Jailers Fired for Alleged Misconduct

Two Northampton County deputies working as correctional officers at the Eastern Shore Regional Jail were fired last week for having "inappropriate contact with of one of the female inmates."

Sheriff Jack Robbins identified the correctional officers as Wayne H. Shrieves and Leston E. Wright Jr. He said both men had worked in the jail for two to three years. When allegations were made, the sheriff said he "promptly had the matter investigated." That inquiry "revealed evidence of improper sexual contact with a female inmate on separate occasions by both employees, which led to their termination."

Robbins said he expects felony charges to be certified against the former jailers when the Northampton Grand Jury meets next month. The sheriff said he learned about the incident on Friday, Feb. 12, and an investigation began the following Monday. The two officers did not work in the meantime. He fired the men on Feb. 17.

Shrieves and Wright "were trained and certified by the Department of Criminal Justice Services of Virginia," according to Robbins.

The sheriff said the inmate was Kelly Bynum. The 23-year-old Belle Haven woman had been sentenced in Northampton Circuit Court in October to a total of three and a half years for two counts of assaulting a police officer, grand larceny, two counts of third-offense larceny and identity theft. Robbins said the charges of assault involved jail deputies.

The sheriff said he would give more information, but he "didn't want to hamper any court proceeding." He further stated, "I'm proud of my staff and where we are as a department. However, this type of activity is unacceptable and will not be tolerated."

Parksley Man Convicted of Involuntary Manslaughter

Charges against a Parksley man accused of killing a college student from Temperanceville last year were reduced Thursday in Accomack Circuit Court when a plea bargain was accepted.

Kendrick Di'ke Duffy, 18, was indicted in October on counts of murder and use of a firearm in a felony in connection with the Aug.

16, 2009, shooting death of Bobby Oneal Ballard, 20, of Saxis Road.

In an agreement with Commonwealth's Attorney Gary R. Agar, the murder indictment was knocked down to involuntary manslaughter in exchange for Duffy's guilty plea. Agar also said he would not prosecute the firearms count. The attor-

Options Offered To Slash Budget

Accomack County supervisors sharpened their budget axes Monday as they heard options for slicing expenses to the tune of more than \$1 million to balance the new budget and even provide a surplus.

Finance Director Mike Mason outlined cuts which would make up approximately \$445,000 in the proposed fiscal year 2010-11 budget.

These include eliminating town tipping-fee waivers at the landfill, saving the county \$135,000; cutting the county's contribution to volunteer fire and rescue squads by half, saving \$130,000; eliminating the county's \$41,000 contribution to Eastern Shore Community College; deferring construction of a limited-service convenience center, saving \$69,000; and reducing grants to the airport and Health Department by \$27,000.

Though no action was taken on the options presented by Mason, the supervisors then met for a twohour closed meeting to discuss another \$845,000 in cuts related to personnel.

When the supervisors reconvened in open session, County Administrator Steve Miner acknowledged that they had requested various figures before voting on the options. A meeting to do just that will be held in an unusual Saturday session tomorrow necessitated by state budget deadlines.

If all the options presented Monday are approved, Accomack County's proposed budget will reflect a surplus of close to \$600,000, but state revenues, a huge source of funding for the county, remain very uncertain. However, whereas the county had expected to lose several positions in the Sheriff's Department, Gov. Bob McDonnell's budget would cut that loss to two or three, which are already vacant in Accomack.

Northampton Supervisors Agree to Procedural Guidelines, Discuss Budget

At its meeting Monday, the Northampton County Board of Supervisors finally reached agreement and approved its operating manual.

Areas of contention had included the section regarding media relations, dates for meetings, and the use of Robert's Rules of Order.

