Two Girls Find Body in Hallwood House

Two young girls were "nosing around" an abandoned house in Hallwood last week when they found a man's decomposing body in an upstairs room.

Police Chief Wilson Glenn of the town did not identify the girls, ages 10 and 12.

"We think he went there for refuge and just happened to pass away there," Glenn said of the victim. "He was there approximately two to four months, I would say."

"We're 98 percent sure (that the death) was natural causes," the chief said.

Accomack Sheriff Larry Giddens said he received information Tuesday from the Medical Examiner's officer confirming the identification of the body, but that information was being withheld until relatives can be notified.

The Driving Force in Accomack County

Accomack County owned 111 cars, vans and trucks in the last fiscal year, according to records obtained through the Freedom of Information Act by the Eastern Shore Post. Fuel costs to run those vehicles totaled nearly \$296,000.

In addition, records show that the school system owned 39 vehicles (not including buses) that used about \$69,100 in gasoline in the 2007-08 term. It cost nearly \$5,530 to maintain the vehicles.

Three cars were assigned to the assessor's office and used nearly \$700 in fuel from July 1, 2007, to June 30, 2008.

The sheriff's department was assigned 44 vehicles. A breakdown shows 32 were driven by law-enforcement officers, two by jail personnel, seven by court and related officers, two by animal control workers and one for ordinance enforcement.

Fuel expenses for sheriff's vehicles were broken down by county finance workers as about \$44,045 for court services, \$90,286 for law enforcement and \$5,804 for correction and detention. Ordinance enforcement used about \$2,587 and animal control used more than \$6,300 in gasoline.

The car used to transport and oversee under-age prisoners by juvenile probation used about

\$5,060 worth of gasoline.

Seven vehicles belong to the public safety department and include two Hazardous Materials trucks. Gasoline to run those vehicles in the last fiscal year cost about \$4,002.

The Building and Zoning Department has four vehicles that used \$4,814 for fuel.

The Economic Development Department has one vehicle that used about \$4,083 worth of fuel.

Parks and Recreation is assigned seven vehicles that used about \$7,788 worth of fuel.

Two vehicles used by the Planning Department used nearly \$2,176 worth of gas.

The airport used \$925 worth of fuel in its pick-up truck.

Social Services Department workers drive 10 cars, SUVs and vans that used nearly \$5,900 in fuel.

Thirty-one licensed vehicles are used by the Public Works Department. There are nine categories for that group.

Seven vehicles are used for buildings and grounds. A separate document listed the cost of fuel operations for that section as \$14,868. The buildings and grounds administration used about \$570 for gasoline.

Two six-wheel trucks are used by Public Works for storm drainage. The total expense for those vehicles was about \$2,574.

Five trucks are used for litter control and burned about \$20,145 in gasoline.

Seventeen various vehicles used about \$61,893 worth of fuel to handle solid waste.

Vehicles designated for county docks and ramps used \$1,460 worth of gas and 911 sign maintenance burned up nearly \$2,300 in fuel.

School Vehicles

A breakdown of school district vehicles shows 14 are used by maintenance workers, five for driver education, five by the bus garage, six for computer technology, one for hearing-impaired transport and one for special education transport.

In addition, seven school system workers have cars they solely use. According to records, Superintendent W. Richard Bull drives a 2006 Ford four-door sedan valued at \$9,215. There are two 4-door Chevrolet cars designated for assistant superintendents. One is a 2004 model valued at \$6,375 and the other is a 2005 model valued at \$6,490. Food Services Coordinator Bill Hall drives a 2005 Chevrolet pickup worth \$7,030. Director of Student Services Leander Roberts drives a 2002 Chevrolet four-door sedan valued at \$3,965.

Facilities Coordinator Michael Tolbert drives a 2007 Dodge pick-up valued at \$10,975 and Transportation Supervisor Frank Hurst drives a 2007 GMC pick-up worth \$15,925.

Burned-Out Family Needs Assistance

Five fire companies responded to a blaze that destroyed the home of a family of seven early Christmas morning on Village Park Lane off Metompkin Road near Parksley.

Vice President Wayne Marshall of Parksley Volunteer Fire Company said a single-wide trailer, which was the home of Norman Bailey and his family, was a total loss.

No one was injured. The possessions of Bailey and his wife and five children also were destroyed. The cause of the blaze has not been determined, said Marshall.

The fire was reported at about 5:30 a.m. Firefighters from Parksley, Bloxom, Tasley, Onancock and Atlantic responded. It took nearly two hours to control the burn.

Parksley VFC and the American Red Cross are hosting the family at the Comfort Inn in Onley until another residence can be found. Atlantic Volunteer Fire Company gave toys to the youngest mem-

bers of the family. However, Marshall said more help is needed.

The 36-year-old man and his 15-year-old son both wear 40x29 pants and 2X shirts. Both wear size 10½ shoes.

The 36-year-old woman wears size 26-28 women's pants and a 3X shirt. Her shoe size is 9½ wide.

The 14-year-old girl is a size 5 junior. She wears size XL shirt and 9½ shoe.

Her 12-year-old sister wears a size 3 junior and a large shirt. Her shoe size is 8½.

The 4-year old boy wears a size 7 pants and a youth large shirt. He shoe size is a boys' 13.

