is chosen. She was not opposed. The position is being re-advertised and a public hearing will be held July 21 at 7 p.m. in the Accomack Board Chambers. The next School Board meeting is July 19.

Turner, an outspoken member who was an activist, PTA leader and school volunteer before she was appointed last year, filled the unexpired term of Shannon Wessells after Wessells and her family moved to District 9.

Some School Board members were upset when Turner said she had been told of a "secret" meeting between three School Board members and a candidate for the superintendent's post.

In December, when Turner was absent from a session because of a family health emergency, she was reprimanded publicly by School Board Chairwoman Margaret Miles.

"Mrs. Turner, as the school board chair, I find your actions to be extremely inappropriate and counter-productive to our role as a School Board," Miles read from a prepared statement. "At this time, please let the minutes show that you are being officially reprimanded for your actions at the Nov. 17 School Board meeting as well as any other related actions."

"I am asking that you take every opportunity available including school board member training to avoid this kind of behavior or anything related to it from taking place again," Miles continued. "It is my hope that you will work closely with us on behalf of the staff and children of our school division."

The previous month, Turner announced she had been told by "a reliable source" that members Ronnie Holden, Paul Bull and Travis Thornton met at Chincoteague High School with then principal Chris Holland. Turner said she would have liked to attend the meeting or at least been informed of it. Holden, Bull and Thornton denied there was a meeting.

Among those who came out to support Turner at the public hearing earlier this month were former Metompkin Elementary School PTA President Meredith O'Brien, Board of Supervisors' Chairman Ron Wolff, Supervisor Grayson Chesser and Chesser's daughter, Elizabeth Taylor, who is a volunteer at Kegotank Elementary School. A dozen or so teachers and school workers also stood up at the session to show their support of Turner.

"I am not surprised by the selection

commission vote," said Turner. "I have enjoyed serving on the School Board and was urged to do so by many parents, teachers, building-level administrators and community leaders."

During the nine months I was on the School Board," she continued, "I asked candid questions of the Central Office staff and the superintendent in the interest of knowing more about the school division and my honest curiosity. What I discovered is that questions and sharing information is neither appreciated or tolerated. I approached all decisions like any other interested parent who wants only the best for ALL of the students in our schools. I was true to myself and the residents of Accomack County."

Chesser was upset about the way Turner's ouster was handled. "I believe when there's a vote about issues that controversial that you have a moral obligation to explain your reasons to the citizens and to the applicants."

"It's so frustrating it's hard to put it into words," said Wolff. "When you have someone who goes out of their way for the betterment of the county and gets slapped in the face. They don't get recognized for the hard work for the county ... it just shows how broken the system is. There's no accountability to the grassroots population of the county when you have a panel that is selected by the judge. It's action like that that begs for an elected School Board."

Some concerned citizens say they will circulate petitions to make that a reality.

Meanwhile, there is speculation about whether one member of the selection commission should be serving.

Speaking personally, Supervisor Paul Muhly said, "This is a punitive system out of control with the losers being the students and teachers."

According to state code, a selection commission shall be composed either of three members appointed from the county at large or one member appointed from each election district.

There are nine members on Accomack's selection commission, one for each district. Milton Bunting, the designee for District 9, actually lives in Savageville, between Melfa and Onancock, which is in District 8.

Maximino Lopez, also known as Maximino Lopez Garcia, 43, of Ames Farm Road in Painter was sentenced this week in Accomack Circuit Court for the malicious maiming of José Morales on Oct. 15, 2015. He received five years, with all but time served suspended.

Morales, testified through a Spanish interpreter that he was sitting in a van texting when Lopez "attacked me with a knife" and said, "I'm going to kill you."

"I lifted my head and I saw the reflection of the knife," Morales continued. "So when I saw the knife. I put out my hand and I pushed it ... I yelled for the police. I shouted because he was going to kill me."

The incident occurred at 6Ls farm near Belle Haven where the two men worked.

In another case, Derrick Gladstone

Charnock, 31, of Nocks Landing Road in Oak Hall was sentenced for stealing property belonging to Dollar General in Parksley on June 23, 2015, to five years, with all but time served suspended Supervised probation was ordered for three years.

