#### "Muddin' at The Moose" Marred by Photographer Fatality

"Muddin' at the Moose" in Belle Haven turned fatal last Saturday when a participating truck accidentally struck and killed a photographer at the annual event.

"The day was over with right then ... just out of respect for him," Patrick Long, an event coordinator and Exmore Moose Lodge member said Monday. "I called for a mandatory drivers' meeting" and offered to give entry fees back to the drivers but the consensus was to donate the money to the victim's family, Long said. Other donations were also accepted.

Rick Ulerick, 48, of the 6300 block of Knob Hill Drive in Virginia Beach, was identified as the victim by Sgt. Michelle Anaya of the state police. "Mr. Ulerick was actively photographing the truck race through the pit when he was accidentally struck," she said.

It is "still an ongoing investigation that is being handled as an accidental death ... the driver of the mud bog (truck) was Blake Cole Messer, 20, of Four Oaks, N.C." He "will not be charged in the incident."

"There was no fault by anybody," Long said. "He was in the shutdown area where he takes pictures. It wasn't like he was right up in harm's way. Just a freak accident like everybody else has been saying. He took photography all up and down the East Coast ... at least Virginia and North Carolina - and was very, very good at everything he did."

Ulerick "was close with all of us in the mud racing community. All of us thought of him as family. He was a special man. He never knew a stranger," Long continued.

"He touched so many people with what he did and his photography skills. This was his hobby. He never charged for the photos," Long said. "He helped promote all motor sports of any kind. He enjoyed watching horsepower ... dirt bikes ... he really enjoyed it."

"Everything is just so fresh on everybody's mind," Long continued. Another mud event is scheduled for Sept. 23, at the Moose, but it could be canceled. Moose International and the local lodge members will have to decide.

"Everybody's feeling is we'd like to do more - take even more safety measures," said Long. "At this time it is unknown if the events will be able to continue ... you can put in every safety measure, you can't prevent everything unfortunately," the coordinator said. "The safety measures that we have in place did the job" so the truck didn't go "out to the crowd. It was a very safe layout. Everybody is way away from

the track."

Ulerick's Facebook page had photos of trucks on April 14 that were going to race and people were sharing their condolences there. Dennis Anderson's Muddy Motorsports Park in North Carorlina is dedicating the mudding event on April 29 to Ulerick.

Long said the local mud bog was started in September 2014 and was held twice annually ever since. Back in the 1980s and early 1990s, the races were held at the Tasley Fairgrounds. "All who race do it for our own enjoyment and thrill of little kids cheering and clapping," Long said. He hoped the cloud of dirt kept the children from seeing the accident.

"We had people from Pennsylvania, Richmond to North Carolina. We travel across the Bay and race too. Not like monster trucks on TV but similar," he said.

#### Local Decoy Carving Legend Delbert "Cigar" Daisey Dies

Native Chincoteaguer Delbert "Cigar" Lee Daisey, 89, died Wednesday leaving a decoy carving legacy across North America.

"Accomack County probably lost its best known resident," carver and Supervisor Grayson Chesser told the board of supervisors at a meeting later that day. He cited Daisey as being among his mentors. "People will be upset from the Atlantic to the Pacific and from the provinces of Canada to Louisiana" to hear of his passing. "We lost a good friend," Chesser added.

A funeral is being planned for next

weekend around the schedule of the 47th Annual Ward World Championship Wildfowl Carving Competition and Art Festival in Ocean City.

According to the Ward Museum of Waterfowl Art website, "His nickname was given to him by a game warden when he lost some cigars while stealing ducks from the warden's traps," the website stated. "Some say he left the cigars to taunt the warden, but we may never know. One of the last surviving people who made a living as a market hunter, Daisey became an avid conservationist later in his life, serving

#### It's Official: Accomack Makes Mike Mason County Administrator

Accomack supervisors chose long-time Finance Director Mike Mason to be their new county administrator Wednesday. He's been serving as acting administrator since Steve Miner left the post in January.

The search will begin immediately for a new finance director, Mason said later. He will continue to do both jobs until a replacement is found. His annual salary was set at \$132,000. That's up from \$95,900 and makes him the second highest paid employee in the county. The top salary of \$140,000 belongs to Superintendent Chris Holland. Miner, who held the job for about a dozen years, was paid \$137,862.