The 3-year-old boy wears 4T. His shoe size is 10 boys.

Checks should be written to the Parksley Volunteer Fire Company, with "Bailey family" in the memo. Envelopes also should note "Bailey family."

Northampton Receives Farmland Preservation Funds

Gov. Timothy M. Kaine has announced the distribution of funds to 11 Virginia localities, including Northampton County, to preserve farmland within their boundaries through local Purchase of Development Rights (PDR) programs.

PDR programs compensate landowners who permanently preserve their land by voluntarily placing a perpetual conservation easement on it.

"Farmland preservation remains a priority for Virginia at both the state and local level," Kaine said. "Even with our budgetary restraints, we will continue to support PDR programs in every

way we can. My Renew Virginia plan includes initiatives to protect our environment, and these PDR programs do exactly that."

Twenty-one local PDR programs exist in Virginia, seventeen of which have some level of local funding currently available. This is the second time that the Commonwealth of Virginia has provided state matching funds for certified local PDR programs.

Ten localities, including Northampton, received \$49,900 each. Grant applicants had to report how much funding was available for their local PDR programs as of Oct. 17, 2008, and the state funds

matched that amount up to \$49,900 per locality.

"One of the key components of preserving working farmland is the role played by local governments," said Todd P. Haymore, commissioner of the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Con-

sumer Services (VDACS), which administers the state's farmland preservation program. "This year state matching funds were reduced because of the depressed economic situation, but local governments continued to give high priority to this important task."

each other?" she asked. "Wouldn't it be nice if that's how we all acted towards each other every day?"

"The only thing I can predict is that our county will plummet into a deeper recession," said Natalie Rinker-Good, formerly of Northampton. "I know from experience that if you can catch a fish or have some land to plant seeds, you will not go hungry."

"Years ago, when we lived in Capeville, my family had a hard time making ends meet. But, we always had the ability to put food on the table. We didn't need to be clever, just resourceful."

"I had a wonderful older neighbor who showed me where wild asparagus grew along the railroad tracks and how to can vegetables and make jam. She showed me how the walnuts from our tree added fiber and flavor to our

homemade breads. I saw firsthand how a community can come together to lend one another support during hard times. So, I guess I can also predict that neighbors will be more willing to reach out to each other and share their knowledge of becoming more self sufficient and less dependent on social services to provide basic needs," said Rinker-Good.

"I don't make New Year resolutions," she said. "I never needed to make any radical changes in my life. Most resolutions I hear others make are unattainable. I think when some people make out-of-reach promises to themselves it just sets them up for some measure of failure. Sometimes the small steps to obtain a goal are more fulfilling and less taxing on the psyche."

Annette Mills of Pocomoke City, Md., is not too optimistic.

"I foresee a difficult winter for most of the Shore with more robberies, injuries from fights, all due to unemployment and drugs being brought in," she said.

"I believe the economy will only get worse and that the Democrats in office and coming in office will be handing out money left and right to the ones already receiving governmental assistance, especially the illegal immigrants," she wrote. "Punishment should go to the ones hiring the illegals, also."

"Churches will receive more requests for help because social service refers clients to churches before actually helping," said Mills. "It is the responsibility of the churches to help feed the widows and children, but not pay their bills due to wrong decisions on their part."

"My prayer for 2009 is that

Christians become more involved with politics and that all people vote if they are eligible and not just complain about government when they haven't even taken the time to vote."

Giddens said that at about 4:10 p.m. Friday, his office received a report of a body found in a house on Church Street.

"Accomack deputies and investigators spent hours processing the scene and the body was transported by Fox Funeral Home to the medical examiner's office in Norfolk for an autopsy," said Giddens.

As of Tuesday, the nature of the death had still not been determined and was awaiting the final medical report.

Glenn and Sheriff's Investigator Billy Joe Tarr are in charge of the probe. Glenn said the autopsy was completed Monday, but results of some of the tests were not yet known and until they are, the officers will not publicly identify the man nor offer a cause of death.

The abandoned house is owned by A-Z, a used furniture company that has a warehouse nearby, Glenn said.







Pesticide Application Recertification Sessions Offered This Month

In the past few weeks, many farmers have received information from the state about the need to recertify for the private pesticide applicator category.


This year, two sessions are scheduled for pesticide recertification. Pesticide recertification can be obtained for two years (can accumulate a total of five years) for Category 90-Food, Fiber, Forestry Crops and Commodity Production Pest Control by attending the Eastern Shore Ag Conference and Trade Show scheduled for Jan. 7 and 8 at the Moose Lodge in Belle Haven.

To earn recertification, partici-

pants must attend the complete morning session on Jan. 7 beginning at 9 a.m. (registration, coffee and doughnuts at 8 a.m.), plus one other session either on the 7th or on Jan. 8.

Also, on Jan. 28 at the Research Station at Painter, two sessions will be held, one from 8:30 a.m. to noon and the second at night beginning at 6:30. Commercial applicators for categories 1A, 10 and 60/Registered Technician will need to attend the morning of Jan. 28 and stay for an additional 90 minutes.

Pesticide licenses might say they expire Dec. 31, but there is a 60-day grace period.




Magic Show on Tap



