

## Three Norfolk Men Arraigned for Shooting at Deputy

Three Norfolk men, one with ties to the Eastern Shore of Virginia and two others who are related to each other, were charged late Monday with attempted first-degree murder of an Accomack deputy. They could face life in prison.

The incident occurred after Cpl. Eric Nottingham tried to pull over a car matching the description of a vehicle in which Maryland bank robbers had fled. Sheriff Todd Godwin said suspects "shot right through the engine, through the transmission line, and all the fluid came out. ... Thank God they didn't hit him. I can't remember anybody shooting at one of our deputies in my 30 years" in law enforcement. Nottingham was not injured.

Deandre Breshon Ayers, also known as De'Andre Breshon Ayres and Deondre Brashaun Ayers, 28, of Hanson Avenue, previously from Painter, is accused of trying to kill Nottingham "for the purpose of interfering with the performance of the officer's official duties" on Sept. 26, according to warrants filed in Accomack General District Court.

Also charged were Lamond Perry, 23, and Demetrius Perry, 21, both of Mar-

shall Avenue. Lamond Perry was also listed as homeless in court files. The three were arrested in Norfolk and later transferred to Accomack Jail where they are being held without bond. They were all wearing white jailhouse jump-suits and chained at the wrists and ankles when brought into the district court before Judge Gordon Vincent Wednesday.

They are also accused of use a firearm in the attempted murder of Nottingham,

discharging a firearm "in or on" a vehicle and creating a "risk of injury or death to another person or causing another person to have a reasonable apprehension of injury or death," and maliciously shooting at an "occupied conspicuously marked law-enforcement vehicle." In addition, Ayers and Demetrius Perry were charged with possession or transportation of a firearm by a felon convicted within the last decade.

In 2007, Ayers was sentenced to 20

years in prison in Accomack Circuit Court with 15 suspended for grand larceny of both a Ford Bronco and a Buick Skylark. He was given 15 years of probation and ordered to pay nearly \$400 in restitution for each charge.

Ayres pleaded guilty in Northampton Circuit Court to unlawful wounding and was sentenced in 2008 to five years in prison with a year and four months suspended. Judge Glen Tyler wrote in

# Wrong Man Nabbed for Attempted Murder Former Painter Resident Details Ordeal

Eastern Shore native Mahesh Alvin Sharp was surrounded by more than a dozen police officers Monday outside his Norfolk home as he was leaving for work.

He was "snatched out of the car, tossed to the ground, cuffed at the wrists and ankles," wrongly accused of attempting to murder an Accomack deputy (see sto-

ry above). After spending the night at Norfolk City Jail and being transferred to Accomack, Sharp was released with the acknowledgment that it was a case of mistaken identity.

The former Painter native and 2006 graduate of Nandua High School said after he was taken away, officers searched his house thereby upsetting his wife, who is expecting a baby in December (after seven miscarriages), and his mother-in-law, who has a heart condition and was later rushed to the hospital. He further noted that he was not immediately read his rights or told what the matter was about.

The criminal complaints involved shooting at Cpl. Eric Nottingham, who on Sept. 26 was trying to stop a vehicle

suspected of carrying bank robbers from a Maryland heist earlier in the day when shots were fired at him.

Sharp said he grew up with one of the other suspects and once met the other two but says he had nothing to do with criminal activities.

"I know there are no shortcuts out there," said 28-year-old Sharp of Birmingham Avenue in Norfolk. "No one is ever going to give you anything in life so I go to work everyday. Even though I was raised by a single mother, she raised me with respect and taught me the dos and don'ts."

On weekends, Sharp often picks vegetables from the fields for his mother to sell at her produce stand on the corner of Lankford Highway and Occohannock Neck Road in Exmore. "I'm just a kid from the Eastern Shore," he said. "Moved across the Bay (four or five years ago) to Norfolk to try to better myself."

"They gave me a personal recognizance bond," Sharp continued. The investigator, Patrick Coulter told him, "Everything you told me was legit," Sharp said

of his protests that he was at work when the incidents occurred.

Papers filed in Accomack General District Court Tuesday showed charges against Sharp of attempted first-degree murder of Nottingham to interfere with his official duties, use a firearm in the attempted murder, discharging a firearm "in or on" a vehicle and creating a "risk of injury or death" and maliciously shooting at an "occupied-conspicuously-marked law-enforcement vehicle."

Wednesday on the same papers, it was noted by Commonwealth's Attorney Matthew Brenner that the cases would not be prosecuted at the request of law enforcement. Brenner said that while the charges stated attempted "capital" murder, that specific accusation wouldn't have been possible without a death.

