Teenage Terror on Tangier

A 14-year-old Tangier Island boy is being held in Norfolk Juvenile Detention Center after threatening to "shoot up" Tangier Combined School earlier this month.

According to a warrant, three school employees overheard the boy make the threats on March 6. The boy is not being identified because of his age. He announced to classmates and his teacher that when he gets older he is going to join the dangerous, extremist group ISIS (Islamic State of Iraq and Syria) or maybe a Mexican cartel.

"He stated that he was already a member of ISIS, online," the court document noted.

"You're not going to believe me," the boy said to others at the school. "But, one day I'm going to get my gun and come shoot this place up."

The boy is charged in juvenile petitions with making threats of death or to commit serious bodily harm to persons on school property and threatening to bomb or burn a school, Accomack Sheriff Todd Godwin said.

The officer who serves the island was away doing 40 hours of training that is re-

quired every two years. "They called us (at the office) and then we took our boat over" and handled the matter. Godwin added.

According to court documents, the statements were heard by special education teacher Loni Charnock, special education assistant Barbara Parks and support ssistant Kelly Wheatley. The boy lives with his father and grandparents. The house on West Ridge Road was searched on March 14. Seized were an HP laptop computer with camo cover, Toshiba laptop computer with black cover, an Amazon Kindle tablet

with black cover, five USB thumb drive storage devices, a blue Tracfone and three boxes of .22 shot ammunition. The internet search history can also be studied.

Investigator Sam Castiglia of the Accomack County Sheriff's Office investigated.

Superintendent Chris Holland declined to talk about it Wednesday. "I can't comment on a student manner."

The boy, who was wearing a camouflage jacket, was taken to Accomack Circuit Court for a detention appeal Thursday that was closed to the public.

Former Correctional Officer Pleads Guilty in Wake of Inmate Affair

Maria Danielle Owens, a former correctional officer at the Eastern Shore Regional Jail, who was carrying on an affair with an inmate, pleaded guilty Monday in Northampton Circuit Court to carnal knowledge of the prisoner "without force, threat or intimidation."

A charge of providing a cell phone to inmate Jodecii Kiiwaan Purnell, 26, of Westover, Md., was continued until next week to give the defense lawyer time to listen to between 24 and 48 hours of additional phone conversations between the two. Brandon Matthews, Owens' lawyer,

wanted to see if there was anything in the calls that could help his client.

There were nearly 250 calls, some of which included the officer and the inmate professing their love for one another. In exchange for the guilty plea, Owens, 43, then of Parksley, was allowed to remain free on bond until sentencing. It is unclear how long it will take for a probation officer to complete the short-form presentence report.

According to testimony and the court file, the jailer and inmate spent time alone together in his cell after the jail was locked down late at night. Purnell has denied having sexual relations with Owens and says he did not have a cell phone while he was a prisoner. He is now in Accomack Jail serving the rest of his term for possession of a firearm by a felon. He has not yet gone to trial for possession of a cell phone by a prisoner.

His trial was set for next Monday, but, will be postponed since Owens will be tried that day.

Investigator Michelle Hallette testified that correctional officers have complete authority over the inmates who are confined to that facility. They tell them where they can be, they lock them down and they are tasked with monitoring them. Because of the relationship, there were times when checks were not done, according to testimony. Owens was fired last November after working for the Northampton County Sheriff's Office for 13 years.

The log was not found to be correct, Hallette testified. Owens did not do the check but another officer was afraid to say or do anything about it because of possible repercussions, Hallette said.

Immediately after being dismissed, Owens began taking college classes.

She could be given a maximum of five years in prison and fined \$2,500. In one telephone conversation, Owens told Purnell he was not the first prisoner she had relations with.

"All I can do is hold my head up high," Owens said during an interview with Hallette. "I'm not going to beat myself up ... I don't want anyone here at the jail to think bad of me... you've known me all these years. I don't want nobody to judge me. I made a mistake. I had a weak moment."

