School Officers Could Be Cut

Sheriff Larry Giddens could face a hard decision in the upcoming fiscal year — with an already understaffed workforce, budget restrictions might force him to send deputies to the unemployment line.

If he has to do that, employees would be moved around and certain services would be eliminated. There would no longer be two school resource officers and a Drug Abuse Resistance Education officer (DARE). Giddens said he also wouldn't be able to afford a Drug Task Force representative.

"If the cuts take place, I don't have a choice but to let four people go," he said Tuesday. "No, I don't know who they are. ... It's a hard decision. ... I'm hoping and praying it doesn't get to that."

Cutting the school officers would be a big step backward, Giddens believes. "They're there as a deterrent against drugs, thefts and assault and batteries," the sheriff continued. "It helps create a positive image — respect for the officers and not committing crimes."

Deputy Joseph Somma, the resource officer at Nandua High School, said the change "would hurt. It took me a while to get the school where it is." But Somma added, "I'm flexible. I'd work anywhere ... the school is doing well."

Giddens said that while some administrators would lay off the last to be hired, "you have to weigh in a lot of things. I'll sit down with my command staff and we'll make some business decisions. We're working short-handed now."

The sheriff explained that about this time

last year there was talk of major cuts, but stimulus money came through. Still, the loss was looming so he never replaced the sorely needed staffers who had left for one reason or another. There were four, for a total of eight positions.


Still, Giddens hasn't lost hope. "I'm not getting alarmed until the state actually says these cuts are going to take place," he said. "I don't want to put the cart before the horse."

"I do feel optimistic about the work the sheriff's association is doing to get this bill passed," Giddens said, referring to Senate Bill 329. The proposal would increase fees in a district court civil action from \$27 to \$75 and in circuit court civil actions from \$60-\$160 to \$500-\$1,000.

The fee increases in district court are allocated to the sheriffs' departments. The increases in circuit court are split between the sheriffs' (80 percent) and clerks' (20 percent) offices to be used exclusively for staffing. The bill was passed by the Senate Monday and is now with the House of Representatives.

Giddens said the starting salary for law enforcement or correctional officers is \$28,234. The proposed cut is \$202,000 to the law enforcement side of the budget.

Cuts also are proposed to the master deputy

program, a plan that gets more money for experienced officers. "They're trying to put pressure on the counties to pick up their shortfall," the sheriff said. "Some places just don't have it."

11th-Hour Effort To Save Some STAR Transit Routes Fails

Three Accomack supervisors failed Wednesday to convince their colleagues to support keeping all STAR Transit routes running through June, the end of the fiscal year.

Supervisor Wanda Thornton, who represents Chincoteague, said buses should keep going to areas north of Nelsonia. She opposes a plan to stop those runs in mid-March because of low usage.

Runs will be increased in the central part of the Shore, but will be also discontinued in southern-most Northampton County.

"This board appropriated money

(\$6,745) until July 1," Thornton said. She made a motion for the supervisors to ask the Accomack-Northampton Transportation District Commission (ANTDC) to direct the new transit management to continue those runs until then. Thornton said money for the next year would be discussed during the budget process.

She complained that a student who lives on Chincoteague won't be able to graduate without the service. Other residents, one with a brain injury trying to get to an Onancock program from New Church, also have protested.

Chairwoman Laura Belle Gordy

and Supervisor Donald Hart voted with Thornton.

"We spent the taxpayers' money," said Gordy. "Why did they reduce fares?"

"Not serving half of the county certainly won't do it," said Thornton. "They're cutting back to 50 cents; why not charge the dollar? This is an issue of fairness. We're never going to agree."

Hart said it would actually cost only \$3,400 to run through July 1.

Supervisors Steve Mallette, Ron Wolff and Phil McCaleb serve on the ANTDC. They held firm that the transit needs to take the meas-

ures to survive.

"They looked at it carefully," said Mallette. "It's tough love ... we had major, major problems" with the system, including "personnel issues, safety issues, ramps that weren't being maintained. They weren't checking to see if drivers had CDL licenses."

Mallette said it costs \$350 a day for the run. He estimated that with only one to four people riding, the cost would be about \$70 each.