A warrant for extradition in Maryland was also filed. It started that Sharp was a fugitive from that state wanted for robbery, threat of mass violence and theft.

"Testimony accepted that defendant charged in both Maryland and Virginia with crimes due to mistaken identity," the documents stated. "Deputies verified alibis and it was relayed to magistrate that Maryland would follow Virginia's lead" Wednesday.

When arrested, Sharp told a magistrate that he was innocent of the charges and that he was at work when the incident occurred, court papers stated. His criminal record amounted to drunk in public about 10 years ago.

His alibis include his boss, his immediate supervisor and four others at his job.

On Facebook, Sharp is also the rapper "\$avage Hesh." He poses on the social media with a gun and lists a song among several titled, "Life Sentence."

"I'm not a professional rapper," Sharp said Wednesday in a telephone interview. "I want to be. I put them (his lyrics) on social media. That has nothing to do with this, that's just a hobby."

His mother-in-law, Bobby Powell of Norfolk, took to Facebook in despair while Sharp was being held "for help in any form. ... A bank teller picked Mehesh out of a photo line up. ... (Officers) destroyed our home during a search for whatever was on the search warrant," she continued.

Three attempts by the Post to contact Accomack County Sheriff Todd Godwin to verify elements of Sharp's and Powell's accounts were unanswered by press time.

Powell went on to say 10-12 people saw him at work in Virginia Beach that day, and later posted to Facebook "at 3:04 p.m. with his location in Chesapeake, Va."

"As I write," she continued, "Mehesh Sharp sits in Norfolk City Jail awaiting extradition to Accomac ... with bond denied. This is an absolute nightmare that only happens to others, (or) so I thought. My eyes have been opened to the way a young black man is treated in this country and it's a shame. I can only pray that Mehesh can forgive the law enforcement community for this false arrest. People, you are not innocent until proven guilty, you are guilty until proven innocent. We have to hire a lawyer to prove his innocence, I am completely ashamed of what this country has become."

"My wife said, 'They went through all your closet, dirty clothes, through desk, computer room, through parents' room," said Sharp. "They just trashed the place... caused my wife all kinds of distress. ... I'm a good guy. I go to work

the file, "assault occurred in the jail - very dangerous person." Restitution in that case was \$30,667. In 2007, charges of robbery, use of a firearm in a robbery, possession of a firearm by a felon and entering at night to rob were dismissed against Ayers in Accomack District Court.

The defendants were assisted Wednesday by deputy clerks and qualified for court-appointed lawyers. Preliminary hearings were set for November. Ayers will be represented by Paul Watson of Eastville. Attorney Sharri Mapp of Vir-

ginia Beach will defend Lamond Perry and Tucker Watson (brother of Paul Watson) of Eastville was appointed for Demetrius Perry. The lawyers were not in attendance. All three men wanted to know when they could get bond but were told to speak to their attorneys.

There was no pomp and circumstance for the suspects who were brought in separately. Three deputies were in the courtroom compared to two or three times as many for other violent offenses.

On the day of the crime, Nottingham

was alerted to look out for a silver newer-model Chevrolet Malibu carrying suspects from a PNC Bank robbery in Pocomoke, that was headed towards Virginia at about 2 p.m. He spotted the car near Mappsville and attempted to stop it when the shots were fired. The suspect vehicle got away traveling east on Turkey Run Road.

Charges in Maryland were not filed at press time Thursday. When officers there arrived at the bank, they were told of a robbery by three black men "who threatened to blow it up with an explosive device." No weapon or explosive was displayed to bank tellers. One man was reported to have been wearing women's clothing. PNC Bank is offering a \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and prosecution of the suspects.

The Norfolk Police Department and the U.S. Marshal Service assisted with the arrests. Godwin said, the investigation is continuing and additional arrests are expected. every day. I spend time at the house. I don't go anywhere." Sharp said he never learned to drive and doesn't go anywhere without someone else driving him.

He grew up with Deandre Breshon Ayers, also 28, (see story, also page 1), who is charged with the crimes. "He's always been in trouble," Sharp said. "I may talk to him. I may shake his hand. I don't hang with him ... Thursday at work, I got a call from him. He wanted to talk. I didn't leave or go anywhere with him I never do ... He was just talking about stuff. He said something about it (the incidents) I didn't take it into mind. I wasn't trying to hear it. Things that somebody

else does that's none of my of business. I got to work everyday."