Sheriff Godwin Signs Apology

A \$30,000 settlement in Accomack Circuit Court came with an apology note signed by Sheriff Todd Godwin and went to a man who spent 10 days in jail after being falsely arrested because he had the same first and last name as a suspect.

Keith V. Bailey of Gardys Mill Road, in Kinsdale, Va., formerly of the Eastern Shore, is happy with the arrangement, his lawyer Moody E. "Sonny" Stallings of Virginia Beach said Tuesday. He added that the sheriff's department freed Bailey as soon as they realized the mistake.

Godwin referred any questions to his lawyer John Norris, who did not return a reporter's telephone call.

The letter states, "Despite our good faith effort to investigate the underlying incident, it is my sincerest regret that you were arrested for a crime which you did not commit and for any negative reactions caused by that arrest."

Initially Bailey filed a \$250,000 lawsuit in April 2016. He named Godwin and Deputy Simone (Sam) Castiglia in his complaint. Bailey said Castiglia showed "complete disregard" for his rights and "acted with such disregard that his conduct constitutes gross negligence."

Bailey had requested a jury trial and wanted \$200,000 in compensatory damages and the rest in punitive damages.

He said on Nov. 6, 2014, the sheriff's office and Castiglia "issued a warrant for the arrest of one Keith Bailey for two felony offenses of credit card fraud greater than \$200," occurring Oct. 8, 2014. During an investigation, "Cas-

tiglia interviewed a store clerk at Vernon Powell Shoes in Onley ... Florence Mathews, who identified the individual committing the credit card fraud via a composite pulled from surveillance video from Walmart" in Onley where the first fraud was alleged to have been committed. Mathews said the suspect's name was Keith Bailey.

"The correct Keith Bailey's build was particular and easily distinguishable in the composite as a tall and slender build," the complainant, who is 5 feet, two inches tall and weighs 198 pounds.

On Feb. 2, 2015, Bailey was arrested in Warsaw, Va. He was held in North Neck Regional Jail and later taken to Accomack Jail. He said he told Deputy R. D. Taylor, who arrested him, "numerous times that he had not lived in Accomack County for years and specifically was not in Accomack on Oct. 8, 2014."

Despite Bailey's continued plea of innocence, he was imprisoned and held until Feb. 11, 2015.

The lawsuit claims "the plaintiff made numerous attempts to assert his innocence and mistaken identity ... by requesting to speak with law enforcement officials and speaking with his attorney."

On April 15, 2015, the commonwealth's attorney's office decided not to prosecute the charges, citing "bad ID by victim, wrong Keith Bailey."

Bailey claims "that the arrest ... was an intentional restriction of (his) freedom of movement," and that he suffered greatly as a result.

The "other" Keith Bailey was never arrested and charged with the crimes, according to court records.

No New Taxes, Chickens Continue to be Hot Topic

Accomack Supervisors passed the county's fiscal 2018-19 budget of \$57.5 million Wednesday with no tax rate increases for personal property or real estate.

Chairman Robert Crockett said it was possible despite the drop in tax assessments because of the very diversified economy in Accomack.

The plan included additional paid fire medics, salary increases for county and state-supported positions, about \$547,700 for an addition to the fire training center and local money to increase pay for deputies. The county school division got about \$500,000 more than it did in the current budget. About \$856,000 will be added to the county Rainy Day Fund. An increase in the landfill tipping fee of \$5.50 was part of the action, a 7.9 percent increase. The rate goes from \$69.50 to \$75.

Supervisors also voted to hold a public hearing on April 18, regarding a request to rezone property at 24227 Greenbush Rd. from General Business to Industrial to allow East Coast Dismantling to move to Tasley.

In regard to the popular chicken house

topic, Bill Satterfield of the Delmarva Poultry Industry reported 84 chicken growers are in Accomack with 331 poultry houses in use. He said a larger figure includes houses not in use. Satterfield said the average grower has 3.9 houses. Throughout Delmarva, growers have an average of 3.2 houses.

In 1950, there were 1,100 chicken farms in the county with 16 weeks of growing time. Until the industry was wiped out due to a hurricane in 1962, there were as many as a million chickens on Chincoteague, which is the reason for the name Chicken City Road, he said.

