Northampton Moves Ahead With Improvement Project

Northampton County supervisors moved forward Tuesday with a decision to renovate the current administration building and the former courthouse.

Supervisor Spencer Murray stated that county financial advisers have recommended that though finances are tight, it would be unwise to forgo the renovations and use the funds that had been set aside for the proposed work.

Speaking for the firm of DJG Engineering Architects Planners, Dan DeYoung outlined a plan whereby the current county administration building would gain office space, the 1899 courthouse would be renovated and the now vacant 1914 jail would receive \$200,000 worth of cosmetic repairs. According to DeYoung, the construction budget for the project would be just over \$3 million.

Murray noted that the money for the project had been borrowed along with funds to cover other capital improvement projects, such as the current courthouse and sheriff's office.

Supervisor Sam Long spoke in opposition to the plan, indicating a need to reduce the county's debt.

The supervisors voted 4-1 (Long dissenting) to proceed with the project. Supervisor Willie Randall was absent. The renovations are expected to begin in May of this year and be completed in less than two years. During that time, most county offices will be moved to the former middle school in Machipongo.

Yorktown attorney James Elliott, who has been contracted to work with the Treasurer's Office to recover delinquent taxes, responded to concerns raised recently. Elliott explained the process whereby he is sent a list of those property owners who owe back taxes and when appropriate, conducts sales of the property to help recover

funds for the county.

Supervisor Richard Tankard questioned the procedure by which Treasurer Ilva James works out payment plans to assist those who owe taxes. Commonwealth's Attorney Bruce Jones noted that once the names of all who owe taxes, including those on a payment plan are provided to Elliott, the Treasurer's Office can stop action by Elliott only after he has filed suit against the property owners.

Long complained that once the process is in motion, the information becomes public, thus harming property owners who are making restitution to the county.

Supervisor Oliver Bennett said James needs to be allowed to do her job without being micro-managed by the board. "I want to collect as many back taxes as possible but I don't want to do her job for her," he said.

On a vote of 3-2 (Tankard and Murray voting no), the board agreed to allow the Treasurer's Office to continue as it has regarding the handling of delinquent taxes.

County Administrator Katie Nunez told the board that representatives from the county's four towns had expressed concerns that the county will have more voting power than the towns once the Public Service Authority (PSA) is operational.

Murray and Tankard noted that the county should be the controlling factor since more people live in the county than in the towns. Said Tankard, "The county cannot be a minority member on the PSA." Tankard went on to state that the things that the PSA would want to put into place would be paid for by the County rather than the Towns.

Murray noted that the PSA would be assuming the debt for the current wastewater systems in the county.

Chairman Larry Trala did not see it that way. "The towns and the county are all players in this and

Teen Killed in Crash

A 17-year-old girl was the first to die on Eastern Shore roads in 2010.

Sgt. J.P. Koushel said Brittany Shrieves, who recently moved to Virginia Beach from the Shore, was killed in a single car collision at around 11:40 p.m. Saturday.

Shrieves had left a party and was driving on Route 605 (Upshur Neck Road) in Quinby when "she ran off the road to the right, overcorrected, ran off the road to the left, hit a tree and was ejected," the sergeant said.

The former Nandua High School student died at the scene. She was not wearing a seatbelt. Alcohol is suspected to be a factor in the fatal accident. The car Shrieves was driving belongs to her aunt, Audrey Thompson of Painter, Koushel added.

Facebook Provides Outlet for Comments About Our Area

More than 300 Tangier Island residents and fans are taking advantage of the online social network facebook.com to post ideas about improving the island's economy.

And in a matter of days, "the official Eastern Shore of Virginia" facebook page got more than 2,400 fans. It sports the motto, "There is no Life West of the Chesapeake Bay." Topics under that heading include the Walmart being built in Onley; how to cook clam fritters, haymans and sweet potato biscuits; and where the best meals were served back in the day.