"Mike brings with him a depth of local government experience and personal knowledge of Accomack County having worked in our county government for over 20 years," said Chairman Robert Crockett. "Also important, Mike has deep roots in our county. He was born and raised here, he is a product of our local school system ... Mike knows the pulse of the community. Accomack County is in good hands. Mike has the full board's

confidence in moving this county forward through implementing the policies and direction of the board of supervisors."

The board also welcomed its new deputy director of planning and zoning, Gary Pusey, who came to Accomack from Somerset County, Md., where he was director of planning and zoning.

In other business, officials discussed NA-SA's testing of wells for per and polyfluorinated substances known as PFAS. A fire-fighting foam that contains the compounds was frequently used for training on the

north-central side of the main base at Wallops. Recent samples of shallow ground-water monitoring wells near the site were found to have levels above EPA lifetime health advisory levels. Testing of Wallops drinking water supply, which comes from deep groundwater wells, did not find PFAS.

On April 12 and 13, NASA tested the Town of Chincoteague's drinking water, which comes from wells on Wallops. "An independent lab is analyzing the samples." An email released shortly before press time said "all stakeholders confirmed the levels are below the health advisory and the Town of Chincoteague water is safe for drinking."

Supervisor Billy Joe Tarr, who represents Chincoteague, said the island "has switched to the deeper wells until everything comes back clear."

"People shouldn't be drinking from the shallow wells anyway," said Supervisor Donald Hart. "I am concerned very much, as emergency services director. Chincoteague's wells are deep. They ought to really consider doing away with those shallow wells ... It's not a substance that they've banned," he added regarding federal regulations.

Supervisor Robert Crockett said Jarrod Goodman, Complex Manager for Tyson Foods, told him the company has invested \$6.5 million in new equipment resulting in 30 new jobs on the Shore.

as the resident carver at Chincoteague Island's Refuge Waterfowl Museum."

Daisey's carvings are recognized for both artist value and as working decoys. His works include black ducks, mallards, redheads, red-breasted mergansers and his most well-known decoy, the ruddy duck, often crafted in pairs.

The only fully decorative decoy he ever made was a 1973 pintail, created as a present for his wife. The piece was featured in National Geographic in June 1980. Its value was once estimated at \$150,000. In addition to the Ward museum, his work appears in the Smithsonian Institution and the Chincoteague Refuge Waterfowl Museum.

Daisey was also known for his keen sense of humor.

#### Two Rescued by Sheriff's Office Boat

Two Bloxom men stood on the bow of a sinking fishing boat with four-foot seas splashing and winds blowing in excess of 30 mph. It was after dark on Easter Sunday between Saxis and Guard Shore in the Chesapeake Bay. They had run into a fishing net that wound itself around their motor.

"It was pretty nasty out there," said Captain Todd Wessells, who is in charge of the marine unit of the Accomack County Sheriff's Office. "They were very happy to see us. They'd been fishing. It was blowing all day but later on in the evening it got worse."

"We got to them pretty quick," Wessells continued, speaking of Joshua Yunker and Justin Taylor.

The water "was over their heads when they first ran into it," said Wessells. Yunker "got in the water and attempted to cut the line out of his wheel and the boat slung around into the waves and took two waves over the stern. It swamped," the officer said. The water temperature was 59 degrees.

Just before Wessells and Deputies David Smullin and Bobby Taylor arrived in

the sheriff's boat, the Maryland State Police Trooper 4 helicopter found the sinking vessel with its infrared imaging system and provided lighting for rescue operations.

"We pulled the boat up beside them and grabbed their hands and pulled them on board." Wessells said.

Sheriff Todd Godwin and Wessells were very thankful for Maryland assistance.

"Just them lighting up the area, we were able to maneuver around the fish net to get to them." Wessells said. "They were probably 3/4 of the way sunk" when the helicopter found the sinking vessel; a 1970, 19-foot Mako with center console.

Godwin also mentioned that the Virginia Marine Resources Commission, the U. S. Coast Guard and the Eastern Shore of Virginia 9-1-1 Communications Center assisted in the operation. The latter got coordinates from a cell phone to help locate the victims, both of whom were fine and refused medical treatment when they got to land, the nearest of which was about a half-mile away. The boat was brought ashore Monday.