Calvin Washington, of Nelsonia, assistant plant manager at Tyson, told his story of working his way up the ladder at the Temperanceville plant. "I was always told if you're going to make a great living, you have to leave this Eastern Shore. ... It's that money that comes from Tyson Foods that allows us to shop locally. ... To me this poultry industry is awesome. ... I'm proud to be a poultry worker," he said.

Dave Lovell, of Onancock, a grower, agreed the industry has "treated us well. We're not the prettiest thing in the coun-

ty, we've not the best smelling thing ... but we pay the bills around here."

Lynn Rogers, of Bunting Point Road near Wachapreague, said she is concerned about the expansion of chicken houses and lack of regulations. "Big City by the Sea has turned into Big Chicken by the Sea," she added referring to the meaning of the name, Wachapreague. "Loss of quality of life ... has happened on your watch," she told the supervisors. "You can be part of the solution."

Brett McMillan, a hydrologist who has been working with the Eastern Shore Groundwater Committee for 22 years, told the supervisors the promise Tyson made to take water for poultry house cooling from the Shore's upper aquifer is "very significant. ... It would be a positive example hopefully for others to follow."

McMillan said he worked with Cape Charles and the saltwater intrusion that was predicted. He said the town didn't grow as once anticipated and desalting hasn't been needed. In Chincoteague in the early 1980s, a well created saltwater issues but a second shallower well solved the problem. "Sometimes you can reconfigure," he said, adding, "The cost of the desalting units on average have decreased by 10 fold every 10 years. We expect to see that trend continue."

Supervisor Grayson Chesser urged Perdue Farms to follow the example.

Nunez Hired as Accomack's Deputy Director of Planning and Zoning

Former Northampton County Administrator Katherine (Katie) H. Nunez, who lost that job in a restructuring move in August 2016, was hired recently to serve as Accomack's Deputy Director of Planning and Zoning. She was formally introduced to the Accomack Board of Supervisors at the panel's session Wednesday.

Nunez was selected from a pool of 12 applicants. She has 20 years of experience working for governments in Virginia and Massachusetts. She will be working in the first 18 months towards certification.

"The position is not new and was last held by Gary Pusey, who left in May 2017," said County Administrator Mike Mason. "She started on a part-time basis in September and is now moving to full-time." Nunez's annual salary is \$75,000 plus benefits.

"We are certainly excited about bringing

someone with Katie's qualifications and proven skills into the organization," Mason added.

When Northampton officials restructured their government they said it was to make things more "effective and efficient." They accepted Nunez's resignation and eliminated the job of economic development director, held by Kris Tucker. "We feel like we need new management," Chairman Spencer Murray, of Northampton Board of Supervisors said at that time.

Nunez held the post of administrator for about 11 years and was given a severance equal to a year's pay and benefits. Her salary was more than \$121,000. Murray said her benefits were around 30 percent of her pay. Nunez was hired back as a consultant about a week later at \$75 an hour for up to \$7,500 to help close the county's fiscal 2016 books and prepare for an audit.







Local Developer Has Big Plans To Lure Chick-fil-A, Wawa Near Melfa

A developer is hoping to lure a Chick-fil-A restaurant, along with a Wawa convenience store, on his property along Lankford Highway next to the state police barracks near Melfa. His project, The Fox Meadows, also includes 45 apartments.

Jack Siesmon, of Accomack Properties Inc., told the Accomack Planning Commission last week that he did not vet have a contract for the restaurant, but would be pursuing the plan.

The property is southwest of the barracks and south of Dogwood Drive. The business parcels would be 2.52 acres and 2.30 acres. A third adjacent parcel of nearly 14 acres is being proposed for three apartment buildings with 15 units each, which is permitted with the conditional use permit being sought. The 1, 2, and 3-bedroom apartments would be in three-story buildings, 41 feet tall, with covered parking and elevators.

