County Pay Up 2.5% Since 2014, With 'Miner' Exception

Salaries for five of Accomack's top senior officials and constitutional officers break the \$100,000 a year mark, according to figures released last week by the county's finance and human resources departments.

At \$137,862 annually, County Administrator Steve Miner is the county's highest paid employee. That's \$14,329 more than he made the last time the Eastern Shore Post obtained the figures two years ago. His salary has increased by more than \$24,400 in the last four

years. Three other workers in his office have salaries averaging \$43,102 annually.

Most salaries increased by 2.5 percent over the two years from 2014 to 2016, but Miner's salary increased by 12.5 percent in the same period. Miner's salary is recommended by a subcommittee of supervisors, and then voted on by the full board. Raises for county employees are proposed by Miner in the annual budget, and voted on by the board except for constitutional officers and state-funded jobs.

The second highest salary belongs to Commonwealth's Attorney Gary Agar, at \$127,643. He is retiring early next month from his elected position. Two years ago, his salary was \$2,113 less. Salaries for the five other workers in his office average \$48,406.

In third place is County Attorney Cela Burge with \$117,500. In 2014, that job was held by Mark Taylor, who was the highest paid county employee. He brought in \$131,602 in 2014. Burge's assistant makes \$41,229 annually.

Clerk of Court Sammy Cooper is paid \$115,463, according to the figures. He was paid \$112,647 a

year in 2014. Cooper faces voters every eight years and has held the job for decades. His five employees earn an average of \$34,464 each.

Sheriff Todd Godwin, who oversees more employees than any of the others and puts his life on the line, is paid \$109,242 compared to \$106,578 in 2014. Pay for each of his 67 workers averages \$36,841 annually. The sheriff is elected every four years.

Finance Director Mike Mason is paid \$95,904 a year. His salary went up \$2,339 since 2014. In 2012, Mason earned \$85,900. Salaries for

four others in his department average salaries \$50,890.

Director of Planning & Community Development Rich Morrison is paid \$90,433. He made \$88,227

Murder Charges Certified in June Shooting

Alexander Picott-Cleveland told police he went out to a shed to retrieve his 12-gauge shotgun during an argument and tussle with his father at their home in the Cheapside area of Capeville last June.

Ronald Graves, Picott-Cleveland's first cousin, got in his path and was "accidentally" shot nine times, according to testimony Thursday in Northampton General District Court.

The 22-year-old Arlington Road defendant admitted to Lt. Michelle Hallett of the Northampton County Sheriff's Office, that he purposely shot another man at a graduation party in Exmore earlier on the evening of June 18.

That weapon was a .22 caliber handgun, evidence showed. Three others were injured in the gunfire. Hallett said Picott-Cleveland told her those people were also shot unintentionally.

Judge Gordon Vincent found probable cause to certify to a Grand Jury a charge of second-degree murder of Graves, 30, of Portsmouth and use of a firearm in that crime. The judge reduced three counts of aggravated malicious wounding to malicious wounding (still felonies) because no evidence was shown that the victims had long-lasting injuries. Those counts were sent to the jury along with firearms charges and misdemeanors, reckless handling and brandishing a firearm. (Continued on page 3)

Capital Concerns Consume Northampton Supervisors' Conversations

Northampton High School was at the top of capital considerations Wednesday during a county supervisors' meeting. Two days earlier they met with the school board to consider the future of the building.

Superintendent Eddie Lawrence fielded a question regarding Plan B in the event of a catastrophic building failure that rendered the high school unusable for an extended period. He noted that there was no such plan, but that the school board would begin looking into options should such a need arise. It was more likely that a wall or small portion of the building might cause an issue, rather than the entire building becoming unusable, he said. Should the former occur, they might need to adjust student placement to accommodate their schedules.

The board discussed the future of two former jail structures adjacent to the county administration building. Both structures have been vacant

for years and are currently boarded up. The board voted to have the 1915 structure removed while saving the small one-story 1899 structure that sits just behind the administration offices. County Administrator Katie Nunez was instructed by the board to take the necessary action.

Supervisor Larry LeMond stressed the need for an urgent care facility within the county to help meet the emergency needs following the relocation of Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital to Accomack County early next year. His report recommended that the county put paid staff in the rescue squad building in Nassawadox, with additional operations in Exmore, Machipongo and Bayview. It further recommends support and encouragement for volunteer EMS and paid EMS staff members.