#### CANONIE, CASSATT, BAY COAST RAILROAD: UNTANGLING THE RAILROAD WITH MANY NAMES

Officials from both Eastern Shore counties threw money at the Bay Coast Railroad's car float eight years ago to get it back in operation, but despite the \$1 million worth of repairs, the barge hasn't moved since 2012, officials are uncertain about the railroad's future, about \$65,000 is still owed, local leaders continue to question if the rail should be considered a public or private entity and there is a bit of squabbling going on behind the scenes regarding what should be kept secret.

The Joint Industrial Development Board of Northampton County and its Towns (JIDA) and the Accomack County Economic Development Authority (EDA) met Tuesday and discussed the issues. There was a pep talk about getting Tyson Foods and Perdue onboard to use the rail. An Accomack-Northampton Planning District Commission employee offered his assistance with grants and development. But nothing was decided except that the panels would come back in September to chat some more.

"How can both counties help the railroad be a more valuable usable asset?" Chairman Bill Parr of the JIDA asked. He was concerned about the Cape Charles Harbor and the railroad being "a more viable entity as a part of the puzzle of economic development. That is the reason it is on the agenda today," he said, explaining why he gathered and distributed railroad information to the group. "Is there a way we can get that barge back in service? Are their (potential) users on the Eastern Shore that are not using it now? They might be using the trucking industry instead. The more information we have the better."

The uncertainty officials feel about the railroad is nothing new. As EDA Member Stella Rohde said Tuesday, "It's confusing."

When the barge needed repair, Accomack and Northampton counties each voted to put up \$100,000. But not all the supervisors were in agreement.

"I don't think we know enough

about their business," Supervisor Laura Belle Gordy had said. "We need to see the books ... let them borrow from a bank ... they tell us they aren't making any money."

"I'm still not sure who owns what," Supervisor Grayson Chesser of railroad properties. "Who owns rolling stock? ... Who serves on the board of directors? How much are they paid? It seems to me we have more companies than we have engines."

There is a lease between Canonie Atlantic and tenant, Cassatt Management LLC, (a private for profit company owned by Dickie Foster of Virginia Beach who developed Bay Creek near Cape Charles) which does business as Bay Coast. Canonie is considered a private corporation but 100 percent of its stock is owned by the Accomack-Northampton Transportation District Commission (A-NTDC), a government entity. Some of the commissioners are also railroad board members.

Foster pays \$7,000 a year for the lease and has 20 more years in the contract. Officials said he is obligated to


build an office and service building but never has.

The railroad property, (with the exception of a parcel leased to T&W Block and valued at \$132,200) is not taxed in Accomack or Northampton.

An email dated Monday was sent to Parr from Larry LeMond, a Northampton supervisor, retired Bay Coast employee, chairman of Canonie and chairman of the Eastern Shore Tourism Commission. In the message he writes about the lease management agreement between Canonie and Cassatt which was send to those going to the joint meeting.

"As chairman of Canonie I must say that you have crossed the line," Lemond wrote. "I don't know where you got this agreement but it is a CON-FIDENTIAL agreement between two PRIVATE entities -- Canonie & Cassatt and to distribute to others was ethically and legally wrong. You mention in your email that the RR is a tax-payer owned. I don't know where this comes from because the RR DOES

NOT RECEIVE ANY FUNDS FROM

TAXPAYERS. I will be at the meeting
tomorrow and I will make this perfectly clear to the rest of the attendees."

Parr's response was more lengthy. "My intention is to open a discussion of all economic development entities and assets of the two counties, from the railroad to the tourism commission, and all of the entities that impact our local economy. Our community is suffering economically, and I believe that we need to take immediate affirmative action to change that. We must find new sources of revenue for the Northampton County budget. It is an urgent matter ... the agreement does not have any provisions ... in the terms that indicate that it is a confidential document. It is a lease for publicly owned property, and I can think of no legitimate reason why there is anything confidential about it, other than an anonymously handwritten word on the front page that is not a part of the terms of the agreement.

LeMond said in a commission meeting

in February 2014, when he was still with Bay Coast, "we handled 106 carloads which brings our 11-month total to 1,621 cars, which is a 384 carload increase ... we handled 26 carloads of LP Gas, 21 carloads of paper and 39 carloads of grit.