Chincoteague Island's facebook has more than 1,100 members. A link to Assateague tells about storm damage this winter, fishing reports and even a job opening. Friends are reconnecting to long-lost loved ones and acquaintances.

And what's the major appeal? Reminiscing.

"Good Ole Eastern Shore of Virginia, my hometown and my old stomping ground," wrote Pat Watkinson Mears. "Great place to still claim where I grew up. Good memories, nothing like it!!!"

"Three things I remember from my granny: her ice tea, cucumbers marinated in vinegar and pepper and sweet relish," commented Ben Butler.

"Onancock Carnival, I miss you so," said Jillian Rajevich.

James Stone spent summers in Justisville. "My grandparents had the store/post office," he recalled. "There is a special place in my heart for the Shore."

Nicole Spivey said, "I used to love Pappy's. We went there every

Friday night. My friends and I used to have birthday parties there too. We always got the big booth in the back."

The page called "Tangier Pride" announced the cancellation of a meeting due to bad weather. "With snow on the ground and more promised, the Feb. 12 meeting on Tangier's economic future was postponed. It will be March 18 at Accomack County Airport in Melfa ... this gives more time for your ideas on improving island economy. Keep 'em coming!"

John Pruitt wrote about Tangier yard art: A propeller from my father's boat, mounted by my son as my yard art. Each time I see it, it reminds me of my roots and how much Dad loved his grandson, Todd, and vice versa. It teaches me, too, that there's so much beauty at Tangier — simple beauty that could be part of our economic future."

Ashley Crockett is "writing a scholarly essay on Tangier's religious history. Have any ideas for a primary source?" she asked.

The historical photos are awesome. Ruth Gehr offered two from "A Day in the Life of Tangier Island 1951" and a link to an article about Vernon Bradshaw.

"I'm not sure what the future holds for Tangier but I do hope and pray it is a promising one!" said Gehr. "The island is so rich in history. I never really realized how much so until my adulthood. Researching Tangier back in the British and Colonial times has been so rewarding. I (am) also

learning about life on Watts Island and Upperds."

"The name 'Tangier Pride' would be a great name to market!" she continued. "Known for shipping the BEST food products all over! I've read that there is some cake shipping going on over at Smith Island. Why not Tangier's Chesapeake House pound cake or corn pudding? I would order products from 'Tangier Pride'!! We are in the age of Internet. What a PLUS that is!"

Richard Fravel suggested the island have crabbing cruises. "Show tourists what it is all about." It's an "opportunity to get the word out about our watermen's woes. T-shirt idea — 'I'm a Tangier Crabber' or 'It Doesn't Get any Crabrier than Tangier.'"

"That is being done now and has been for past couple years by Deny Crockett, owner of Chesapeake House, and James Eskridge, Tangier Mayor," wrote Danny R. McCready.

"I believe the first agenda should be a seawall for the island," wrote Carol Pruitt-Moore. "These past storms have really taken a toll on the shorelines ... if we don't soon get a seawall, not only will there be no economic future but NO future for Tangier."

Donald Thorne Jr. wrote, "We have a little marsh left heading north of Tangier on the west side. We need a jetty there now. People, we need your help. If this goes, so does Tangier Creek."

"I am concerned specifically about the need for a jetty at the

western entrance to stem the wave action inside the harbor," wrote Dan Eskridge. "I was amazed at how rough it can get at Parks Marina. If Tangier loses its sheltered harbor, the island is lost."

"Dan hit the nail right on the head; we need to protect our harbor first," agreed Chuck Pruitt.

Travis Beatty said, "Focus on turning Tangier Island into a weekly vacation destination similar to what Ocracoke Island, Baldhead Island and others have done. Also market the island's airport in magazines around the DC-Baltimore-Richmond area. I once waited a table in which the two gentlemen that I served started talking about Tangier and how their CEO would fly people."