"Door-to-door pickup is a thing of the past," said McCaleb. "That is one of the key problems. ... This is not ..."

High winds created a sand-blasting effect for those who ventured past the dune line at Cape Charles beach Saturday. High seas all but obliterated the rocky breakwater that extends outward to protect the harbor and beachfront. With snowflakes falling, temperatures hovering at freezing and water temperatures in the 30s, three dozen daring souls made a mad dash from the beach to the chilly water of the Chesapeake Bay, all in the name of helping those less fortunate.

This year, six teams and four individuals made up the group taking the dip in the bay. The

team from Northampton High School raised the most for the cause by turning in \$1,627. The team from Eastern Shore Community College brought in an additional \$1,042 and won a prize for best costumes that included Victorian attire as well as one that could pass as a very large rubber ducky.

Defendants Reply to Burdiss Lawsuit

Cape Charles Wetlands Board Member Scott R. Walker Jr. says he was wrongly accused of besmirching the reputation of Town Councilman John W. Burdiss.

Burdiss made that charge in a lawsuit filed late last year in Northampton Circuit Court.

Walker entered a motion Tuesday requesting that Burdiss pay "attorney's fees and costs to defend against this baseless suit. He should be sanctioned accordingly."

"There are only two possible conclusions to be drawn from plaintiff's actions," Walker's motion states. "Either he conducted a reasonable investigation, knew defendant Walker had not defamed him and filed the complaint simply to harass, or plaintiff failed to conduct a reasonable investigation ... prior to filing the suit."

Burdiss, an attorney who joined Cape Charles Town Council in July 2006, filed the complaint against four town residents. He claims they marred his reputation when they circulated petitions and attempted to have him removed from Town Council by alleging he acted improperly.

He is asking for a total of \$600,000 in damages and that a petition asking for his removal be expunged from court records.

"So far it's (the lawsuit) cost me \$31,000" said Walker. "I ran against him for Town Council four years ago ... he's playing hard ball."

Burdiss filed his complaint against Walker, a Washington Street resident; Cape Charles Planning Commissioner Joan L. Natali of Blue Heaven Road; Karen Jolly Davis, a former town planning commissioner of Randolph Avenue; and Lenora Mitchell-Fields of Tazewell Avenue.

Burdiss said in the court document that the four "formulated and carried out a plan" to have him removed because his decisions and actions "displeased" them. The lawyer said they were motivated by "personal spite, ill-will and malice."

"I think he's just trying to be the alpha male of Cape Charles," Walker said this week. "He's capable, he's conscientious," Walker said of Burdiss. "He wants it his way or the highway. Someone has to push back ... I'm a bachelor ... and can afford it" more than the others.

Walker said he "never circulated a petition to any citizen of Cape Charles and did not draft, compile, publish or circulate the list of grievances." He "never even signed the petition himself. In fact, the first time," Walker said, he "saw the petition with the attached documents was when he read the plaintiff's complaint."

Walker speculated that Burdiss named him

because he spoke during a public participation session of a council meeting in February 2009. Walker admitted asking those who might sign the petitions to see him or Natali. "I had seen the blank forms but not the attachments," Walker continued. "In reality I thought better of it" and never participated.

Burdiss led the move to fire Town Manager Joe Vaccaro, Walker said, adding that he was opposed.

Walker said the lawyer would have to prove collusion and enmity with intent to defame. "That's tough to prove, said Walker. "He has no evidence of that. All four of us were individually acting."

Burdiss said (in the lawsuit) that the four residents allegedly filed a petition in the court and the action adversely affected his job as a lawyer and expert witness.

He claims they discussed their plans and grievances against him on various occasions, including a Town Council meeting.

Natali, Walker and Mitchell-Fields distributed the petitions, according to the lawsuit. It listed reasons why Burgiss should be recalled. All four "repeatedly, openly and notoriously published the recall petitions despite their knowl-

edge" that they "contained numerous false and defamatory statements," Burdiss charged.

Mitchell-Fields answered the suit saying she "was not involved in formulating and carrying

out a plan to have Burdiss recalled as a member of the Town Council" or in a plan "that resulted in the publication of defamatory falsehoods to residents of Cape Charles and others. Fields had no motivation to harm Burdiss in any way."