Supervisors Willie Randall and Sam Long Jr. suggested modifying or removing the Media Relations section. Randall noted that as supervisors, they were capable of knowing how to properly deal with the media without having to have written guidelines. Long suggested changing the meeting night of the work sessions to the fourth Monday of each month since he would be unable to attend if it continued to be held on the fourth Tuesday. Supervisor Richard Tankard noted that the fourth Monday is also the meeting date for Nassawadox Town Council and asked that occasionally arrangements be made to switch the work sessions so he can attend some Nassawadox Town Council meetings. In the end, the supervisors agreed to accept the operating manual and included portions of the media relations segment, moved their work sessions to the fourth Monday of the

month and modified the Robert's Rules to include the need of a second for motions brought before the supervisors.

In other actions of the evening, the supervisors discussed budget amendments for the school system. School Finance Director Brook Thomas reported that the school staff is preparing the 2010-11 budget which is due to the supervisors in April. Thomas noted that they are still waiting to see how the governor's proposed budget, which calls for extensive cuts to public education, will affect local school systems.

In other business, Randall initiated a discussion on the appointments to the Community Services Board (CSB). Former Supervisor J.T. Holland stated that an agreement with Accomack County calls for a nine-member board, with three members coming from Northampton County, selected from each of the three magisterial districts. At present, two of the members are from Eastville District, with Franktown District not being represented. Chairman Larry Trala has asked that the county attorney research the legality of having two representatives from one magisterial district on the CSB.

Durrell Lilliston, 24, of Bloxom was was found guilty in Accomack County Circuit Court of burglary. According to Commonwealth's Attorney Gary Agar, sentencing was deferred until guidelines are provided.

Victor Dana Jr., 29, of Onancock was found guilty of breaking and entering and grand larceny. Sentencing was deferred until a presentence report is prepared.

ney recommended that Duffy be sentenced to 10 years in prison, with all but five years and eight months suspended. The defendant could also be fined up to \$2,500.

Judge Glen A. Tyler accepted the arrangement. He deferred sentencing pending completion of a presentence report. Sentencing is expected in April.

Tyler, Agar, Investigator Gerald Goga of the Accomack Sheriff's Department and defense lawyer Thomas Northam watched a video of the crime taken by cameras at the Royal Farms at Fisher's Corner. The group huddled around the judge's bench as the tape was shown on a laptop computer.

Evidence showed that men in a car with Ballard assaulted those in another car with Duffy and attempted to take the car keys to keep them from leaving the scene. Ballard was not involved in the altercation.


"Three seconds" after the car with Duffy drove away from the fight, the defendant sat on the ledge of the passenger's window and shot at the other group, Agar told the court. He said the victim, who was sitting in the back seat of the other car, was hit in the head with a 32-caliber bullet.

Agar justified the plea bargain by saying that because the shooting occurred so quickly after the assault, "heat of passion" was involved.

Agar said despite the lowered charge, the loss to Ballard's parents "is just as great ... something has to be said about young people carrying guns." Instead, he said they should be going out and "enjoying life. Bobby Oneal Ballard was truly an innocent victim here."

Ballard, who was in his third year of college, would have turned 21 this week.

"It is clear that the legal analysis is correct," said Tyler. "Self-defense would have been difficult to prove since they were moving away ... malicious murder (was not applicable) because it was seconds later," Tyler said, agreeing with Agar's description of a crime of passion.



School Repairs Pondered

Needed repairs to the three county schools and the prospect of a very lean budget loom over the heads of Northampton School Board members.

Superintendent Dr. Richard Bowmaster noted last week that the roofs of both elementary schools need immediate attention. Leaks at Kiptopeke Elementary have led one classroom to be closed. In addition, the ongoing issue of an aging wall at the high school forces the question of how much to spend on the 56-year-old structure. Board Chairperson Kristin Webb raised the question of how much should be spent to make a temporary repair to the sagging cafeteria wall when the county really needs to be thinking about building a new middle/high school complex. One proposal for the wall is to add a series of braces at a cost of \$150,000, while a second is to replace the wall at a cost of \$350,000. At present, for safety reasons, the room is not used when winds exceed 45 miles per hour.



Also this week, Gov. McDonnell announced his proposals for balancing the state budget. Though he remains true to his pledge of not raising taxes, his suggestions include massive cuts to public education, services for the poor and elderly, and the state healthcare safety net.