"Just this whole situation has me a little upset," he continued. "They caused me to miss work. Some of the neighbors saw this ... now everybody looks at me different ... I've never been in jail so I didn't know what to think. I was nervous, scared, upset, a real emotional deal. I should have been at work. I'm struggling. Live paycheck to paycheck sometimes, trying to make ends meet, to do right, and they've got me in a cell where I don't belong. I'm innocent ma'am. I just want this mixup taken care of."



## Cheriton 2017 Budget Includes More Funding for Traffic Enforcement

The Cheriton Town Council voted to approve a \$323,000 fiscal 2017 spending package last week.

Mayor Joe Habel reported the budget was modified to reflect changes required due to additional costs for law enforcement. Cheriton employs off-duty Northampton deputies for traffic control and enforcement of town ordinance. Changes in the sheriff's department policy means the town and other groups must reimburse the department for the expenses related to deputy and vehicle use. Hable

said funds derived from traffic violations, while being less than in the past, were sufficient to meet the town's needs.

Deputy Terry Thomas attended to answer questions about the new policy. Councilwoman Mary Mears raised concerns over the safety of children during the Halloween celebration. She noted that in previous years, the volume of children on the streets and traffic posed safety issues. Thomas said if the town desired to close the street to vehicles during activities, a request would need to be sent to VDOT. Habel said he would contact that agency.

Council agreed to advertise policies for Halloween evening, including parking restrictions near key intersections and that Trick-or-Treating would be from 5 to 8 p.m.

Possible fees for town park and playground use was tabled until later this month. Habel also noted that help was needed to install additional fencing around those facilities.

The ongoing issue of water backing up onto roads in areas of town was discussed. It was agreed to ask the fire department to help flush out obstructions in some underground culverts.

The need to remove the old sign welcoming visitors to businesses in the area was also discussed. The mayor said he would contact VDOT about leaving support poles in place to serve as a footprint for future replacement.

## Exmore Approves Inoperable Vehicle Ordinance

An ordinance that prohibits inoperable vehicles from openly being displayed in Exmore was unanimously approved Monday night by the town council.

The vehicles include those that do not have a valid inspection sticker or tags. The ordinance does not apply to vehicles that are stored within an enclosed structure or are being actively serviced by a repair facility.

Town Manager Robert Duer said the ordinance was needed to help rid Exmore of the growing number of abandoned or derelict vehicles. In some cases, he added, owners leave behind vehicles when they move. The direc-

tive gives the municipality the option of impounding the vehicle and disposing of it should the owner not claim it within 30 days of being notified. Property owners where the vehicles are located would be responsible for costs associated with removal and could be subject to liens.

Duer also reported the new town park building is 99 percent complete. Finishing touches include running electric and landscaping. He noted individuals and groups have indicated an interest in renting the facility. Duer said he hoped it would be finished in early 2017.


Duer and Utilities Director Taylor Dukes reported they would be meeting with representatives of the Virginia and the U. S. department of agriculture regarding applications for grants to help fund the town's proposed wastewater system. Dukes said the town would be reviewing bids on the new well project by the end of the year.

Replacement of all water meters for residents and businesses is near completion, said Public Works Director Mike Johnson. He noted only 25 of 500 meters are left to be installed.

Holiday Inn Express met its obligations by paying overdue fees and taxes of about \$14,000, Duer told council.

The next session will be held at 7 p.m. Nov. 7.

## Northampton Planning Commission Recommends Horse Barn, Sign Changes

Northampton's Planning Commission voted Tuesday to recommend that county supervisors approve special use permits for a horse barn and stable in a residential zone with restrictions.

Christopher Blevins and Terrill and Rose Ramsey requested the permits to build facilities for up to three horses on their property near Kiptopeke. Their request was for both a 5-acre and a half-acre parcel with plans to construct the barn on the smaller parcel while using the larger one as a pasture.

Bill Parr, a county resident, questioned the appropriateness of allowing horses in a residential area. He said if the barn was constructed on the smaller parcel, it would conflict with the county's zoning ordinance, which calls for a primary structure to be placed on a parcel prior to the addition of an accessory structure. Terrill Ramsey said he wanted to keep the parcels separate and to have the barn built on the smaller space, which is closer to his residence

The commissioners recommended the owners vacate the property line between the two parcels. They also require vegetative screening between the property and neighboring lots.

