2017 OFF TO A SNOWY START AS DEEP FREEZE PARALYZES SHORE

Most stayed home, lounged about in their pajamas, surfed the internet, watched TV, played games, cooked, cleaned and ate.

But there were some who ventured out into the frozen tundra called the Eastern Shore of Virginia last weekend and discovered the vast array of drainage ditches.

"To say that the troopers here were busy would be a gross understatement," 1st Sgt. B.E. (Jeff) Jones reported Tuesday. "Several of my troopers worked 14- to 18-hour shifts throughout the weekend."

"Between 3 a.m., Saturday, Jan. 7, and 11:59 p.m., Monday, Jan. 9, Eastern Shore troopers responded to 207 calls for service," said Jones. "Of those, 159 calls were for disabled vehicles that were stuck in the snow. Twenty-nine of those calls were for vehicle crashes."

"The greatest challenge with this snow storm were the drifts," Jones continued. "It was not uncommon to see three- to four-foot snow drifts in places. Due to the snow drifts, I utilized

the Virginia National Guard to transport troopers to areas that were inaccessible via patrol cars." The governor issued a statewide emergency that allowed National Guard resources to be used.

Accomack Sheriff Todd Godwin was out all day Saturday and Sunday. "We worked a few getting people out of ditches but it was a relatively quiet weekend because people were staying home," he said. "People were home just enjoying the snow and getting cabin fever."

In Accomack 12 to 18 inches of snow was reported. Hollye Carpenter, Northampton's Emergency Services Field Coordinator, said 11 to 13 inches had fallen in the southern county. "We got a good foot most everywhere," she said.

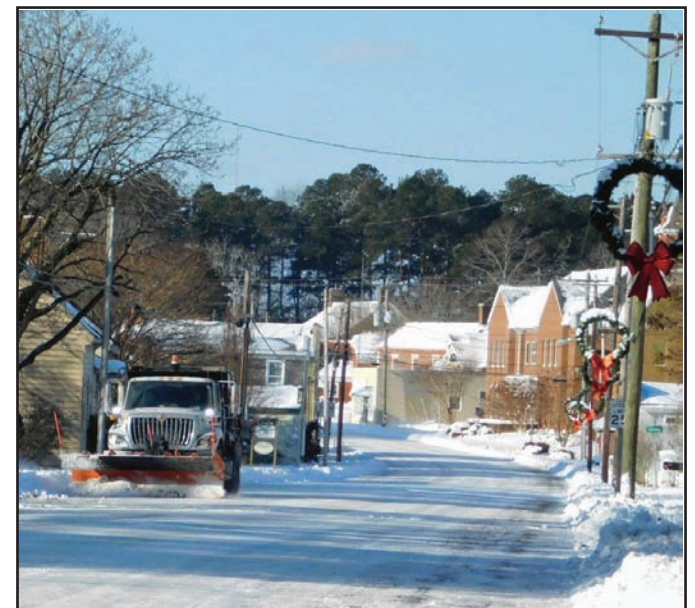
"We were busy with EMS calls on Sunday, but they were able to get to all but not without some challenges," Carpenter said. Saturday night and Sunday night there were also challenges with people trying to get home through snow drifts.

"A tanker truck turned over in front

of Hardee's in Cape Charles," she reported. "State police resolved that rather quickly. The biggest thing is to praise VDOT for an excellent job cleaning roads and ANEC for doing preliminary work which presented widespread power outages."

"We got a really good rain shower overnight," she said Wednesday. Excited for the snow to be disappearing. "Overall, we got through that mess."

"My biggest piece of advice for winter driving is to stay off the roadways unless it is an emergency," said Jones. "Allow VDOT time to clear the roadways before attempting to travel. One of the biggest issues we had this weekend were people that attempted to travel,

became stuck in the snow and abandoned their vehicles. This blocked the roadways and made it impossible for VDOT to clear the snow until the ve-

Randy Custis Park in Nassawadox could soon be taken over by Northampton County.

Supervisor Larry LeMond said funding issues and aging managers are the reasons for the request.

The 30-acre park offers athletic fields and support buildings used by county youth. LeMond said if

SNOW-BOUND CAST OF "EDGAR, I NOTHING AM," IMPROVISES REHEARSALS

For most households, the big snow meant a few days of forced down time. But for the members of RAWHIDE Theatre Company and a Jan. 13 opening at North Street Playhouse, it could have ended with more than a bad case of cabin fever.