#### Northampton Circuit Court

Eighteen-year-old Malik Javon Johnson of Exmore has been linked to Smith Beach resident Delvn Martin.

who was killed in January.

Johnson pleaded guilty Monday in Northampton Circuit Court to two counts of burglary and two counts of grand larceny that occurred in May and December 2015. One of the crimes involved breaking into the home of Martin.

Police recovered a cell-phone video that belonged to Johnson. It was taken a little after 3 p.m. Dec. 14, 2015. According to a search warrant, it depicted at least four people "celebrating after opening a dark zippered suitcase with a mesh inside pocket containing credit/bank cards and a large amount of U.S. currency and marijuana in Zip-

loc bags, as well as mason jars containing marijuana."

Text messages and statements obtained by the Northampton County Sheriff's Office include, "Martin's residence was shot several times on or about Dec. 22, 2015 ... Martin did not report this crime to law enforcement."

On Jan. 3, 2016, Martin was found dead at his home. His bedroom and living room were ransacked.

An autopsy found the 51-year-old was fatally shot.

Johnson was also responsible for other residential burglaries in which loaded firearms were stolen in May 2015.

When Martin reported the December burglary at this residence, he also told police that \$900 in cash, speakers, a TV and a laptop were taken and the bedroom was ransacked. An investigation has determined that a large amount of marijuana in mason jars and Ziploc bags and thousands of dollars in U.S. currency were stolen

Jamal D'Angelo Stratton, 21, of Jackie Drive in Cape Charles pleaded

guilty Monday in Northampton Cir-

cuit Court to hit and run with property damage of more than \$1,000, occurring Feb. 21. A presentence report was ordered.

James Randolph Richardson, 57, of Nassawadox was sentenced Monday for possession of heroin in November 2014 to three years, with all but time served. His driver's license was suspended for six months.

Brandon Nigel Johnson, 34, of Birdsnest was sentenced on each of two counts of larceny to five years, with three years suspended. The crimes occurred in December 2014. The terms were set to run concurrently.

scene in Exmore.

Picott-Cleveland was charged with second-degree murder of Graves, use of a firearm in the murder, malicious wounding of Jones, Coston and Johnson causing significant physical impairment, and three counts of use of a firearm in the woundings, all of which are felonies. Picott-Cleveland also was charged with reckless handling of a firearm and brandishing a firearm, both misdemeanors. He is being held without bond in Eastern Shore Regional Jail.

Records show Picott-Cleveland has lived on the Eastern Shore all his life and most of his family are in the area. He is unemployed and has no previous

criminal record.


Lawyer Tucker Watson of Eastville was appointed to represent Picott-Cleveland.

Officials have not released anything new about the June 15 death of Eric Clifford Rhatigan, 41, with addresses in both Belle Haven and Eastville. Rhatigan was found in a dirt field about 145 feet from Davis Wharf Road near Craddockville in Accomack.

The search warrant states the victim's "black/gray cell phone" was found 70 feet from the body. Police sought the warrant in an effort to gain access to the phone's data.

The cause and manner of death for Rhatigan have not been disclosed.

#### Cheriton Seeks To Protect Its Youth



Safety concerns for young people drew the attention of Cheriton Town Council during its meeting last week.

Councilwoman Mary Mears expressed major concerns regarding the misuse of all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) on public streets in the town, noting that she had observed teens and young people riding on the ATVs in the eve-

ning, sometimes without lights, in the area of Mill and Maple streets. She said that at other times, teens were allowing younger children to ride with them without regard for safety. Operating ATVs on a public street is illegal and council indicated that it would be brought to the attention of law-enforcement authorities.

Council then turned its focus to the protection of homebound residents. In the wake of recent strong storms, it was decided to develop a list of homebound individuals in order to have a way to quickly check on them in the event that the area is hit by a major storm that could endanger their health. 

# Wallops Announces Another Successful Launch

NASA successfully launched a Terrier-Improved Orion suborbital sounding rocket carrying student experiments with the RockOn/RockSat-C programs last Friday.