In the Oyster area, the supervisors propose to designate several parcels as Working Waterfront. Bill Parr, a local real estate agent, said if some parcels on the east side of Oyster Harbor were rezoned, it would cause conflicts with previously approved uses. He said an aquaculture facility operates there and has a freestanding structure on the site. Plans call for the structure to serve as a residence for an employee while protecting and servicing the operation. If rezoned, the structure could only serve as a temporary residence. He said such a change could result in the loss of jobs and businesses in the area and have a negative impact on income for the county. The commissioners voted to approve the supervisors' request and recommended that additional uses for the new designation be found.

The issue of signs advertising new businesses drew disagreement among the commissioners. The proposed ordinance would only allow such a sign once a land disturbance permit had been received by the owner. Two businesses that have run afoul of the sign ordinance are the proposed Royal Farms convenience center near Kiptopeke and the Rural Health Center in Eastville. Commissioner Dixon Leatherbury was opposed to the proposal noting the county has a sign ordinance that isn't enforced. It passed in a 2-1 vote.

The commission made no decision about prohibiting people from renting rooms or homes for extended periods. The supervisors indicated a desire to make the rentals short term, but the commission agreed to postpone any decision on it without additional study of the matter. The commission agreed to continue work on the Comprehensive Plan from 10 a.m to 2 p.m. Oct. 26 and Nov. 15.

## Schools' Rebate To Lower Premiums

United Healthcare issued a rebate check for nearly \$16,600 for 2015 to Accomack County Public Schools (ACPS) recently for percentages of premium revenues that did not meet minimum standards according to the Affordable Care Act.

Director of Finance & Budget Beth Onley said as the group policyholder the school board had two choices. It could reduce premiums for the upcoming year or provide a cash rebate to employees or subscribers that were covered by the health insurance on which the rebate is based.

The board unanimously voted Tuesday to reduce premiums for the upcoming year.

"As such, all currently enrolled employees will see a one time reduction in their withholding for health insurance in their Oct. 31 paycheck," said Onley. "There are currently 482 enrollees so the reduction will be \$34.44 each."

"This standard is designed to ensure that health insurance companies spend at least 85 percent of the premiums received on health care services and activities to improve health care quality," said Onley.



#### **Accomack Grand Jury**

Two underage teenagers were treated as adults Monday by an Accomack Grand Jury when they were indicted for violent felonies including one for first-degree murder and another for carjacking and related offenses.

Zachary Isaiah Townsend, 17, of Greta Road in Atlantic, was indicted on counts of first-degree murder, robbery and use of a firearm in the murder in connection with the Aug. 12 death of Nathaniel (Nate) Adam Ayres, 19, of Deer Drive in Nelsonia.

The victim's first name was spelled "Nathaniel" in the murder indictment against Townsend and in indictments made against Ayres in February 2016 regarding drug offenses alleged to have occurred last November. In an obituary, and in an initial press release about the death, it was spelled "Nathanial."

Ayres was gunned down at the intersection of Nock's Landing and Greta roads near Atlantic. He died of gunshot wounds to the head, neck and torso. A search warrant disclosed that at least two people saw Ayres get killed.

The warrant for a cell phone belonging to one of the witnesses and was filed in an effort to confirm incoming, outgoing and missed calls; text and picture messages and GPS information made on Aug. 11 and 12. Three witnesses were subpoenaed to testify before the grand jury in the murder case.

An officer said the killing is not believed to be gang related. Townsend is being held without bond in Western Tidewater Regional Jail.

A trial for Ayres had been scheduled for Aug. 23. He was indicted on counts of possession with the intent to distribute Oxycodone, possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance, distribution of a controlled substance to a minor, and two counts of possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance while on public school property. He was free on \$10,000 bail.

Investigator Simone Castiglia handled the murder and related charges. What property Ayres was robbed of was not clear from court records.

Dabreon Lamont Tankard, 15, of Woodland Avenue and Dontrail Atqwan Johnson,19, of Main Street, both in Melfa, were indicted on counts of carjacking Accomack Supervisor Cassandra (Reneta) Major's vehicle by putting her in fear of serious bodily harm, stealing property belonging to Major, stealing Major's car, use of a firearm in the carjacking, maliciously shooting at an occupied vehicle thereby putting life in peril, stealing a Broadwater Academy bus and causing intentional damage to the bus.

The incidents occurred in August. Johnson is free on a secured bond of \$10,000. Investigator Patrick Coulter of ACSO handled the cases.