According to Mitchell-Fields' response, she "signed a petition at the request of Natali and agreed to circulate a petition." She also admitted to obtaining 25 signatures on one petition "and started another which was left at Sullivan's Office Supply for Natali to pick up."

Mitchell-Fields said she "had no knowledge that the attachments to the recall petitions were false and defamatory and believed the statements to be accurate."

Mitchell-Fields also said the petition caused no harm to Burdiss and that the recording of the document was performed by office personnel in the court.

Walker filed an objection to Burdiss' complaint. He said the lawyer "failed to join all necessary parties to this lawsuit. As such this court cannot render a valid judgment."

In addition, Walker said Burdiss did not name the exact words spoken or written and "failed to specify all of the alleged defamatory statements which is necessary to correctly pleaded a viable cause of action."

In her response, Davis denied discussing plans to recall Burdiss or to "defame his reputation."

Davis admitted criticizing Burdiss at the January 2009 Town Council meeting regarding his participation "in votes and discussion of projects before the council for companies which were represented by his wife ... her criticism was accurate in as the county attorney had come to the same conclusion that Burdiss had a conflict of interest. She also criticized two other members ... Stephen Bennett and Bruce Evans."

Davis said the first time she saw that her speech was attached to the petition was at Sullivan's business where she "immediately protested." Her answer said she was told it was a matter of public record. Davis also said she did not initiate, distribute or file the recall petitions. She said she has no knowledge regarding the court action alleged in Burdiss' complaint and asked that all claims against her be dismissed and that Burdiss be sanctioned.

Natali asked that the case be dismissed as the complaint failed to state a cause of action under Virginia law. She said there were insufficient facts and Burdiss failed to set forth "any statements or conduct on the part of Natali that exhibited a reckless disregard for the truth."



Accomack Cancels Most of Spring Break

Accomack Public Schools will remain open through the majority of spring break to make up for days missed due to recent bad weather.

On Tuesday night, the School Board accepted Superintendent Rick Bull's plan to conduct classes on March 29, 30 and 31 and April 1. A three-day weekend starting April 2 still will be offered.

"Land is pretty saturated, ditches are up," said Bull. "I'm worried

about missing more time."

School Board member Patricia White noted that schools in Virginia Beach "decided to add 20 minutes to their day."

Bull nixed that notion. "We need to be in school. Children have to learn a tremendous amount." He said with four schools with Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) issues, I just think we need to be in school."

Bull was also against asking the state for a reprieve. "The govern-

ment did not close Accomack County Schools," he said. "I don't see asking for a waiver. We closed the schools here. We need to be in school so our students can learn."

"We need time now, not in June," Chairman Al McMath agreed. "You know we have the writing test coming up the 1st of March."

"We will work with the folks who made arrangements" for use of time-shares, cruises and airline tickets, Bull continued.

a taxi service. It's a bus service."

Mallette said students needing rides from northern areas to the former M.N. Smith School in Accomac were kicked out of regular classes.

"They can drive themselves, ride a bike, get parents to take them ... it's not the responsibility of STAR Transit," Wolff said.

Hart was offended by implications that he was irresponsible when serving on the ANTDC. "Someone was watching it (STAR Transit) for 18 years," he said. "The state came every month and said



Cape Charles Extends 'No Wake'

At its meeting last Thursday, Cape Charles Town Council extended the "No Wake Zone" in the town harbor as recommended by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF).

The original "No Wake Zone" had covered just the area around the inner harbor and the public boat ramp. The new "No Wake Zone" extends from the town's gravel dock southwest to an area near the northeast property line of Bayshore Concrete. The DGIF indicated that when the new docking facilities and breakwater projects are installed, the town might ask for a review of the "No Wake Zone," with an eye to expanding it.

Council also amended its current code and zoning ordinance to authorize the town to withhold permits, variances, and other zoning requests until delinquent taxes and fees have been paid.

Town Manager Heather Arcos announced that the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) is reviewing a request to lower the speed limit to 25 miles per hour on

Old Cape Charles Road (Route 642).

Arcos and Councilman Larry Veber praised members of Cape Charles Fire Department for their quick response and assistance when a tree fell on a home during the recent winter storm.