"This development will serve a vital need in the county for modern work force housing," the plan stated. "This will allow the county to be com-

petitive in relocating and retaining skilled healthcare and education professionals, many of whom are at the beginning of their careers and often prefer renting to owning."

Siesmon is also asking for the property, which is one parcel, to be split into three and to be rezoned for the businesses from agricultural to general business and for the apartments from agricultural to residential. Ground level brick facade with metal garage doors topped by fiberglass swings, fiberboard siding on the upper stories, vinyl-cased windows, screened porches and low-maintenance deck and railings are part of the apartment plans.

"The proposal is within half a mile to the incorporate town limits of Melfa and within one and three quarters of a mile from the incorporated town limits of Onley," according to a county staff report.

The comprehensive plan states "the county's number one planning objective is to direct development towards existing population centers. ... In order to maintain the existing high speed sections of Route 13, future development should be limited to existing commercial centers such as T's Corner, Temperanceville, Nelsonia, Fisher's Corner at Route 176, Accomac, Onley, Melfa, Painter and Belle Haven." The county plan also stresses the need for housing.

Action was postponed until a traffic impact analysis is completed and reviewed by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT).







Cape Charles Appoints Burge to Council

Cela Burge was appointed by the Cape Charles Town Council last week as the interim replacement for former councilwoman Dora Sullivan, who resigned Feb. 26 with more than two years of her four-year term left.

The Cape Charles resident has worked as Accomack's county attorney for the past two years, and has a decade of previous experience as an attorney working for Turner & Turner in Eastville. Burge has a law degree from Regent University School of Law in Virginia Beach. Before receiving her law degree, she worked as Cape Charles' town manager from 1998 to 2005.

Burge was one of four candidates whom council interviewed for the position, and the only one whose nomination was seconded March 15.

Since Councilman Chris Bannon's nomination of Butch Vest failed without a second. Councilman Andy Buccholz nom-

inated Burge, seconded by Councilwoman Joan Natali, and council voted her in, with Bannon voting "no" and Councilman Charles "Sambo" Brown abstaining.

Council congratulated Burge in front of the crowd gathered in the civic center, that applauded.

A special election is expected to be held in November, coinciding with the general election, to determine who will complete the last 18 months of Sullivan's term.

Mayor George Proto and several

council agreed all the candidates were worthy, and encouraged them to run.

TOWN MANAGER SEARCH

Mayor George Proto, Councilwoman Joan Natali, Town Clerk Libby Hume and Assistant Town Manager Bob Panel comprise the committee in charge of finding a new town manager to replace Brent Manuel, who resigned effective April 6.

Natali reported a headhunter offered the committee his assistance on a volunteer basis. The town paid a recruiter \$20,000 three years ago to find Manuel. Since the search is being conducted "inhouse" this time, costs should be "extremely minimal," Natali said, presenting a savings of up to 75 percent.

Costs will be limited to advertising the job listing through professional organizations such as the Virginia Municipal League.

Council approved a motion to begin posting the ads the following day, March 16.

Northampton Looks to Improve Safety on Route 13

Improving safety on Route 13 and repairing secondary roads in Northampton County is a priority the Virginia Department of Transportation has been working on in early 2018.

Chris Isdell, local VDOT administrator, updated Northampton supervisors March 13 on the department of transportation's active projects.

Formerly, at certain intersections of Route 13, traffic lights would signal green

on both sides of the highway simultaneously, allowing vehicles to cross or turn onto the highway from opposite directions at the same time.

This signal pattern created confusion and was hazardous. Four intersections now have been converted to "spilt phase" intersections, meaning the traffic light pattern was changed so vehicles approaching from opposite directions now take turns crossing or turning onto the highway.

The split phase intersections are lo-

cated on Route 13 at the county line and Shore Plaza shopping center in Exmore, and at the main intersections of Nassawadox and Cape Charles.

Other intersections in Northampton will soon have flashing yellow arrow signals, Isdell said, which should be treated like "yield" signs and allow drivers to turn left at the traffic signal as long as there is no oncoming traffic.