But Tuesday LeMond said it is an obsolete business. It costs \$6,000 for a round trip from Norfolk to Cape Charles and maintenance is high because salt water and the metal float "don't mix. The railroad is handling fewer cars this year ... and making no money. It's just too darn expensive," LeMond said. "They try to get a full load before casting off but some customers don't want to wait. "Every hour those cars are sitting there is a cost. We are lucky to break even."

LeMond said there was a fertilizer company that was willing to wait and was a good customer for two yeas until "Norfolk Southern marketed against us ... It's just too expensive. It's a dinosaur, to be honest."

Still others say business in the Little Creek area of the railroad is prosperous.

Chairman Spencer Murray of the Northampton Supervisors wanted "full disclosure."

"You can't be half pregnant. You are either a private or a public company." he said. "I just never have understood this. Not that they have done anything wrong. They have a court document that says they are totally legit." Murray said if he were on the transportation commission, he would want to know what his "responsibilities were to the county ... I'm confused," he added.

J.T. Holland, a local insurance agent, is also with Bay Coast. He is a former chairman of the board of supervisors who was well known for his work on the railroad in the 1970s and 1980s. In 1976, when the transportation commission was formed, Holland was the chairman. The group hired Conrail to operate the line but that got too expensive. So the commission bought the railroad and eventually sold to Canonie. It bought it back in 1987 when the company threatened abandonment.

The following year, Holland said, "The Delmarva Advisory Council did a study ... they determined that if this line were to close ... it would possibly effect [sic] as far north as Wilmington

(Del.). This would mean about 5,000 jobs on the ... Peninsula." Holland was on the council by appointment of the governor at that time.

Holland attends Canonie meetings although he is not on the board.


The Eastern Shore Railroad Inc. began operating the line in 1981. It was taken over in February 2006 by Cassatt.

Rohde, a realtor, had an answer. "I have heard from a lot of guys that the most important thing they want is the railroad up and running - to get it worked out. Someone needs to be a liaison between the railroad and Perdue and Tyson's ... so it can produce a lot of money. Perdue is the third largest shipper on the East Coast." Rohde said Tyson's needs a new feed mill.

LeMond met with Tyson's officials four or five years ago but the deal fell through when the company suddenly said they couldn't afford to build the mill. "We were talking to the higher ups ... we need to address that again. I heard yesterday they may be looking again."

Rohde said she doesn't "care who does what with the railroad. I want to get the issue ironed out."

#### Probable Cause in Crimes Against Children

Probable cause was found in crimes involving children and the cases were certified to an Accomack Grand Jury recently in the county juvenile and domestic relations court.

A felony and two misdemeanor charges were certified against Kiana Drummond, 24, of Coal Kiln Road in Painter. She is accused of felony abuse of a child younger than 18 "so gross and wanton as to show a reckless disregard for human life." The misdemeanor counts were reckless handling of a firearm and assault and battery.

The incident occurred Jan. 10, 2017. Deputy M. Patterson of the Accomack County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) investigated. Secured bond was set at \$3,000.

Two charges were certified to the grand jury involving Shawana N. Johnson, 32, of Church Road in Tasley. Johnson was charged with strangulation by "applying pressure to the neck of such person resulting in wounding or bodily injury." The victim was 14 years old. Johnson was also charged with assault and battery of a family member. The incidents occurred March 9, 2017. Officer J. Rose of the Onley Police Department investigated. Unsecured bail was set at \$5,000.

#### Carjacker Sentenced

A 15-year-old was given a total of 32 years in prison last week in Accomack Circuit Court for his part in the carjacking of Supervisor Reneta Major and the theft of a Broadwater Academy bus last August. All but 10 years of the terms were suspended.

Dabreon Lamont Tankard, of Woodland Avenue in Melfa, was given three years each for property destruction, use of a firearm, grand larceny and two counts of grand larceny auto. He was given two years for maliciously shooting at an occupied vehicle and 15 years for carjacking with a gun.

After serving his time, Tankard was ordered on good behavior for 10 years and supervised probation for five years. Though not yet eligible for a driver's license, he will not be permitted to get one for a year after release.

Tankard was also ordered to pay restitu-

tion of \$192.50 to Major for her purse and the glass replacement in her vehicle, \$125 to Broadwater Academy, \$1,236.07 to Selective Insurance Cox and \$50 to Accomack County.