Fortunately, the company specializes in creativity. In fact, its production of "EDGAR, I Nothing Am," is built around a loosely written script and the ensemble cast has to discover how to best tell the story. minimal fixed sets or props. The cast itself becomes the set into through creative movement.

"It's fun to use as little as possible to tell the story effectively," said Cat Yudain, RAWHIDE Theatre Company's artistic director. She conceived the piece, wrote the script, and is its director.

The story delves into the subconscious of Edgar Allen Poe after the death of his wife, Virginia Eliza Clemm Poe. With the premise that art can alter the world

in which it exists as people incorporate works into the pop culture or the public consciousness, Poe attempts to find some manifestation of his dead wife in the real world through his poem Annabel Lee.

The minimalist approach allowed the company (all 13 of them) to settle in for the duration of the storm at the home of Sara Stuart and Karl Stiegelbauer, parents of Production Stage Manager Mary Stiegelbauer, and still not miss a rehearsal.

"The one thing we brought was our puppet," said Yudain. The raven puppet was professionally developed specifically for the production.

"The Raven" is one of Poe's most recognizable works. In it, a raven pays a visit to a man mourning a love lost.

In "EDGAR, I Nothing Am" the raven, said Yudain, represents the starkness in Poe's life during the time of great loss following his wife's death. But he also has another purpose. "The raven serves

as a kind of guide for Poe," she said, "He follows him and helps him out."

The expansive of Stuart's living room was well-suited to the three-person puppetry and range of movement required for full rehearsals, and for sleeping arrangements for all of the cast members when not rehearsing.

"There was not a bit of floor left," said Stuart.

"They made the best of it," she said, with "lots of artistic plotting and scheming," even getting a jump on North Street Playhouse summer productions of "Beauty and the Beast" and "Young Frankenstein."

If it sounds like there was a kind of serendipity about the whole thing, consider this: Every night after rehearsal outdoor snow time, before a crackling fireplace the group would gather for story time. "We read through all the stories in the show, or that are mentioned in the show," said Yudain.

"It was a very stimulated household in the best possible way," said Stuart. "The days just flew by."

LATEST SURVEY: EASTERN SHORE RESIDENTS HAVE LED INTERESTING LIVES

They dream in color, had strict parents, met celebrities, chose the color blue, refuse to skydive, like themselves, are worldly, believe in love at first sight and they live in Accomack and Northampton counties.

That's what the majority of participants who answered a recent email survey conducted by the Eastern Shore Post had to say. Some even answered the questions while surviving the first snow storm of 2017.

Seventy-five percent said they dream in color, 8.3 percent said they dream in grayscale and about 16 percent said they don't dream or don't remember their dreams.

About 73 percent had strict parents, 81 percent like themselves, 85 percent were against skydiving but the other 15 percent were ready to jump. Seventy-two percent have met celebrities. Every participant has flown in an airplane. Five had not ridden on a train. And nearly 58 percent know how to use chopsticks.

Thirty-one percent, or the majority, picked blue as their favorite color. Green was second with 23 percent. Sixty-three percent said looks matter and 62 percent believe in love at first sight.

Terry Ewell, of Young's Creek, has self love "but I wish I could go back in time and do some things over and do them right."

"Just because everybody else is jumping into the fire, doesn't mean you have to!" Ewell's mother would repeat. "I am thankful that my parents were totally involved and concerned about me. My momma switched me a few times, and I can assure you that I was not traumatized and suffer no lingering effects! That's what's wrong with children now: the rod has been spared, the children are spoiled, and the behavior is atrocious. Undisciplined children grow up to commit crimes!"

Ewell wouldn't go skydiving because "I am not too fond of heights. ... I have met lots of bluegrass and country music celebrities, and I have their autographs. ... I love riding on trains, especially the old ones. To ride cross-country on a train is on my bucket list. Airplane? Once to Oregon and once to Louisiana, but lots of times to (Washington) D.C. I don't like being off the ground!"