In a prepared statement, Board Chairman Spencer Murray criticized Riverside's failure to provide emergency services within Northampton Coun-

ty once the hospital moves. He noted the hospital originally said it would leave an urgent care facility when it pulls out of Nassawadox, but now it now appears the plan is to provide no more than a physician's office in what is currently the Cancer Center located on Hospital Avenue. An urgent care facility would operate seven days a week and have more diagnostic and X-Ray capabilities - functions that might not otherwise be found in a physician's office.

In other business, the board voted not to provide \$480,000 for the Eastern Shore Library proposed for Parkesley. Chairman Murray noted that Accomack County asked for the funding to assist with construction costs. Noting the need for a new high school in Northampton, the Board felt it unwise to funnel such funding outside the county.

Commissioner of Revenue Charlene Gray reported on taxation within Agricultural Forestal Districts (AFDs), and the process that takes place when fixing the assessment on wooded or cleared farmland. She pointed out, it is normal for the assessment and tax on properties in an AFD or conservation easement to fluctuate when reassessments occur. Gray said she sent a notification to property owners with and in an AFD to advise them of the changes in the taxes that would be levied on their property for the most recent reassessment. She added that regardless of the tax changes, owners of property within an AFD would still see lower taxes than owners of agricultural land

that was not in a designated AFD.

A final topic of discussion was that of water usage and fees for residential properties at Bayview. Northampton County operates the water and wastewater system for the housing project and it was noted that some of the units use disproportional amounts of water each month. Currently, each residential unit is charged \$50 per month for water and sewage, regardless of the amount of water used. She added that an attempt to go into some of the units to check for water leaks or to seek a reason for the high water usage was not allowed by the manager. The Board discussed the issue, including the option of charging rates based on water usage, but did not reach a consensus. The Board agreed to look into the matter in an attempt to see why some units used much higher amounts of water than others.

The defendant was sent back to the Eastern Shore Regional Jail where he is being held without bond.

Ranquise Coston of Exmore testified he was shot four times in the back and spent 2 1/2 weeks in the hospital because of his injuries. "I was walking to my car by myself," he said. "Nobody was around me. I seen people out there ... I wasn't paying them no mind ... when I got shot the first time, I don't know if it knocked me down or not. I can't even think about it ... I was doing a lot of ducking, trying to get away."

Coston said he kept moving. "I got shot four times. For what? ... Over something I don't even know about. I got a six-year-old daughter man," he told Defense lawyer Tucker Watson. "I was praying that I hoped that I lived," Coston said. "That's all that I was doing ... Never seen him (the defendant) a day in my life. I don't even know who shot me."

Coston said he didn't own or carry a firearm when the incident occurred. "Now I got a gun," he added. "Registered to carry and everything."

The defendant told Hallett, "They (Coston and others) were going to do something to me. I wasn't going to let that happen. He walked by me ... I didn't give him a chance to come back ... I was trying to shoot him ... I unloaded my whole clip."

Another of the victims, Mona Jones of Trehernville, went to the Exmore party with Graves, who was her Godson, and the defendant. She was shot twice in the neck.

"Everybody was talking to different people and everything," Jones testified. "Next thing I know, somebody hollered out somebody had a gun ... Alex was standing over a guy ... with a gun ... music was playing. I don't think he meant to hit me. The gun went off. Ev-

erybody was running."

Jones said she didn't realize how badly she was injured. On the way to drop Piccott-Cleveland and his sister off at Cheapside, they stopped at the hospital but she didn't want to go inside.

Once at their destination, she went in to wipe off her wound and "heard some loud talking." When she went back to the vehicle, Graves got out to talk to the defendant.

"I was sitting in the truck wiping blood," she said. "Everything was behind me. I didn't see anything." When she got out, Graves was lying in the middle of the road. "I can't even explain how I felt and his eyes were rolling back in his head."

Jones also said on their journey to Cheapside, Piccott-Cleveland shot into the glove compartment of the vehicle.

A man in the courtroom greeted Piccott-Cleveland with "hello son" when he was brought in wearing an orange jail jumpsuit. The same man, who was sitting in the second row, grunted and sighed when Jones was testifying.

Andre Johnson of Jamesville said he was a passenger in a car that pulled up to the party area. When shots were fired, he was struck in the face.

"We hadn't even been there for 30 seconds," said Johnson. "We didn't have a chance to get out of the car. I heard the first couple of shots ... I ducked down. The bullet came through the windshield."

Sgt. Jason Campbell of Exmore said he recovered five shells from the Exmore scene. Later, the defendant's sister showed him where the handgun was inside the Cheapside house.