VDOT's number-one priority of its ac-



Strangulation Charge Certified for Nandua Teacher

A Northampton district court judge found probable cause last week in the case of a Nandua High School teacher accused of strangling another man at a Cape Charles nightspot during Christmas break 2017.

The felony charge made against Jeffrey Antonio Wayman, 39, a physical education/driver education instructor, was certified to the county's grand jury, which will meet again in May. Misdemeanor charges of assault and battery and disorderly conduct were also sent to the jury in connection with the Dec. 24, 2017, incident.

A defendant typically does not provide evidence or a defense at a preliminary hearing.

Retired Judge James A. Moore of the fifth judicial circuit was appointed by Chief Justice Donald W. Lemons of the Virginia Supreme Court to oversee the preliminary hearing. Judge Gordon Vincent recused himself because Clerk of the District Court Karen Sparrow Merritt is Wayman's aunt, according to court documents.

Wayman is free on \$5,000 unse-

cured bond specifying he "may not leave Virginia, no excessive alcohol, no possession of firearms or other dangerous weapons, no contact with the complaining witness and good behavior." The Belle Haven man has continued to work for Accomack County Schools.

When reached by telephone Wednesday, Superintendent Chris Holland said that was the first he heard about the case being certified. "Nothing's changed. This is a personnel matter."

Tyler Combs, 21, of Seaside Road in Capeville, was the victim in the incident at Kelly's Gingernut Pub on Mason Avenue in Cape Charles. He was initially charged with carrying a concealed weapon and brandishing a firearm, both misdemeanors. But those charges were not prosecuted. Combs pleaded guilty to disorderly conduct and reckless handling of a firearm, both misdemeanors. Moore sentenced him to six months in jail for each of the offenses with all but a month suspended. He will be allowed to serve the time on weekends. Combs was also

fined \$250.

The Accomack School Board could have taken action to suspend Wayman from his job until the case is decided. They met Tuesday night. However, his name was not included in personnel changes that were listed. Wayman continues to teach classes at the high school. Superintendent Chris Holland did not return a reporter's phone call Wednesday.

Chief Jim Pruitt, of the Cape Charles Police Department, said both men had been drinking. "Some words were exchanged and then the two got into a scuffle. It could have been a really bad situation. The other issue we have is nobody called and reported it" despite there was apparently a room full of people in attendance. No shots were fired.

Long time Mayor Denise Bendick, of Melfa, resigned this week because of poor health, she told the Eastern Shore Post Tuesday.

"My health hasn't been very good," said Bendick, who has been mayor for 14 years and was town clerk before that for about a dozen years. "I feel like I haven't been able to do 100 percent as mayor, so I'm giving it up."

Bendick said Sheriff Todd Godwin has been a "Godsend" to Melfa as he has provided officers for events like fingerprinting and has brought police dogs for visits with area children. He will continue to offer a police patrol three days a week, she wrote.

Bendick also mentioned Supervisor Donald Hart's sorrow in her leaving. She said she called to give him the news.

The former mayor said she will be around to help those who take over by showing them how to complete the necessary forms for fire funds and the litter grant.

Councilmen Brian Langley and Charles Wilbur have both expressed an interest in being appointed to fill out her term. A more permanent mayor will be elected by town voters in November.


Game 5: EZ Loan Bruins 3, Grounds Keepers Lawn Care Capitals 3



tive projects in Northampton is Old Cape Charles Road, at a cost of more than \$11.5 million, expected to be completed in April or May of this year.

Chairman Spencer Murray asked Isdell who is responsible for the end portion of Old Cape Charles Road leading to Bayshore Concrete. Isdell said VDOT maintains the road all the way to, but not including, the entrance onto Bayshore Road.

The second-highest priority is Cemetery Road in Belle Haven, but VDOT was unable to obtain the estimated \$7.5 million required to move that project forward.

VDOT has since decided to perform a "full-depth reclamation" of the road, at a far lesser cost of about \$924,000. This cheaper method of rebuilding a roadway entails pulverizing the existing asphalt, mixing it with cement and water, and compacting it to create a solid base for a new asphalt or concrete surface.