"As long as someone has clean hair and a clean body and is dressed neatly or dressed for the occasion, looks should not matter," said Ewell. However, I certainly don't look so hot when I go around in my old work clothes. Even if you are poor, you should be able to take a bath and wash your hair and your clothes. ... We have been bombarded by media that pushes the 'Barbie' or model looks, especially for women. And that type of advertising and photoshopping promotes a false perfection that has caused people to have inferiority complexes and suffer from depression, envy, stress, manipulation, un-

necessary cosmetic surgery, bulimia and anorexia, to name a few things. Why can't we celebrate our differences, instead of trying to homogenize ourselves? We are individuals, not mindless, mass-produced beings. But that is how we act when it comes to looks and wearing clothes that some fat-cat designer/manufacturer deems to be the latest style. How stupid we are

to run out and change our whole wardrobes every year! We're brainwashed to think we have to have the latest style of glasses or jewels or cellphone or whatever every whipstitch! I wear what I want, and I couldn't care less for what is fashionable. I am not supporting fat-cat designers/manufacturers."

"It's lust at first sight," Ewell wrote. "Real love happens over time as you get to know someone and learn about them, and your feelings grow, and you want to spend the rest of your life with the person, and you carry out loving actions and deeds for that person."

Anthony LoFaso, of Onancock, has had only one or two color dreams.

"Most are grayscale." He likes himself "sometimes. My Mom was fair. My Dad was a tyrant."

"I was street preaching in Chicago and after I was

done, Pearl Bailey came up to me, introduced herself and encouraged me to keep up the good work," he wrote.

"The first thing we see is the physical until we get to know the person better. Then the looks aren't as important," LoFaso wrote. "I do believe that we can feel a connection with someone instantly but love takes a while to grow."

Rita Kelley, of Silver Beach, met Dennis Anderson, an American professional monster truck driver, who is the creator, team owner, and driver of "Grave Digger" on the Monster Jam circuit. George Latimer has donated a children's study room for the new Eastern Shore Regional Public Library in Parksley in memory of his beloved late wife, Frances.

Northampton-born Frances Bibbins Latimer, was a researcher, genealogist, publisher, and a cornerstone of African American Eastern Shore History. With degrees from Hampton University and New York University, she had a productive teaching career in New York before returning to the Eastern Shore to teach in Accomack County. She would later direct Project Head Start.

Frances Latimer served on the Board of Directors of the Eastern Shore Historical Society, The Edward H. Nabb Research Center for Delmarva History and Culture at Salisbury University, the Eastern Shore Center for Black History and Culture, the advisory board for the Arlington Foundation, Inc. and the Eastern Shore Regional Council of the Virginia Founda-

tion for the Humanities.

"Her lifelong dedication to education and learning that makes her husband's donation so very special," said Kitty Hall, of the Eastern Shore Public Library Foundation. "Within those walls of the children's study area where children can do their homework or quietly read after school, there just might be another eager historian or genealogist."

Others have also found ways to donate to the library that both bring comfort in remembering a loved one and meet essential needs of the future library.

When Parksley resident Betty Farley's mother, Brenda Burlin, died, Farley found comfort in her mother's journals. In their pages, she told stories of the loveliness of the flowers that surrounded her Vermont and West Virginia homes. She chronicled the comfort friends brought as they stood by her through her treatments and as she died from breast cancer.

The journals also told of happier times, when Burlin worked for the West Virginia Library. Although her position was "adult services librarian," her real love was for the children visiting the library.

To honor Burlin, Farley and her nephews, James and John Conklin, donated funds for a storyteller's chair "Many children will surround that chair in the future and experience the joy of having a story read to them,"

said Kitty.

the directors would continue their fund raising efforts.

In other business, Chairman Spencer Murray was re-elected to the top post. Supervisor Oliver Bennett was chosen as vice-chairman. The board will continue to meet on the second Tuesday and fourth Monday of each month for regular and work sessions, respectively.

Local real estate agent Bill Parr announced a \$500,000 movie will be produced in the Cape Charles area. Regency University Professor Nick Land and Parr discussed opportunities for the town and county to profit by the publicity of the production in 2017. Murray suggested the opportunity for the county to be involved by making public safety vehicles available. Parr said locals might consider investing in the venture.

EMS Director Hollye Carpenter urged the board to consider adding two EMS providers when the hospital moves to Onley in February. She said the increase is needed not on-

ly to help staff workers around the clock but also for training, medical leave and comp time.

The board expressed concern about funding \$40,000 through June 30 since the expense was not in the current budget.