The incidents began at about 7:30 p.m. in Exmore. The defendant fled from his home and was apprehended almost 12 hours later, Campbell said.

Court Postings

Accomack Circuit Court

A Painter man was sentenced last week to five years in prison for gun violations, according to records.

Raphael Lamont Bailey, 23, of Linhaven Circle pleaded guilty to counts of possession of a firearm and ammunition by a felon. He got the mandatory five-year term for the firearm charge and a five-year suspended sentence for the ammunition charge to run consecutively.

Felony charges filed against two Melfa residents were reduced to misdemeanors. Angela Cuce, also known as Angela Rene Sturgis, 38, of Powhatan Drive and Isaiah Padgett, 19, of Nickawampus Way were found guilty of trespassing, petty larceny and misdemeanor or destruction of property. They were initially charged with burglary, grand larceny and felony property destruction. Presentence reports were ordered.

Corey Adam Beckett, 37, of Belle Haven pleaded guilty in an Alford plea (a legal term for retaining his innocence

while admitting the evidence against him was overwhelming) on counts of distributing cocaine on Oct. 3, and Nov. 1, 2013. A presentence report was ordered. Beckett was remanded to jail.

Joshua James Cooper, 30, of Carson's Court in Pocomoke, Md., pleaded guilty to forgery that happened Nov. 25, 2015 and unauthorized use of a vehicle on Nov. 27 and Jan. 4, 2015. The car belonged to Kaneisha Spady. An updated presentence report was ordered. Cooper was remanded back to jail to await its completion.

Derion Lamont Reid, 22, of Robinson Circle in Wachapreague pleaded guilty to possessing a firearm by a felon on Jan. 30. A short-form presentence report was ordered.

Melinda Sue Abel, 40, of Desota Road in Baltimore, Md., pleaded guilty to burglarizing the home of Ellen Debremond-Coretes between Jan. 9 and 13. A short-form presentence report will be prepared.

Michael Jerome Aye, age not available, of Main Street in Landsdale, Pa., was convicted of possession with intent to distribute an imitation controlled

substance, a felony, and possession with intent to distribute marijuana, a misdemeanor. One count of possession of a firearm by a felon was not prosecuted. The crimes occurred April 7, 2008. He was remanded to jail.

Accomack District Court

A 70-year-old Modest Town man was charged with felony cruelty to animals, according to records filed in Accomack General District Court.

Samuel Hawarth of Hopeland Way is accused of committing the crime on June 16. He was arrested July 11 and is free on \$2,000 bond. The complaining witness is Leslie Watson. Deputy Julian Sharp of Accomack County Sheriff's Office investigated.

Brittany Lynn Taylor, 20, of Winterville Road in Bloxom was accused of breaking into the home of Allysine Mason, 19, of Staunton Road in Parksley on July 19.

Mason told police the defendant and five others broke in "looking for a fight. The three males were wearing masks and carrying sticks." She said her tire was slashed and her vehicle keys were taken from the kitchen table.

Taylor was arrested the same day. She was released on \$1,500 secured bond. Officer C. Hargis of Parksley Police Department investigated.

Justin Lee Wheeler, 29, of Addison Street in Lackwood, Wash. was charged with intentionally destroying or damaging property Monday. Defendant admitted he kicked a rental car and put a dent in it. Secured bond was set at \$1,500. Sgt. T. B. Hickman of Chincoteague Police Department investigated.

Accomack Grand Jury

A quiet indictment was brought by an Accomack Grand Jury earlier this month was made public Monday.

Joellyn Rae Rice, 30, of Oakland Drive in Parksley was indicted on a count of delivery of a controlled substance to a prisoner at Accomack Jail on March 11.

She was arrested Aug. 5 and is free on a \$1,000 secured bond.

Northampton Circuit Court

A 17-year old Jamesville resident was convicted as an adult Monday for felony drug offenses.

Jarvonte Pitt-Scarborough was found guilty of four counts of possession with the intent to distribute cocaine on Sept. 30, and Oct. 7 and 26, and possession of the drug and a gun on Nov. 3. Sentencing was continued pending evaluation for detention and diversion programs. Scarborough turns 18 on Aug. 18.

In another case, Ryan Del Clark, 23, of Eastville pleaded guilty to counts of possession of Aderall and Subutex. The Sept. 16 and Oct. 5 cases were taken under advisement. A presentence report was ordered.

Carlos Cardoza, 42, of Nassawadox pleaded guilty to two counts of possession with intent to distribute Oxycodone. Both cases were taken under advisement.