Public Works Director Dave Fauber announced that the town would be receiving a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) assistance grant to help repair the fishing pier and boardwalk damaged in the November nor'easter.

Valentine Evans and Town Planner Tom Bonadeo proposed installing a plaque to recognize the Rosenwald School, part of a rural school building program was a major effort to improve public education for African Americans in the

early 20th-century south. The Cape Charles Rosenwald school began in 1928 and was built for just over \$19,000 on three acres north of town. The school had four teachers with multiple grades in each classroom.

The Rosenwald project began in 1912 when Booker T. Washington approached Julius Rosenwald, president of Sears, Roebuck and Company, with the idea. Ultimately, the Julius Rosenwald Foundation provided seed grants for construction of more than 5,300 buildings in 15 states. While most of the schools were of wood construction and have long since disappeared, the Cape Charles school was built of brick and stands today. The property passed into private hands in 1968 and has been vacant since the late 1970s. The plaque project is estimated to cost \$1,350.





The snow caused many delays and inconveniences for the commonwealth last week, but we continue to persevere in the General Assembly. This

week, I would like to highlight three bills I am carrying, all of which I think will make a positive impact on the commonwealth.

The first is a SB626, a bill that I am co-patroning with Sen. Jill Vogel (R-Fauquier) and Sen. Creigh Deeds (D-Bath). This legislation would allow a seven-member bipartisan redistricting commission, rather than the Senate and House of Delegates, to oversee the drawing of political boundaries. The bill has been reported

unanimously out of the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections and will likely pass the full Senate. Bipartisan redistricting would ensure that elections in Virginia are more competitive, reduce gerrymandering of districts, and make our elected officials more accountable to the public. Unfortunately, a similar measure has already failed in the House of Delegates, and with redistricting coming up next year, I urge you all to contact your delegate and emphasize the importance of fair and competitive districts.

The second, SB186, makes changes to the General Assembly Ethics Review Panels. The bill, which has been reported out of the Senate Rules Committee and will be presented to the full Senate, would bring much needed transparency and public accountability to the investigation of ethics violations by elected officials in the commonwealth.

Finally, SB652, which has passed the Senate Committee on Education and Health, would create educational guidelines for youth athletes on brain injuries, and require medical evaluation of children who have sustained concussions, before they can return to play. I believe this is very timely, given the problems we have seen with football players recently, and as a doctor, I think we need to do more to protect the long-term health of our children.

Cross-over week in the General Assembly has brought lengthy floor sessions and thick calendars. Some of the more controversial measures seem to languish until the final

days, and the budget, of course, continues to occupy center stage as indications begin to emerge from the governor's office about the types of additional cuts he will be promoting. Of the approximately \$1.5 billion in additional budget reductions, a significant portion appears to be coming from K-12 education through a reduction in state commitment to funding for the Standards of Quality. This is a very serious and

significant policy change which could have ramifications for several years. In the early 1990s during a significant recession, higher education bore the brunt of significant budgetary reductions in place of a tax increase. It took a decade or more for higher education to recover the ground lost. The unfortunate thing about reductions in K-12 funding, is that the effects are not immediate but rather take years to realize.


I continue to be amazed at the issues which generate controversy and concern here. While we always have issues of great importance, such as discussions on the death penalty and issues involving guns, we can become just as wrapped up over issues such as the regulation of the kitchen grease industry. We spent a significant amount of time in an Agriculture sub-committee last week debating a bill which sought to bring a self-regulating scheme to the kitchen grease industry and reduce theft. A bill involving cap-and-trade (which is not really a state issue) was disposed of in about a third of the time.

An even larger point in this discussion is

that while those "hot-button" issues generate a lot of news reports, at this level of government, it is issues such as overweight trucks, speed on our highways, conservation easements and health insurance mandates that have real and immediate impact on people's lives. While most folks seem somewhat unsure about the role of state government, most of what we do involves those everyday issues where divisions and disagreements seldom fall along party lines. I continually receive e-mails about Social Security, Medicare, cap-and-trade and, of course, health care reform because of all the national media attention on those issues. Our 100th District constituents assume we must be dealing with those issues here in Richmond.