Estimates to keep the workers in place for a full year would exceed \$113,000 for salary and benefits. Murray said they would need to consider a tax hike, cuts in other areas or moving money around.

Supervisor Granville Hogg questioned Carpenter about work-related injuries. She said some have occurred and a worker has been on medical leave for nearly a year due to a work-related injury. Supervisor Robert Duer was also concerned about the service bills that aren't paid. Carpenter said the county collects approximately 48 percent.

Murray said the county is committed to sending help when an ambulance is called. He also reported that Optima insurance is not accepted by

Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital. He said a representative from Optima would attend the board's February session to answer questions on the matter. About 1,000 people in Northampton and more than 2,000 in Accomack are insured by the company.

The supervisors also:

- Approved a special use permit for Arthur and Carol Upshur to convert their garage into an accessory dwelling.

- Approved a resolution of support for Rural Health to obtain a \$60,000 grant to help with plans to relocate its facility in Eastville. Hogg abstained.

Suspect in One-Man Crime Spree Pleads Guilty to Wounding, Gun Charges

Murder and Attempted Murder Charges Still Pending

Suspected murderer Alexander Hunter Picott-Cleveland pleaded guilty Friday in Northampton Circuit Court to three charges of malicious wounding and related gun offenses that occurred in Exmore last summer, the same day he is accused of killing his first cousin, Ronald Graves, 30, of Portsmouth.

The 22-year-old is also charged with attempting to kill his father at the Arlington Road house in Cheapside where the two lived. Graves was shot to death outside the home.

The guilty pleas involved maliciously wounding Mona Jones, of Trehernville, Ranquise Coston, of Exmore, and Andre Johnson, of Jamesville, and use of a firearm in those crimes. They were hit with gunfire at a graduation party in Exmore around 7:30 p.m. June 18.

In a plea bargain agreement, Commonwealth's Attorney Bruce Jones promised the wounding cases would not be considered prior convictions or be mentioned during the second-degree murder or the attempted murder trials. Those charges also come with related gun counts. A presentence report was ordered. Sentencing will likely occur after the other charges are heard. Misdemeanor counts of brandishing a gun and recklessly handing it were included in the indictments, but will not be prosecuted.

The defendant is being held in Virginia Beach City Jail without bond. It is unclear why he was transferred there from the Eastern Shore Regional Jail in Eastville.

Two vials of his blood were taken just after Picott-Cleveland was arrested about 12 hours after the incidents were alleged to have occurred. A State Department of Forensic Science report showed no ethanol, methanol, cocaine or benzoylecgonine, opiates, methamphetamines or MDMA, Phencyclidine, barbiturates, benzodiazepines, carisoprodol or meprobamate, fentanyl, methadone, zolpidem or alkali-extractable drugs were detected.

Jones said Picott-Cleveland went to the Exmore party with Graves, Jones and his sister. The defendant was intoxicated, was socializing, realized he lost his grillz (a gold frame worn on teeth) and went back to his vehicle to retrieve

his semi-automatic pistol after feeling threatened. When shooting, he was focused on Coston, Jones said.

Five cartridges from a gun recovered from the defendant's house were found at the Exmore site.

According to testimony at a preliminary hearing, the defendant told police he went out to a shed to get his 12-gauge shotgun during an argument and tussle with his father. Graves got in his path and was shot instead, Lt. Michelle Hallett of the Northampton County Sheriff's Office testified.

The defendant also told the officer that he purposely shot another man (Coston) at a graduation party. The others were hit unintentionally.

Coston testified he was shot four times in the back and spent 2 1/2 weeks in the hospital because of his injuries. "I was doing a lot of ducking, trying to get away ... I got shot four times ... I don't even know who shot me."

Hallett said the defendant told her, "They (Coston and others) were going to do something to me. I wasn't going to let that happen. ... I was trying to shoot him. ... I unloaded my whole clip."

Jones was shot twice in the neck. "Everybody was talking to different people and everything," Jones testified. "Next thing I know, somebody hollered out somebody had a gun. ... I don't think he meant to hit me. The gun went off"

Jones said she didn't realize how badly she was injured. Once they got to Cheapside, she went in to wipe off her wound and "heard some loud talking." When she went back to the vehicle, Graves got out to talk to the defendant.