Carlos Orlando Walton, 31, of Cape Charles was convicted of driving on a suspended license in a second or subsequent DUI-related incident on April 9. The case was continued pending completion of a presentence report.

two years ago and \$81,000 in 2012. Records show he has five employees who earn, on average, \$42,213.

Information Technology (IT) Director Ben Fox is paid \$88,241. His salary was averaged with other workers in finance two years ago. His two workers make an average of \$59,069.

Director of Public Works Stewart Hall's salary is \$87,656. Two years ago, he made \$81,353 annually and three years ago he was paid \$78,983. Pay for his 45 workers averages \$32,561.

Public Safety Director C. Ray Pruitt is paid \$83,253 a year. Two years ago when Jeff Terwilliger had that job, he was getting \$81,223. Pruitt's 38 workers make, on average, \$41,582 a year.

The county's Assessor Brent Hurdle gets \$82,902 annually compared to the \$80,880 he made in 2014. He has five workers who earn an average of \$41,331.

Treasurer Dana Bundick \$80,824 compared to \$78,853 in 2014. Her job

is an elected four-year-term post. The figures for her employees were not available at press time.

Commissioner of the Revenue Leslie Savage has an annual salary of \$80,423 up from \$78,461 two years ago. She has four workers who are paid an average of \$30,545. Savage's job is up for election every four years.

Wallops Research Park Manager Julie Wheatley is paid \$76,392. The new Human Resources Director Kathy Carmody is being paid \$75,000. Those jobs was not in the list in 2014.

Parks and Recreation Manager Wayne Burton is paid \$69,430, up from \$67,737 in 2014. His three workers make an average of \$31,560 a year.

Registrar Patricia White gets \$53,196 compared to \$51,898 in 2014. Her assistant makes \$34,399.

Airport Manager Barbara Haxter is paid \$44,735 up from two years ago when it was \$43,644. She has one other worker with a salary of \$25,400.

No Money for Deteriorating Northampton High School

A bleak picture of the future of Northampton High School was drawn for Northampton County officials Monday as its 60 years are rapidly catching up with the facility.

County supervisors and members of the school board viewed photo after photo of deteriorating walls, cracked floors and a failing roof.

School Operations Director Chris Truckner listed damaged areas that need to be addressed with a tally of more than \$23 million.

Daniel Speight, president of a Virginia Beach structural engineering firm, pointed out that portions of the building added in 1978 were in worse condition than some portions of the original structure. He said nearly all of the building has major issues that need to be addressed. The roof deteriorated even more since he inspected it two years ago.

Supervisor Chairman Spencer Murray said he could not understand how

much the newer sections were damaged. Speight reminded officials that building codes had changed dramatically over the years and that many of the things that have contributed to the school's present condition would not be permitted under modern building codes.

The school board urged the supervisors to offer a timeline for when the building could be replaced. A building that would serve middle and high school students was estimated to cost at least \$30 million and climbing with each passing year.

Murray agreed a new school is needed. However, he noted the county's debt service precludes the possibility of replacing it in the near future. The earliest mentioned time to borrow was at least five or six years away.

Members of both panels agreed they did not want to use large amounts of tax dollars to refurbish. Murray asked the school board to find repairs that could buy time for the county's finances to improve.

NASA Extends Comment Period Proposed Expansion to Restricted on Airspace

NASA Wallops Flight Facility is proposing to expand its controlled airspace, a move that has the attention of local pilots, agricultural groups and even mosquitoes.

“Over the past few weeks, it’s become clear there is great interest in this initiative among many members of our community, particularly among local aviators and the farming community,” said Jeremy Eggers, NASA Wallops communications chief. “NASA has a long history supporting the needs of the general aviation community, and this expansion has been specifically designed to have minimal impact to surrounding civil air traffic while allowing NASA to meet flight test objectives.”

“Use ... would be infrequent and for short periods of time only as needed for safety during flight operations,” he continued. “When not in use, the airspace will be returned to local controlling agencies and opened to all air traffic. Wallops would work with local pilots on procedures to ensure local op-

erations, such as crop dusting and mosquito spraying, could continue during times when the airspace is activated.”

Supervisor Grayson Chesser, known for being a NASA watchdog, is skeptical about the plan. “We all support NASA and want their missions to be successful,” he said Tuesday. “The county has been very active in trying to do things that would protect NASA from encroachment, but encroachment goes two ways. NASA is not our largest industry, agriculture is.”