"How about a shellfish hatchery owned and operated by Tangier folks?" suggested Tommy Leggett. "Tangier has good, clean Chesapeake Bay water and additional hatchery capacity to produce oyster larvae and seed is needed in Virginia."

The network also solicited funds for the cause. "With a \$5 donation to Tangier Pride, you get a stylish bag with the Tangier Pride logo. The bags are stored at Roland Pruitt's house (891-2394). If you need them mailed, add a couple of dollars, and I'll forward them to you: tangierpride@yahoo.com Every penny comes back to the island for projects."

"It would be great if somehow all of the OLD photos that people have of family members, island scenes, stories, etc. could be published (in a) book," wrote Gehr. "The money made could be put back into the island. They could be sold at the museum. I would buy a book in a heartbeat!"

Accomack Criminal Court

Kerwin Harmon, 29, of Nelsonia was sentenced to five years in prison last week in Accomack Circuit Court for unlawful wounding, according to Commonwealth's Attorney Gary R. Agar. All but a year of the term was suspended and restitution was ordered.

William Giddings, 27, of Parksley was sentenced for burglary to 12 months in jail, with all but three months suspended.

Anthony Dickerson, 43, of Parksley was

sentenced to a total of 24 months for driving after having been declared a habitual offender. He was convicted of two counts and was given 12 month for each.

Sentencing was deferred until a presentence report can be completed for Lisa Hanscom, 47, of Melfa, convicted of embezzlement; Valice Harmon, 27, of Horntown, convicted of distribution of cocaine; Rahiam Hope, 20, of Tasley, found guilty of leaving the scene of an accident and eluding; Christopher Phillips, 27, of Parksley, convicted of grand larceny and obtaining money by false pretenses; and Gary Lee Tyler, 40, of Onancock, convicted of assault and battery of a police officer.

David Harmon, 46, of Temperanceville was convicted of three counts of felony shoplifting. He was sentenced to 12 months for each charge, with all but six months suspended.

Tajuan Nock, 23, of Painter was convicted of misdemeanor obstruction of justice. He was sentenced to 30 days in jail with all suspended.

Ex-Deputies Indicted

Two former Northampton sheriff's deputies were indicted Monday by a county Grand Jury on counts of carnal knowledge of an inmate at Eastern Shore Regional Jail.

The indictments were handed down for Wayne H. Shrieves and Leston E. Wright Jr.

Major David Doughty of the Sheriff's Department said both men were arrested and remain free on \$7,500 unsecured bonds.

The two were fired from their jobs as officers at the jail Feb. 17 after an investigation found "evidence of improper sexual contact with a female inmate on separate occasions by both employees," according to Sheriff Jack Robbins. Shrieves and Wright both worked in the jail for two or three years.

The indictments charge that the offenses occurred between Nov. 17, 2009, and Jan. 13, 2010, while the jailers were "in a position of authority over Kelly Bynum" and "without the use of force, threat or intimidation."

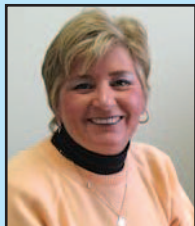
The victim, a 23-year-old Belle Haven woman, was sentenced in Northampton Circuit Court in October to a total of three years and six months for two counts of assaulting a police officer, grand larceny, two counts of third-offense larceny and identity theft. Robbins said the charges of assault involved female jail deputies.

Investigator Michelle Hallett of the sheriff's department investigated the allegations against Shrieves and Wright.

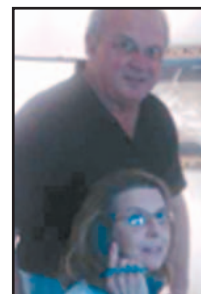

when we all start to work together, it will be good for the entire county," he said, noting that the towns have more infrastructure in place and should have equal representation with the county. Trala argued that the PSA would be paying the bills, not the county.

Former Supervisor David Burden supported Tankard's position on the county's role in the PSA, stating, "The idea of handing over control of the PSA to the towns terrifies me."