"I was sitting in the truck wiping blood," she said. "Everything was behind me. I didn't see anything." When she got out, Graves was lying in the middle of the road. "I can't even explain how I felt and his eyes were rolling back in his head."

Johnson said he was a passenger in a car that pulled up to the party area. He was struck in the face. "We didn't have a chance to get out of the car. ... The bullet came through the windshield."

In different case, a charge of possessing an illegal drug was dismissed against a woman who was camping at Kiptopeke State Park. She had already served four

months in jail. Tamera Ann Collier, 42, with addresses of Sunnybrook Street in Richmond, Va., and Bowerhead Court in Spring, Tex., was charged with possessing a Schedule I or II substance, a felony. Collier was initially arrested for drunk in public. She asked the officer to bring her a black bag that was in her car and jail staff found a white powdery substance in the bag. The substance was tested with a field kit and there was a positive result for methamphetamine.

However, evidence last week showed that a laboratory test did not find meth. She stated she did not do drugs and she did not know what methamphetamine was. Collier pleaded no contest to drunk in public. She was fined \$50.

In Accomack Circuit Court, a Harbor-ton man pleaded guilty last week to two felony charges.

Phillip Darren Walker, 28, of Walker Lane, admitted to eluding and a third offense of driving under the influence within 10 years. The incidents occurred June 15, 2016. A presentence report was ordered and he was remanded to the county jail.

Officer Luke Arnold of the Accomack County Sheriff's Office pulled Walker over for failing to dim his headlights on Big Pine Road. It was two miles before Walker pulled over, and when he did, the smell of alcohol was coming from his person, Arnold wrote in a report. Walker sped off. A high speed pursuit continued for several miles with Walker reaching speeds of more than 100 mph. Walker lost control on Shields Bridge Road, but corrected. At the intersection of Shields Bridge and Boston Road, he hit a telephone pole.

In another case, Roland Milton Sturgis III, 19, of Fisher Circle in Melfa, pleaded no contest to two counts of breaking into the home of Steve Turlington and two counts of petty theft, stealing property belonging to Amie Booker, and burglarizing the home of Christopher Davis and felony theft there. The incidents occurred last April and March. Sentencing was set for April 2017.

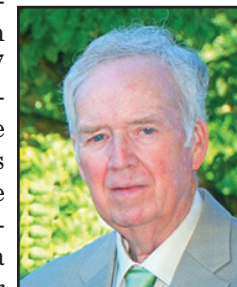

County and Captain's Cove Reach Agreement on Taxes

About \$280,000 was subtracted from the nearly \$700,000 Accomack County tax bill recently disputed by Captain's Cove limited liability companies known as CCG Note LLC and CCG Land LLC.

According to a settlement described in Accomack Circuit Court papers, the two companies paid about \$412,850 "in cash or readily available funds" for the bills. They also paid \$35,018 for the 2016 tax assessment. In addition, the companies must continue to make timely tax payments through Dec. 31, 2021, in order for the county to cease collection of \$278,938, or the difference between the initial bill and the settlement.

"Through Dec. 31, 2015, the county levied real estate taxes against the properties and contend that the amount unpaid and due ... totaled \$691,789," according to a document. The liability companies disputed assessments "as not reflecting the properties' fair market value."

In the end "the parties have decided to

compromise and settle their dispute in order to put an end to the lawsuits and fully and finally terminate 111 claims and potential claims," the papers stated. The parties agreed to bear their own court costs and attorneys' fees.

Assessor Brent Hurdle said Wednesday adjustments had already been made to reach the \$700,000 mark. He explained that about 1,330 properties were involved, most of which were vacant lots. Three parcels had "spec homes" or a commercial building.

Hurdle said he made corrections for some lots not initially classified as wetlands and others that were classified as having paved roads, but did not. "But there were a lot of lots that we didn't make adjustments on because we thought they were at fair market value."

He noted, "The market has continued to decline." Some parcels valued at \$35,000 in 2012 would be worth half that now. The appeal included taxes from 2011 to 2015.

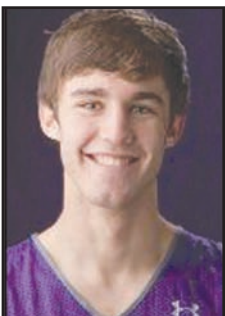

Basketball season is among us and in full swing. Many Shore athletes fostered the talent and the desire to pursue the game beyond their high school court. Michael Riopel and Taylor Major are among those who have continued to play, and find success, at the collegiate level.