Samuel Howarth, 70, of Hopeland Way in Modest Town, was indicted on a count of animal cruelty on June 12, 2016. Every year, riders and their horses travel from all over the United States to compete in the Sport Horse National Arabian and Half-Arabian Championship Horse Show. The Ford Idaho Horse Park in Nampa, Idaho, was this year's destination for many two and four-legged athletes; among those in attendance were riders from Bayview Farm, who made the more than 2,500 mile cross-country trek from Cape Charles to ride their way to national recognition.

The Bayview team took seven horses, some of which held national and reserve titles from years past. The event lasted from Sept. 21 to 25 and brought together hundreds of the best equines in the country.

Owners and riders Alexis Starer Doughty, Kimberly Graves and Hannah Darby competed in Hunter and Sport Horse classes under saddle, inhand and over fences. The National Competition also includes classes for Dressage and Carriage Driving.

He holds two previous national championships, three reserve national championships and 21 additional national titles in Working Hunter and Sport Horse. (USEF) performance horse award and is currently ranked third in the USEF standings.

The team also brought two Anglo-Arabians, "One More Round," a 12-year-old gelding and "Church Creek," a 10-year-old mare, both owned and shown by Doughty. ## Sportfishing Report

#### By Dr. Julie Ball, IGFA Representative

The fall weather is settling in and the cool water saltwater species are becoming more active.

Surf anglers are off to a great start with big red drum providing good action along the breakers on the Eastern Shore barrier islands. A few reds are also showing for surf anglers fishing from the Little Island pier and along the surflines in Sandbridge, but the best of the drum surf run is yet to come. Nice red drum are also hitting around the islands of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel on both live and cut-bait lately. Cobia are still around, but not for much longer, as these fish continue to pour out of the area as they head south.

The fall backwater fishing action is heating up nicely. Puppy drum are doing well in local shallows and inlets with the best action happening on fresh cut bait or live mullet. Good numbers of speckled trout are hitting lures and live bait in the Eastern Shore shallows, Lynnhaven, Rudee, and Little Creek Inlets and the Poquoson flats area. This tendency will continue to intensify through the cooler months.

Within Bay waters, big sheepshead are still lingering along the structure of the bridge-tunnel and tautog action is rekindling for the fall season. Keeper tog averaging to around four pounds are hitting well on fiddler crabs. Offshore and inshore wrecks are still productive for flounder, along with some jumbo seabass and triggerfish, but remember seabass are off limits right now. Bottom bouncers can also find willing tautog on some of these same structures.

The Bay striped bass season opens this week. As of Oct. 4 you can keep two fish per person measuring between 20 and 28 inches, with one of the two fish allowed to measure above 28 inches in Bay waters. Most rockfish will be schoolies caught while targeting other species in backwater and inlet areas at first.

October can be a good month for smoker-sized king mackerel, but clear water is a must. Spanish mackerel and false albacore are also available in these same areas. Some big amberjack are still circling the South Tower, while jack crevelle are also a possibility at the Chesapeake Light Tower.

Fall offshore action is good, with billfish providing chances for releases of both white and blue marlin, along with a smattering of roundscale spearfish. Catches of decent yellowfin tuna and some bigeye tuna are possible, along with lots of nice mahi. Wahoo action is still on the rise, and should continue into this month A few swordfish are starting to show with this action typically improving over the colder months. 

## New Life for Vintage Onancock Theater

What do you get when you cross cinema with a stage play? Eastern Shore audiences will find out on Oct. 16. and Oct. 23 when the Roseland Cinema and Entertainment Center (RCEC) sponsors a showing of "The Audience," starring Helen Mirren. (See "If you go" at the end of the article.)

It is exactly the type of event organizers had in mind when they formed RCEC to expand on the success of Onancock International Films.

About ten years ago, future RCEC president Kitty Croke and Steve Lotharios, from North Street Market, teamed up with Scott Chandler, owner of the Roseland Theater, to show "Cinema Paradiso" on a Thursday night. Seventy-three people came to see the Italian classic and Onancock International Films was born.

By 2012, the movie industry was changing from reel-to-reel film distribution to digital, requiring an upgrade costing more than \$100,000. Chandler was willing to make the investment with support from the community. The upgrade was made in 2015.

With its upgraded sound system and digital capabilities, The Roseland became a platform for expanding on Onancock International Films' success. A survey revealed an opportunity to provide additional programming, and the non-profit Roseland Cinema and Entertainment Center (RCEC) was formed. Its mission is expanding cultural, educational and entertainment opportunities for Virginia's Eastern Shore through screen performances of plays, opera, ballet, and other such events.