“You’re talking about something that will affect a huge portion of Accomack County, tens of thousands of acres of cropland,” Chesser continued. “In probably 20 years, most of the largest farmers ... will probably have their own drones for application of pesticides and herbicides. Aerial application is a very important tool for our farmers. We already have large areas that are closed during rocket launches. Unfortunately, when you have a crop that is threatened by insects or disease, time is critical.”

“NASA is talking about 40 days a

year for a couple of hours a day,” Chesser said. “But, if they control the airspace who knows what that will be in the future. This is an important issue and everyone should be interested and involved. The Zika virus is very likely going to eventually hit the Shore. Chincoteague and Captain’s Cove (and likely other places) spray mosquitoes by air.”

Farmers are concerned, he said. “They (NASA) say that they are going to make arrangements and everything. They probably will. They’ll try. But the thing is what if they increase the activity? What if they go from 40 days to 80? We’re talking about operations expanding at NASA, and the 40 days for 2 hours could suddenly be a great deal more.”

“The expanded area goes from the Maryland line down to Bennett Street in Parksley, then north of Accomack and Joynes Neck over to Cedar Island,” he said.

Chesser told of a farmer who had potatoes planted and wanted to spray (for blight) after the Antares hot fire test was done recently.

“Whenever a rocket is there, the airspace is closed. The pilot ... called and was told the airspace was closed.” Then, a series of phone calls were made. “It took enough time that weather moved in and he had to wait a couple of days,” the supervisor continued. “As far as I know it didn’t hurt the crop.” Still, Chesser said, the potential was there.

Accomack supervisors postponed discussions last month because of a lack of information. Speakers from NASA and a pilot have been asked to attend the session Aug. 17. The comment period for the draft environmental assessment of the plan was extend-

ed by a month to Sept. 1.

According to NASA’s website, the agency requested additional restricted airspace from the Federal Aviation Administration, but no changes are proposed in the draft environmental document to the types of aircraft or types and number of operations conducted within the airspace above or adjacent to Wallops Flight Facility (WFF).

In the draft, the justification NASA provides for the expansion of the airspace is “the improvement of the usefulness, performance, speed, safety, and efficiency of aeronautical and space vehicles.” It goes on to say that the facility conducts “a variety of elevated risk test activities (that) center around the airfield’s unprotected portions of airspace... Inter-governmental agreements, such as those with Naval Air Station Patuxent River and Naval Air Systems Command, leverage NASA’s capability at WFF for operational and developmental test and evaluations of military systems in support of our nation’s defense and security.”

The restricted airspace, says NASA, is to separate air traffic to protect civil air traffic from higher-risk operations, and to protect existing operations of NASA and partner agencies from “non-participating aircraft.”

“Test aircraft are often heavily modified to test new systems,” the document continues. “These modifications can restrict the pilot’s ability to maneuver the aircraft. An unplanned, abrupt maneuver (possibly caused by intruding non-participating air traffic) violates the build-up safety principal of flight test. Such an event could exceed a design limit load, place the aircraft in untested/unproven energy state and endanger both the test aircrew/aircraft as well as non-participating air traffic. The limited maneuverability of aircraft used to implement tests during flight ... test presents an unusual hazard to non-participating aircraft, and inherently increases the risk of a midair collision when tests are conducted in co-use airspace.”

The proposed expansion, says NASA, is a measure intended to reduce these hazards.

Police continued this week to search for an Accomack man who is wanted for murder, according to Sheriff Todd Godwin.

Tyqon Demetrius Robins, 24, of Nelsonia is being sought for first-degree murder, use of a firearm and discharging a firearm from a vehicle in the shooting death of Fardale (also known as Fairdale) Antonio Johnson, 39, of Mappsville. The incident occurred on Lankford Highway in Mappsville on June 24.

Robins, a six-foot-tall black male, weighs about 140 pounds.

Deputies are also "actively looking for" Devon Thomas Blake, 34, of Beacon Road in Melfa. He is wanted for not serving jail time. Blake was sentenced last October to 93 days in jail with 90 days suspended for eluding police. The term was deferred until the following

weekend. But, Blake never showed up at the Accomack County Jail.

A *capias* was ordered and the case in Accomack General District Court has been continued four times.

Blake was sentenced in Northampton in 2014 to 60 days in jail for his part in the beating and shooting death of Jesse Leon Jordan, 23, of Cape Charles. He was initially thought to be the top offender in that case but eventually, the charges were reduced to assault and battery and assault and battery by a mob. Blake and others kicked Jordan when he was down on the ground; either before or after he was shot outside of A&E Auto & Truck Repairs in Trehernville.