More than 200 middle-school, highschool, community-college and university students and instructors participating in Rocket Week at Wallops were on hand to witness the launch.

Through RockOn and RockSat-C. students are learning and applying skills required to develop experiments for suborbital rocket flight. In addition, through the Wallops Rocket Academy for Teachers (WRATS), high-school educators are learning about applying rocketry basics in their curriculum.

The payload flew to an altitude of 74 miles and descended by parachute into the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of Wallops.

The next launch from NASA's Wallops Flight Facility is a Terrier-Improved Malemute suborbital sounding rocket currently scheduled between 6



and 10 a.m., Aug. 16. The rocket will be carrying the RockSat-X education payload.

(1) To amend §III-4.2 to allow churches in the Local Commercial District subject to all other requirements of zoning ordinance. (Would also allow churches on the same conditions in the Highway Commercial District since a permitted use in the Local District is automatically a permitted use in the Highway District.)

(2) To amend §III-6.2 to allow churches in the Limited Industrial District.

(3) To amend §III-5.4 to provide the following minimum setbacks in the Highway-Commercial District: Sideyards 10 ft; Rearyards which abut a residential district 20 ft.; Rearyards which do not abut a residential district 10 ft.; Front Setback: On Rt 13 30 ft; Front Setback: Not on Rt 13 50 ft. Minimum Lot Width: 100 ft.

(4) To amend §III-8.3 by deleting it in its entirety.

(5) To amend Article XIII relating to Zoning Fee Schedule as follows:

Copies of Zoning Ordinance: \$45.00 for entire ordinance or \$0.50 per page, whichever is the lesser; Copies of Town Comprehensive Plan: \$30.00 for entire plan or \$0.50 per page, whichever is the lesser; Copies of Subdivision Ordinance: \$5 for entire ordinance or \$0.50 per page, whichever is the lesser; Review of proposed plats and site plans by town staff: \$10.00 per hour of staff time; Approval of New Subdivisions: \$600.00; Proceedings for Vacation or Revision of Recorded Plats Requiring Advertising and Public Hearing: \$600.00; Zoning Permit (Including Sign Permits): \$10.00 per hour of staff time; Special Use Permit: \$600.00; Variance: \$600.00; Rezoning: \$600.00; Citizen Initiated Amendment to Zoning Ordinance: \$600.00; Amendment to Town Comprehensive Plan: \$600.00; Water Quality Impact Assessment Review: \$50.00; (6) Appeals to Board of Zoning Appeals \$1200.00.

(6) To amend §III-4.4 to add the following requirements in the Local Commercial District: Front Setback: 20 feet; Minimum Lot Width: 100 feet

(7) To amend \$III-8.1 to delete reference to "attached schedule" (\$III-8.3) and substitute "this ordinance."

(8) To amend \$III-3.4 by deleting "except as provided in Section III-8" (would establish a minimum lot area of 12,000 sq. ft. in R-2 district)

(9) To amend Article IV of zoning ordinance (sign ordinance) to comply with the holding of the United States Supreme Court in Reed, Et Al v. Town of Gilbert, Arizona, Et Al, No.13-502 (June 18, 2015) requiring that sign ordinance be content neutral. Specifically, the proposed amendments would:

(a) Require that all outdoor signs, flags, banners, street display message devices, etc. (referenced herein as "signs") be erected on private property by owner of property or with written consent of owner of property; (b) Require that all signs must be located at least 15 feet from a road right of way; (c) Require that all signs shall be built and maintained to be structurally safe and intact and designed so as not to create safety hazards or safety distractions for traffic on nearby streets; (d) Provide that signs meeting all other requirements of law and with message areas of no more than sixteen square feet require no permit from the zoning administrator; (e) Provide that signs of more than 16 square feet to 32 square feet require a permit from the zoning administrator; (f) Provide that signs >32 square feet are prohibited; (g) Provide that, if a sign supporting structure has more than one message area, each message area will be considered a separate sign for the purpose of applying the size standards of the ordinance.