While it is necessary to reduce some spending in order to close the commonwealth's budget gap, these proposed actions would disproportionately harm those most in need of our help in these difficult economic times.

Further, it is estimated that instituting these cuts would result in the layoff of an estimated 23,000 school employees and thousands more healthcare workers. In this period of record high unemployment, I strongly believe that putting even more people out of work is bad public policy. Job retention is essential to helping our economy rebound, and leading to job growth in the future. I urge you to read over the governor's proposals for yourself, and to contact all of your elected officials to voice your opinion. I have heard from many of you about this already, and everyone who has contacted me is opposed to these cuts. I would welcome input from anyone who has other views, as hearing from both sides helps me better represent all of you.

n Sunday, Feb. 21, the House Appropriations Committee voted on its version of the budget. By the time you read this, we will be on the verge of voting on the House of Dele-

gates' version of the budget. Similarly, the Senate Finance Committee will be constructing its version of the state's budget. The two conflicting budget bills will then head to a committee of conference. Speaker of the House Bill Howell appoints the conferees for the House of Delegates, and the chairman of the Senate Finance Committee appoints the Senate conferees. It is always an intense negotiation but in this environment even more so. Gov. McDonnell's thoughts on the budget will most likely be represented in the House version of the budget since his party is in control of the House.

As you all know from my prior reports and our town hall meetings, this train has been traveling down the track for some time, given the extreme economic crisis in which our country finds itself. No matter what the final version, the budget will be austere. We have been fortunate in Virginia, where our pro-business/low-tax environment, along with our proximity to the growth in the Washington, D.C., suburbs and the military presence in Hampton Roads and a strong port, have led to robust economic growth, while maintaining a relatively low tax burden. The recent shock to the economic system of our country was more than our strong state economy could overcome. Therefore, we have experienced an unparalleled shrinkage in Virginia's economy and revenues.

Specific items of contention between the House and Senate are likely to be the continuation of car tax relief, which was capped years ago at a cost of \$950 million. The size and scope of the cuts promoted by Gov. McDonnell and likely reflected in the House budget for K-12 public education, some \$730 million, are also likely to be a topic of intense discussion. Cuts of \$300 million to healthcare, in particular Medicaid and our

Community Services Boards, have been suggested. Virginia is 48th in the country in its level of Medicaid reimbursements and has one of the strictest Medicaid Qualification requirements in the country. Deeper cuts in the area of public safety are being avoided by an extensive increase in filing fees for lawsuits. Our state's employee retirement system will be under review. One bright spot is the relatively modest reductions in higher education, which includes our community colleges, simply because they have borne the brunt of prior cuts. I further anticipate the suggestion of a series of significant fee increases.

There are no easy answers. We also need to remember the difference between government spending and investment. A good deal of what government does is invest so that, as in the private sector, we can reap the benefits and build for our future, particularly in the area of education. That is why Virginia has heretofore had such a robust economy, nationally recognized public education, and a relatively low tax burden.

We must vote on the final budget by the time we adjourn at noon Saturday, March 13. As we have all learned in recent years, it will be possible to extend the session or return for a Special Session.

County Consultant Sounds Off

Dear Editor:

At first I was going to say: "I'm sorry" for what I am about to write. But then I decided I am not sorry. I am not sorry for calling on people to think before they speak, and in some cases, speak not all you think. And above all, if you have something to say, stop the nastiness. Comments like "useless employees" have no positive value. In fact, they are demeaning, derogatory, baseless, mean-spirited and flat-out rude.

We all have the right to express our opinions and our thoughts, as it should always be. However, we also have a responsibility to be rational, reasonable, courteous and knowledgeable.