More than one hundred people flock to The Roseland on "2nd Thursdays," often having dinner at one of the town's restaurants and then walking to the show. This month, RCEC launches its first expanded cultural experience with a performance of "The Audience."

"We've been planning and working to bring world-class events to Onancock and the Shore and are thrilled to see it happen," said Croke. "A stage play performed in London and captured for the big screen, 'The Audience' is a crowd-pleaser that everyone will enjoy."

An article in the August 2016 CBES newsletter states that the Shore Health Foundation, which manages the endowment fund created by the former Shore Memorial Hospital to help address community healthcare needs, has been "acquired" by Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital. As Chair of that Foundation, I can state without hesitation that the statement in the CBES newsletter is untrue and mischaracterizes the Foundation. The Board that governs the Shore Health Foundation's activities is composed of nine people, six of whom are unaffiliated with Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital and its affiliates.

The Foundation has existed since 1957. It has never sought public recognition of its charitable activities. Until the affiliation of Shore Memorial Hospital with Riverside, it was focused on supporting the charity care provided by Shore Memorial to the residents of the Eastern Shore. At the time of the affiliation, the Foundation was made independent of, and put beyond the control of, Riverside. The independent Board has, moreover, taken a broad view of community healthcare needs. In the past six months alone, it has committed \$148,000 of support to a wide range of healthcare institutions on the Shore, including:

\$53,000 to Northampton's Department of Emergency Services to assure that all ambulances in Northampton County are equipped with the latest, state-of-the art, equipment for dealing with patients in cardiac arrest (two ambulances in Cape Charles and one in Nassawadox).







Part of the charm of small towns is their quaint rituals, and given the number of small towns on the Eastern Shore, we have charm in abundance.

Although small town traditions might leave outsiders scratching their

heads, we embrace them as a part our heritage; they bind us together in the same way that quirky family customs form cherished family memories.

Eastern Shore celebrations are, for the most part, much tamer than our former place of residence. Gizzardfest, for instance, in Potterville, Mich., was named for the town's Gizzard City restaurant. One year, local high school pranksters kidnapped and decapitated the giant fiberglass chicken mascot. Both parts were eventually returned, and as punishment, the perpetrators had to eat their weight in gizzards. (I made up that last part. I don't remember what happened to them, but I

thought that would have been just punishment.)

Tip-Up Town, at Houghton Lake, Mich., is a party on a frozen lake with (if you're lucky) 10-20 degree temperatures and icy north winds. Its name is from the ice-fishing apparatus that spans a hole cut through a foot or more of ice, with a red flag that tips up when a fish is hooked. Every year a local genius decides that this year the ice is safe enough to drive on with a half-ton truck, the truck falls in, and that, along with jumping into the lake for a "polar plunge," provides the festival's main entertainment.

By contrast, Eastern Shore events are mostly, like the Eastern Shore itself, understated. I am captivated by Onley's Veterans' Day Parade, Accomac's 4th of July Parade, Northampton County's annual Unity Day celebration, the annual Blessing of the Fleet in Cape Charles, and so many other authentic expressions of community. They seek not so much to call attention to themselves, nor pat themselves on the back, but to underscore our common ground, and to further ties and practices that create cohesive communities and lasting memories.

Far from being understated, but certainly an event steeped in tradition, is Chincoteague's annual Pony Penning. Part small town nostalgia, part tourism bonanza, and part media circus, the event yields the Chincoteague Volunteer Fire Company's primary funding source.

The event has been around so long that it has created traditions layered upon and within traditions — so much so that it is impossible to account for all what it means to those who attend. To see Pony Penning as just the swim, or just the auction, is to miss some of its richness.

Here are a few examples:

- Proceeds from the sale of one pony go to a designated regional charity each year.
- The Feather Fund charity helps children purchase ponies at auction.
- Misty of Chincoteague plays at the Island Theater just down the street from where the iconic children's book was written.

These are just a few, and none account for the family and friends that reconnect and form their own traditions around Pony Penning week.

If you have not attended Pony Penning, but would like to visit the ponies up-close, as of press time on Thursday, the Fall Pony Roundup was still on for this weekend. The fall roundup provides an opportunity for health checkups for the herds. The north herd roundup is Friday at 4:30 p.m.; the south herd roundup is Saturday at 7 a.m.

Start your own tradition. Explore some of those already on the Shore. And maybe, eventually, I will convince a certain town to adopt a new event that will eventually become an Eastern Shore Tradition: an annual Ex-S'more festival. I'll bring the marshmallows.