(10) To amend §III-3.5 A by revising it to read as follows: "Except as provided in §§III-3.5 B and III-3.5C below, the front minimum setback line shall be located at least 20 feet from the right-of-way of a street other than US Route 13, and the front minimum setback line shall be located at least 30 feet from the right-of-way of US Route 13."

(11) To amend §III-3.5 C by revising it to read as follows: "A building located on a corner lot shall be set back from both roads as required in §III-3.5 A with both dimensions considered front setbacks."

Copies of the proposed amendments to the zoning ordinance will be available for public review at the Melfa Town Hall prior to the public hearing.



or virtually every year since my son Parke was 5, we have made a trip to Baltimore to see his beloved Orioles play.

Parke, now 33, saw his first Oriole games at the old Memorial Stadium. But by the time he was 9, we were making Camden Yards at Oriole Park our annual destination. Although now 24 years old, Camden Yards is as attractive as ever and a great place to watch a baseball game.

We were there last Friday and Saturday to see the Birds take the first two of a four-game series with Tampa. Baltimore eventually swept the series and increased its first-place lead in the American League East to  $4\frac{1}{2}$  games as of earlier this week.

I grew up a Yankee fan, but was happy to see Parke adopt the Orioles as his favorite team and Cal Ripken as his favorite player. Baltimore was certainly an easier drive to see a game. And there could be no better role model than Ripken, who displayed an amazing work ethic that enabled him to break Lou Gehrig's consecutive games played record that finally ended at 2,632, a mark I don't think will ever be broken.

Parke was born in 1983, the year the Orioles won the World Series. Not only has he not seen the Orioles get back to the Fall Classic, but the Birds could not muster a winning record from 1997 until shortly after Buck Showalter arrived in 2010.

We made a conscious decision several years ago not to take in any Oriole-Yankee games because Parke always brings an extra hat for me to wear. And he doesn't own any Yankee hats.

That way, I can high-five big moments and celebrate an Oriole win

But the Orioles did their part in earning the wins. Outstanding defensive plays by the Oriole infield of third baseman Manny Machado, shortstop J.J. Hardy, second baseman Jonathan Schoop and first baseman Chris Davis highlighted both games. And then there was Gold Glove centerfielder Adam Jones.

Jones and Machado also belted home runs in the two games we witnessed.

Parke's household is solid in the Oriole camp. His 3-year-old daughter says her favorite team is "Manny," and his 14-month-old son sports a Machado T-shirt with the number 13.

Dennis Custis, a lifelong friend and serious Oriole fan who named his dog "Rip" after Cal, arrived on Saturday with his daughter, Katie, who for several years now has given her father Oriole tickets for his birthday. They watched both games of a split double header.

We had a chance to meet before the day game and talk about all things baseball and games past. Ballparks are great for creating lasting memories.

I did think about my father, who first took me to an Oriole-Yankee game when I was 7 because I was already worshipping Mickey Mantle and other Yankees.

My father, a farmer, sold many a bushel of grain and even a 100-pound sack of potatoes for less then two bucks back in the day.

Wonder what he thinks of a large bottle of water selling for \$7.50 at the ballpark these days?

Not much is probably a safe answer.

# **Summer Heating Up ... & So Is the Fishing**

#### Cobia, Flounder Red Drum Among Best Fishing Bets

Summertime is well underway, and the saltwater fishing scene is following suit as catches escalate, according to Dr. Julie Ball's weekly fishing report.

Ball says cobia are still the main target for most anglers. And with good reason. Plenty of fish are around, with some respectable fish in the mix. The bite is still first-rate for both chummers and sight casters. Cobia catches are coming from all over the lower bay, with most fish ranging from 30 to 60

pounds. Latimer Shoal near Buoys 13 and 16 is one of the hotspots.

The Latimer Shoal areas are also still producing decent catches of red drum, although most are becoming incidental by-catches by anglers targeting cobia.