Riopel, a graduate of Broadwater Academy, is now in his third season with the Amherst College basketball team. The stand-out player led their season-opener on Nov. 18, with a team-high of 13

points; he rebounded six and assisted four towards the club's 83-41 victory over Green Mountain College at LeFrak Gymnasium, during the 16th Annual Ken Wright '52 Memorial Invitational Tournament.

The 6-foot-5 Nassawadox native has seen 66 games over the course of his career with Amherst, netting a total of 412 points, 218 rebounds and 79 assists over 1,202 minutes.

Riopel also helped to catapult his Division III hoop squad into last season's championship game, when he swished a three-pointer with only 17 seconds left in their semi-final contest, helping lift Amherst to a 86-83 win over Tuft's University.

For the 2016-17 season, Riopel has already tallied 99 points, grabbed 45 rebounds and posted 19 assists over 219 minutes played in 11 games. Amherst is set to face Wesleyan University tonight (Friday) in Middletown, Connecticut, at 7 p.m.

Major, also a graduate of Broadwater Academy, made his college debut

this season with the Virginia Wesleyan Marlins. The 6-foot-4 freshman has two games under his belt, throwing two points, with one block in four minutes.

During his tenure with the Vikings, Major averaged 22 points and 11 rebounds per game. He made first team All-Conference in his senior year, and scored 455 points in 21 games. Major was also voted the most valuable player for two consecutive seasons and led the Metro Conference in scoring, finishing in the top 10 across the state of Virginia in points per game.

The Marlins fueled past Eastern Mennonite, 90-75, in Harrisburg Wednesday night during their last time out. Their next match up is scheduled on Saturday, Jan. 14; they will host Lynchburg College at 4:30 p.m.

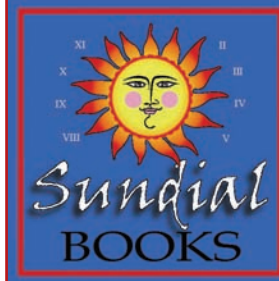

3. The applicant the owner must identify and provide contact information for a responsible party, if the owner is not the responsible party, who will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to respond to, and resolve issues and complaints that arise during a period in which the dwelling is being used for transient occupancy.

4. The number of overnight guests will be determined by the zoning administrator in consultation with the homeowner based on the number of bedrooms, size of the house and size of the lot subject to approval of the Town Council.

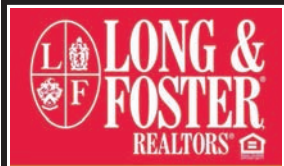



Percent of Children in Poverty on Shore is High and Unlikely to Decline

Children growing up in poverty are more likely to experience a host of negative consequences. They are more likely to drop out of school, more likely to become a teen parent, more likely to abuse alcohol or illegal drugs, and more likely to go to jail. That is one reason why child poverty is such an important indicator of child well-being.

In December 2016, the U.S. Census Bureau released the most recent data on child poverty for the counties of Virginia. Data from the U.S. Bureau of the Census indicate that 31 percent of children (age 0-17) in Accomack County and 34 percent of children in Northampton County were poor in 2015. This compares to 15 percent statewide in Virginia and 21

percent nationally. Moreover, according to several studies, the child poverty rate in the U.S. is higher than that of any other developed nation, largely because other nations provide more government assistance to children in low-income families.

The data used here reflect the official U.S. government poverty measure which compares a family's income to established thresholds based on family size. For a family of four, the poverty threshold in 2015 was about \$24,000.

When the poverty rates in Accomack and Northampton counties are compared to those of the other 133 localities in Virginia, Accomack ranks 118 and Northampton ranks 124. Statewide, Falls Church

City has the lowest child poverty rate (3 percent) and Petersburg City has the highest (43 percent).