Before you exercise your right to speak, be sure what you have to say has some basis of fact; or is supported by some sense of rationality. For example: Last year, when the early drafts of the County budget were published, a writer to a local paper claimed the budget was "the most ridiculous budget ever produced." Yes, it was the writer's opinion, but the reality of it was the writer never read the budget, or any budget that preceded the one he referred to. The writer knew nothing of the process that, in many ways, dictates what must be in the budget and what cannot be in a budget. The writer knew nothing of the enormous effort county employees put into preparation of that budget. The writer's opinion was irrational, mean-spirited and of no value whatsoever. In fact, it was harmful to the morale of those who worked hard to put the budget in order.

For those who simply claim: "Get the FAT out of the budget," I suggest they go one step farther and communicate exactly where they believe the FAT to be, and offer some factual support for their claim. People who have never set foot inside any county office, and have absolutely no knowledge of the day-to-day operations of any department, have little basis for claiming there is FAT in the budget.

In a recent letter to the editor, a gentleman suggested the county "get rid of the useless employees in the Planning Department." This gentleman, by his own words, has "limited knowledge" of county operations and finance. Yet this gentleman felt justified to publicly demean county employees. Does he know that before the Planning Department was properly staffed, the county was paying its director to type his own letters and make Post Office runs, when he had to log in 60 to 70 hours a week in an attempt not to fall too far behind the demanding workload. Does he know that at that same time, the state was threatening to fine the county hundreds of thousands of dollars for not

conducting erosion and sediment inspections in a timely manner? Does he know that the county did not have anyone on staff qualified to conduct those inspections? Would it make sense to eliminate a \$50,000 position when that position helps bring in \$200,000 of revenue, or avoid severe penalties for not conducting state-required work? Voice your opinion, but a valued opinion is supported by some knowledge and understanding of the situation you write about.

For those who suggest we eliminate the County Attorney's Office, do you know how much it was costing for legal advice BEFORE

we had a county attorney? Do you realize the disadvantage of using an attorney who does not specialize in municipal government? Do you know how many issues must be dealt with on a daily basis that

require the concentrated and knowledgeable efforts of a municipal attorney? Best you find out before you hastily call for the abolition of the County Attorney's Office.

For those who call for the dismantling of the Economic Development Office, have you considered the projected benefits emanating from that office's efforts? Potentially 600 new jobs; \$4 million in new tax revenue.

For those who support "NO INCREASE IN TAXES...ABSOLUTELY NOT," do you know that Accomack County has one of the lowest tax rates in the entire commonwealth? Do you give thought to the fact that the "cost of doing business" continually increases? How is the County to deal with those rising costs? The private sector will raise prices. Municipalities must, at least, consider raising taxes. The "NO NEW TAXES" supporters would have the county cut current services and staff. Eventually there will be very limited services. But you will have plenty to complain about. You will not get your building permit in the timeframe you would like it. You will not get your inspections scheduled when you want. You will not get your Certificate of Occupancy when you would like it.

You will wait in very long lines to pay your taxes. Road and ditch maintenance will take a great deal longer. And this kind of municipality will not attract new businesses, which would provide jobs and help to abate the tax burden.

One writer, in response to a local paper's inquiry on how to save money, suggested county employees are always on vacation. One has to wonder if that writer takes any vacation. Are they really denying vacation time for county employees? Is that rational? County employees already are foregoing salary increases at the same time their contribution to benefit costs

> are increasing. And why should 280 county employees bear the entire burden of the budget gap? Why would it not be more equitable for that burden to be spread over the thousands of county taxpayers? We all

benefit from the services provided by the coun-

How many in the community realize that the financial difficulties are largely the effect of the state's severe reductions in funding to the local municipalities.

A 2-cent tax increase on a property assessed for \$200,000 would result in an additional \$38 a year in taxes. There is not one taxpayer in Accomack County who can honestly say he or she cannot afford 73 cents a week; money that would close the \$700,000 budget gap and avoid the need to put a number of county employees out of work. And remember, the Sheriff's Office and School System dilemma is totally the result of the state's significant reduction in funding.

Write your letters to your state representatives. Continue to offer your opinions and suggestions. Do the best you can to be knowledgeable of the issues you comment on. And certainly know, there is no value to nasty or meanspirited language.