There is a funding shortfall of less than \$20,000 for the Cemetery Road project with the new estimate, but Isdell is confident that the funds will be obtained and the project will go out to bid and undergo construction in 2022 or 2023.

The Bayside Road project, which would have extended that road to Broadwater Road, was canceled, and its funding was transferred to the Cemetery Road project.

Within VDOT's secondary six-year plan (SSYP), Northampton is designated funds of \$41,618 per year, from 2018 to 2023, for a total of \$249,708.

The new "smart scale" approach to fund VDOT projects has heavily influenced the SSYP program. SSYP funds are now used for small, realistic projects, and the project list has been cut to reflect the program's more realistic goals. New projects can be added to the list when old projects are completed or reprioritized.

"Old formula" project funding was planned to be pulled statewide, but Northampton did not lose any funding, Isdell reported.

Severe winter weather is hard on roads, and creates a lot of potholes, Isdell said. He asked citizens to report potholes to ensure their repair. Since January, VDOT has repaired 322 potholes in Northampton, Isdell said.

Citizens have recently raised concern

about drainage, which Isdell said is an ongoing problem on the Shore, which VDOT addresses at every opportunity.

EMS GARAGE

The most recent bid received to build a new garage for Northampton's emergency services vehicles was \$548,389, even higher than previous bids which supervisors deemed exorbitant.

Murray asked Director of Public Works Chris Thomas why the bid included such a high amount for site work - \$125,000. Murray believed that a lot of site work, such as installation of well and septic service, had already been done.

Thomas rattled off a laundry list of site work that still needs to be completed, including: breaking up and removing the road bed where Route 13 once ran, stripping the top soil and gravel, excavating, placing fill for the concrete pad, widening the driveway, landscaping, and electrical work.

With the situation appearing to continually worsen rather than improve, Thomas offered an inventive alternative: As a professional engineer, he could act as the general contractor for the project and drop overall costs to \$300,000 or less, he said. For example, by dealing directly with the manufacturer, the building itself could be purchased for \$89,000, Thomas said.

The project would take six months to complete, he estimated.

Supervisor David Fauber approved of the idea, and informed Thomas he was confident in his ability to do the job.

Others were more skeptical. Supervisor John Coker thought that Thomas' estimate, cutting project costs nearly in half, was a "stretch."

County Administrator Charles Kolakowski pointed out the project would consume a lot of Thomas' time, whose plate is already full with day-to-day activities and other major upcoming projects he will have to oversee, like the rehabilitation of Willis Wharf. Moreover, additional county workers would have to contribute their time and efforts, and supervisors were unsure whether those employees possess the knowledge and skills the job would require.

Supervisors took no action on Thomas' offer March 13, but thanked him for the suggestion.

Crisis Intervention Team is 100 Strong

The Eastern Shore Community Services Board's crisis intervention team hit a milestone in February, when 23 first responders became certified in crisis intervention and raised the team's presence on the Shore to more than 100 strong.

The crisis intervention team is a relatively new way in which CSB supports mental health on the Shore, providing emergency behavioral interventions for individuals suffering from mental health crises.

Crisis Intervention Team Coordinator, John Konkel, first heard about the program from Lisa "Mimi" Sedjat when she became ESCSB executive director in August 2014. He was a CSB outpatient therapist when Sedjat sent him to crisis intervention training in Richmond in January 2015. Konkel said he "had no idea what CIT was all about when I arrived, but I saw the value" during the class.

The Virginia Crisis Intervention Team Coalition defines CIT as a "jail diversion program for the mentally ill," with the purpose of "addressing system change for crisis care within the community."

The crisis intervention team assists those who come in contact with police or other first responders while presenting "symptoms or behaviors that are misinterpreted as criminal in nature, inappropriate, dangerous or violent," and may need mental health treatment.

Officers alert the CIT to an emergency mental health situation by calling the 24/7 crisis line at 757-442-7707, and reaching one of six certified prescreeners on rotating duty. If the prescreener determines further evaluation is needed, arrangements are made with the individual's family and the magistrate and/or law enforcement officer.