Blake's sentence was short because he was the first of the four suspects to help investigators. "He gave us a good sense of what happened," Commonwealth's Attorney Bruce Jones said. "Mr. Blake got us on the right track."

While awaiting sentencing, Blake was prohibited from possessing a firearm. During that time, he was picked up in Accomack and charged with carrying a concealed weapon. Blake was found guilty, fined \$150 and given a 30-day suspended sentence. A count of possession of marijuana was not prosecuted. Records state Blake had "the weapon for self defense."

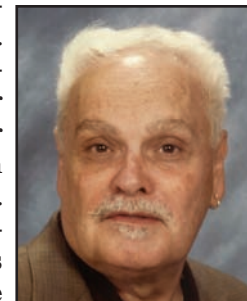

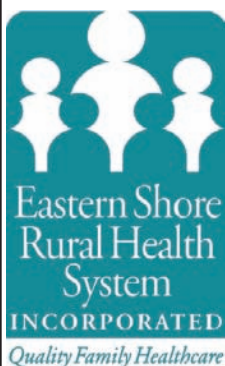

There's too much hate in the world. I dislike the word, hate.

Next: Consider saying, "Hello," "Good morning," or "Hi there," when crossing paths with a stranger; perfect or imperfect. Enjoy the surprised look, gleeful reply or slack-jawed silence you'll get in response to this rare overture. No one is hurt and someone you meet may pay the common courtesy forward.

Finally: The next time you're about to complain aloud about a situation, STOP. Consider at least two ways that your current situation could have been worse. (Not on fire, no broken bones, and no crumpled metal are easy starts). Now, smile and exhale a silent, "Thank you." Find additional ways to make your life more purposefully positive.

Just in case you missed it, National S'more Day was Aug. 10. As a notorious s'mores lover I was, of course, preparing for the celebration when I got to wondering about

the origins of this tasty treat. So I got to Googling and, of course, just like s'mores, one Google leads to another. Thus I once again expanded my extensive collection of useless – but interesting – knowledge.

Let's begin with the base of the s'more – the graham cracker. This one-time tasteless wafer originated in the 1800s when Reverend Sylvester Graham became convinced that alcohol, meat and fatty foods were the cause of greed and lust. The reverend believed that a proper diet of bland foods would have

the opposite effect, particularly in the curbing of sexual appetite. Rev. Graham decided to help the poor sinners by cooking up his own concoctions, one of which was a blend of wheat germ, bran, and unbleached flour. Thus was born the Graham cracker. Luckily, the National Biscuit Company (now Nabisco) wasn't so worried about the consumers' morals, and when, at the Reverend's death in 1851, they purchased the right to the graham cracker, they added honey to the recipe.

Another basic ingredient of the s'more is, of course, marshmallows. If you think graham crackers have a long history check this out. Marshmallows originated with the *Althaea officinalis*, or marshmallow plant, found in Europe, Western Asia and Northern Africa. Its first known use was by ancient Egyptians as a remedy for sore throats. These days, marshmallows are manufactured using sugar, water

and gelatin whipped together then molded into the familiar cylindrical pieces and coated with corn starch. The first recorded use of marshmallows in s'mores was in a 1920s book of recipes published by Campfire Marshmallows.

And that leaves us with the history of chocolate. Oh I know a lot about chocolate. You see, when I was a little girl, my Daddy owned the Accomack Candy Company, a wholesale firm which supplied sweets to all the general stores which (way back then) dotted the entire Shore. It was quite a lucrative enterprise – or it would have been if Daddy had the heart to collect

what was owed him. Being a sucker for a sob story – and a genuinely good person – there were many shopkeepers he perpetually “carried on the books” since, as he'd say, “they're having a rougher time than I am.”

But back to chocolate. Seems one year Daddy set some kind of record for the sale of Hershey products. His reward was a family trip to headquarters in Pennsylvania to tour the plant and meet the “big bosses.” I still re-

member, as we were about to enter the imposing office of the head of Hershey, Daddy warning us to be on our best behavior and to watch our manners. Unfortunately, Daddy considered it bad manners when I announced to said big boss that my favorite candy was M&Ms – a product of Hershey's competitor, Mars. Years later Daddy would laugh about the incident, but that day there were no kisses for me – Hershey's or otherwise.

Anyway, as to the origin of chocolate, well that's simple. It had to have been a gift from heaven - because God loves us and wants us to be happy.