His accomplice, Dontrail Atqwan Johnson, 18, of Main Street in Melfa, pleaded guilty to the charges but is not scheduled for sentencing until August.

"I went to the door at the left back," Tankard told police about Major's car. "Dontrail went to the back right side. Dontrail told her to get out. She got out and ran. I got in on the passenger's side. Dontrail drove from Melfa to Painter. I never drove. We picked up (two juveniles) in Exmore," he continued. "I don't know where we were going. We were just going. When the officer (deputy) got behind us we did what he said."

Major was carjacked Aug. 8. The interview between Tankard and authorities occurred the next day. Investigator Patrick Coulter of the ACSO investigated the incidents.

Townsend told the officer that he and Johnson were walking by the railroad tracks on Lankford Highway. Townsend "walked up to a vehicle with a woman in it and asked for a cigarette." Townsend said both he and Johnson had BB guns.

"She just jumped out of the car and said, 'y'all can have the car. Just leave me alone," the file continued. When asked if he saw her fall down Townsend said, "I thought she jumped down."

He also admitted that the two stole the school bus on Aug. 4. "I shot the windows out of it with a handgun. It was a BB." The shooting happened somewhere around Wachapreague. They drove to Big Pine Road and left the bus and went to Johnson's house. When they went back, the bus was gone.

#### Prison Sentence for DUI

A Mappsville man was given a prison term last week in Accomack Circuit Court for driving under the influence.

Faustino Morales Santizo, also known as Frederico Recendis, 39, of Williams Street in Mappsville, was sentenced to five years in prison with four years suspended for felony DUI, on May 21, 2016. The term is set to run consecutively with the sentence for driving after having his license revoked. He got 12 months with all but a month suspended for that.

Santizo was ordered to be on good behavior for 10 years after he is released with supervised probation for three years. He was fined \$1,000 and his driv-

er's license was suspended indefinitely.

In another case, Shelly Fox. 31, of Chicken City Road on Chincoteague, was sentenced to three years each for three counts of felony uttering on Aug. 3, 5, and 7, 2015. All was suspended but a month each to run concurrently on the condition that Fox complete a diversion center program. Sara Weber led the Vikings' bat club with two hits and two RBIs. Riley Hook and Cassie Nadeau collected a hit each.



#### Library Worth Investment

This letter was read aloud at Tuesday's Northampton Board of Supervisors meeting.

Dear Editor:

Greetings from a veteran of our bookmobile era. Twenty years ago I addressed the Board concerning the fate of our aging unit which together with staff had been a godsend during very difficult times.

Occasionally my husband and I hungrily visited the Main & Eastern Shore Room. Two elderly patron friends, one a retired librarian, encouraged me to campaign for a replacement. Here, by the way, is an Aug. 29, 1957, Peninsula Enterprise photo of the new larger "Literary Truck" parked in Exmore. It was emblazoned with "FREE BOOKS FOR ALL." The larger facility was made necessary by an unexpectedly large demand for books throughout the Shore.

Fast forward to 1997: Our campaign was a fun challenge, although ultimately technology won and Northampton now has two vibrant branch libraries.

Last year, Franktown native Cara Burton eagerly returned to the Shore as our library director to spearhead alongside the Library Foundation Board our long delayed next step forward. We could not be more fortunate.

Most of us recognize the need for a respectable bicounty library system. Witness the momentum well under way: During a short capital campaign last fall Northampton citizens' generosity flourished — to the tune now of \$40,000. Clearly your constituents have signaled strong support for our regional library.

Technology continues to rule, doesn't it? Yet libraries are an evolving cornerstone of communities. They're much more than books. They harbor life-long learning and training facilities, for free. Sadly — usually due to budget constraints — we shortchange them.

Our dedicated branch libraries and their many Friends who raised \$6,000 (of the 40 above) await your commitment in order to continue serving us, especially those of all ages who are struggling. Technology will offer them increasingly more opportunities.

How does Northampton County benefit from the dollars budgeted annually? Roughly \$4 per capita?

Please see the director's analysis below. Usually one gets what one pays for, luckily

we get more. But there's a hitch. Conservative local funding hurts the state-aid formula (last item on her list). Therefore I strongly urge you to support our library. It will be 60 years young next year when we break ground.