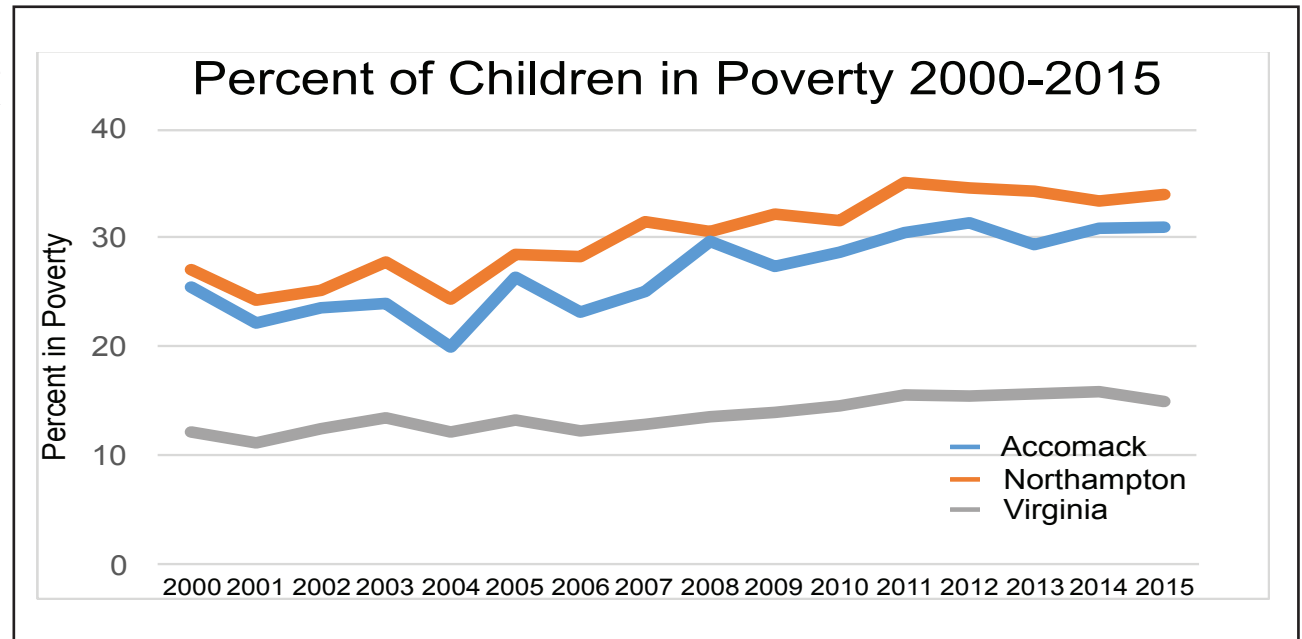
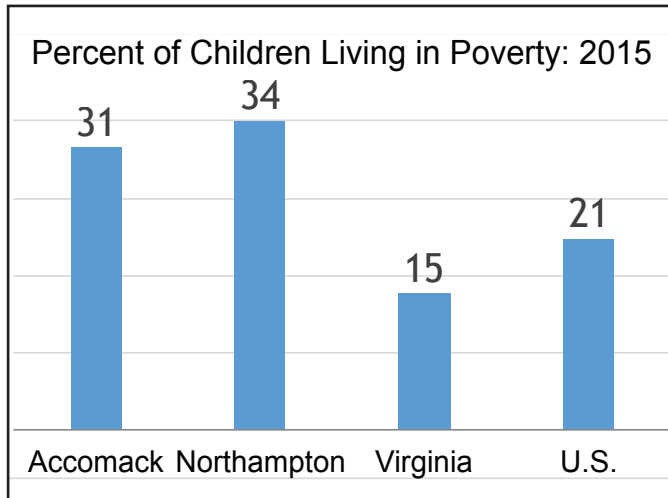
The child poverty rate on the Eastern Shore is not only high, it has been growing. The chart above shows that the child poverty rate in Accomack and Northampton counties has consistently been about twice that of the state since 2000. Moreover, since 2000 the child poverty rate has increased by 5 percentage points in Accomack County and 7 percentage points in Northampton County. This reflects a bad situation getting worse.

The high child poverty rate on the Eastern Shore not only compromises the futures of the children grow-

ing up here it jeopardizes the future of the Eastern Shore. Children growing up in poverty are less likely to get a good education, and as adults are less likely to be employed, less likely to be home owners and less likely to be taxpayers.

There is no simple solution to lowering the child poverty rate on the Eastern Shore. Lots of people have lots of different ideas about what to do. But unless this issue moves higher on the public agenda, the child poverty rate here is unlikely to decline any time soon.