According to Ball, the flounder action continues to rebound from the recent stormy weather. Plenty of keepers are available in the usual flounder spots for those willing to work for them. Anglers drifting baits near the first and third islands of the bridge-tunnel are lucking into some decent fish this week. Flatfish also are coming from the Cell, Buoy 42, Back River Reef, and Oyster. The biggest fish are hitting live bait and jigs around the bridge-tunnel. This trend should improve as the water continues to clear.

Spadefish are gaining some attention, with some folks excited over some larger fish in the schools this year. Spades continue to circle the Chesapeake Light Tower and near shore wrecks, as well as the pilings of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel. Sheepshead action is still on the upswing, with several fish over 10 pounds boated from the CBBT recently. Big trigger fish are also active in these same areas, with some triggers pushing to nearly four pounds, says Ball.

The Virginia offshore season is going strong, with the yellowfin tuna bite still the main attraction. Boats are encountering good numbers of tuna ranging from about 30 to 70 pounds, with a few nice big-eye tunas also around. Big

gaffer-sized mahi are plentiful, while a few mako sharks are still making a showing. Billfish releases are also on the rise.

Farther up the Shore, Ron Greaser of Don's Tackle Shop in Wachapreague says inshore flounder fishing is slow. Some local anglers are scoring on flatfish at Gargatha. A few croakers, sand mullet and bluefish are around, but not in good numbers on the seaside.

Offshore fishing has been hit or miss, with few warm currents coming into the canyons. Reef and wreck fishing is picking up for flounder and sea bass.

Greaser says bayside fishing is holding up well. Chumming for cobia is still working fairly well from Onancock south. Snapper bluefish are showing in better numbers, small rockfish remain in the creeks, and very few speckled trout are available. Deeper holes of Pungoteague and Occohannock have an abundance of small gray trout, sand mullet and snapper bluefish.





It's been nearly three years since a pick-up truck rammed into the side of the former A.G. James General Merchandise Store (more recently known as Seaside Antiques) in Wachapreague, knocking the wood-frame structure off its foundation.

The hit caused a vast array of glassware to crash and burn, frames and furniture to be destroyed and the will of two women to nearly be broken.

"Making the decision to either tear it

down or fix it, that was the hard part," Patricia Hart said Tuesday. She and her business partner, Carol Burnham, saw the dreams and the treasures they had collected for decades literally come crashing down.

And then to put salt in the wounds, the boxes and boxes of broken glass and china had to be studied and inventoried for insurance purposes. It was torturous.

The two eventually agreed to finish demolishing the front of the building. which was about <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> of the structure and to save the dark back room that was the oldest section.

Today, the showplace for antiques, local art (yippee!) and memorabilia will reopen its doors.

The night the truck made its entrance, local folks joined in when the "all clear" was given to quickly remove the front contents, broken parts and all. It was thought that part of the building might fall in. The floors had buckled and the shelves on both sides were scattered. Hart had only moments before been cleaning the windows on the front porch. Hours earlier, I had been painting out there.

So where did they begin?

"First we had to clean it out," said Hart of the back room, "It was just a warehouse. We had to have a storage unit brought into the yard for what

we already saved once. We still haven't opened the doors to it. We've forgotten what is inside."

That back room had never seen a bit of paint. The ceiling easily took

four coats. The pine walls, shelves and floors were scrubbed, sanded and refinished. A new door was put on the back and Burnham took a long trip to Pennsylvania to bring back the perfect front door for the shop.

Plumbing and a new bathroom had to be installed. Everything had to be to code. There was new wiring, air-conditioning and heating. Insulation was

blown into the walls and everything on the outside got a fresh coat of Williamsburg color.

There's also a handicapped ramp and a new front porch, since the old one was knocked sideways

"It's been very long and stressful, but we are excited," said Hart. "A lot of the walls are dedicated to local art.

> We've had a really, really good time furnishing it and seeking out new sources and new ideas."

> "Everything that we've got in there is new to the market," she continued.

"Most of the glassware and pottery and furniture was destroyed. Being collectors, we've been in our closets. our drawers, our attics and our garages to bring out our most precious collections."

Still, she thought, "None of this would have happened if the driver hadn't decided to go to Wachapreague that day,"