An individual requiring further mental

health evaluation who is detained under an emergency custody order is sent to the CIT assessment site based at Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital's emergency room. The site is open 10 hours per day, from 4 p.m. to 2 a.m., staffed by a CIT-trained officer of the Accomack sheriff's department, and is open to all Shore law enforcement agencies.

The CIT program benefits both mental health crisis victims and law enforcement officers, quickly getting victims help - from outpatient therapy to inpatient psychiatric treatment - without overburdening law enforcement. Normally, a police officer must monitor the subject of an emergency custody order for up to 8 hours, but at the hospital CIT assessment site, custody may be transferred to the crisis intervention team member on duty.

The crisis intervention team offers help to "all individuals in crisis, regardless of previous mental health history," Konkel said.

All first responders, including police, firefighters, EMS, 911, and mental health personnel, are eligible to train and become certified on the crisis intervention team. The free, 40-hour, weeklong class is held once every September and March in the Eastern Shore Regional Fire Training Center in Melfa.

The Shore's crisis intervention team of 100-plus members include law enforcement officers from Virginia State Police, Accomack and Northampton sheriffs departments, Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel, Chincoteague, Onley, Onancock, and Parksley. Staff from the magistrate's office, 911 center, adult and juvenile probation and parole centers, Northampton EMS, Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital, and the Eastern Shore CSB are also represented.





The tall pine had stood there cheering me on through many a sad day. It was the checkered flag that urged me to coast into work on time and meet my deadline. And it blocked the sun so perfectly.

So what will give me inspiration?

I guess the tree's demise happened during a recent wind storm because it was there one day and gone the next. I was driving north on Bobtown Road north of Pungoteague when I realized it. I just cleared the woods, looked to the right in hopes of glimpsing a deer and then to the left and, oh my God, my tree was gone. I could hardly believe it. I've been looking at that tree for decades and decades.

I didn't go down the long dirt driveway that leads to it. I never had before. It is probably someone's driveway. But, I wanted to say goodbye. I could see it lying on the ground. I decided to just wave from my window and I've been doing that every day since.

However, I fear, that at some point when someone takes it away, the world will be a different place.

I have been wondering if it will mean my ability to stomp will be gone. My youth will vanish. I am going to have a gigantic birthday this year. So could Mother Earth be sending me a sign? I will try to remember the spot where my favorite tree was but will I soon forget? It is like a piece of history has been removed.

My family arrived in Painter when I was nine. We lived on Main Street and in our yard was the oldest tree in town.

Dear Editor:

I am writing to inform readers of the inefficient justice system in Virginia. I am from Pennsylvania, but have visited Virginia every year for as long as I can remember. Last year, while visiting with my family, my grandson got into some trouble after drinking. He was placed in jail. All of this is justified, but the length of time he has had to spend there is not.

He was placed in a jail where there was no room for him and had to sleep on the floor for several weeks. There was no hot food and no air conditioning. This was July 11, 2017. He was not allowed bail and his trial date was not set until January 18, 2018. That is 6 months in jail without even being convicted of a crime. After finally receiving a trial, he now has to wait for another 3 months for presentencing. He was assigned a

probation officer that has not started work yet and will be in training until March 22 2018 - another 3 months in jail without even being assigned a sentence.

Your taxpayer money is paying for these prisoners to waste time in jail because there are not enough prisons, court dates, or probation officers to handle all these presentence reports that should be done while the person is waiting for trial, not after. What a waste of everyone's time and money! Some of these prisoners would benefit more from treatment, not jail. And they wonder why there are repeat offenders.

Whatever happened to having a hearing and getting sentenced on the same day? Pennsylvania's system is much better, and we also have treatment courts instead of everyone being thrown in jail, if they need it.

I, for one, have spent my last vacation in Virginia. I might get a traffic violation and have to spend 6 to 9 months in jail waiting for a hearing.

Something has to be done! Please write to your lawmakers. I already have.