No vote was taken on the issue.

Nunez informed the board that her office is working on a list of businesses that will be affected by the new business license enacted in 2009. She said it applies to everyone in the county who operates a business, including professionals, commercial businesses and even those who have lawn-mowing services. The county ordinance does not apply to businesses in Nassawadox, which has its own business license ordinance.

Dr. Drury Stith presented a proposal by Franktown United Methodist Church to expand the Montessori school there to accommodate students up to the age of 9. Currently, the school serves 29 students through age 6. Resident Alex Joyner also spoke in favor of the planned expansion. The board voted to endorse the proposal.

The board took up a discussion on the amount of trash residents could take on one trip to the waste collection centers. Trala and Murray said they have been approached by some residents who want to be allowed to take more household garbage to the centers than the two 30-gallon containers of trash per visit currently allowed. The board agreed to increase the maximum to the equivalent of a dozen 30-gallon bags per visit.

Charles Thain thanked the board for supporting the Tourism Commission. He noted that recently business has improved and he indicated that the efforts to assist tourism had played a role. Additionally, Thain urged the board to increase its funding of the Tourism Commission. Also supporting the move to increase funding for the commission was Pam Barefoot, who credited it with her business' recent 34 percent sales increase. "Invest in this goose so that when it does lay an egg, it will be golden," she said.

In a final action of the evening, Tankard stated his opposition to a Cape Charles boundary adjustment. Tankard noted that Cape Charles currently has a large number of unused building lots in the Bay Creek area and he could not justify moving the town boundary to the highway.

Alice Morehouse, who lives in the Tower Hill subdivision, also spoke in opposition to the plan.

The Town of Cape Charles has not yet made a formal request to the county for a boundary adjustment.

We are getting closer to the end of this session, and are continuing to work diligently on the budget and other legislation before us. I have heard

from many of you during the session, and I truly appreciate your interest and involvement in the affairs of the commonwealth. Two of my bills have been heard in the House of Delegates this week, and were passed unanimously.

SB 189 repeals the date set for expiration

of the Spaceflight Liability and Immunity Act. Repealing this expiration will help to establish the commonwealth as a leader in attracting economic development related to commercial space flight. This is particularly important for growth centered at Wallops Island. SB 193 also passed the House unanimously, and will be sent along to Governor McDonnell for his signature. This bill makes it easier for the commonwealth to terminate the contracts of service providers that commit Medicaid fraud.

Unfortunately, SB 186, which would have improved the process for reviewing ethics violations by General Assembly members, was not passed in the House. Del. Armstrong is patron-

ing a similar bill that has been passed in the House and the Senate. However, my bill included some stronger provisions, and it is a shame that House Republicans, who should be acting on this issue in the wake of the Phil Hamilton scandal last year, decided to carry this legislation over for the year.

Compromise of Northam's Fishing Bill Passes General Assembly

The General Assembly has passed a bipartisan compromise on Sen. Ralph Northam's SB668 to exempt Virginia anglers from having to pay the \$25 fee associated with the federally-mandated National Saltwater Angler Registry. SB668 has been amended to create a state-level angler identification system, similar to the Hunter Identification Program run by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

This solution will allow Virginia to maintain the recreational boat license, as well as the license exemptions for piers, rental boats, senior citizens, and private shoreline. The state program will be administered through the Virginia Marine Resources Commission, and will be paid for through increases of up to \$5 on individual licenses, and up to \$10 on boat li-

censes. Instead of paying the federal government to register, anglers with a Virginia license will be registered automatically, and anglers exempted from Virginia licensing requirements will only have to call in and obtain an identification number free of charge.

"As is the norm with compromises, this one is not perfect," said Northam. "However, it does accomplish the goals of exempting Virginians from federal fees and fines, and also allows us to keep the boat license, as well as all existing license exemptions."

The legislation was introduced in response to a VMRC study that provided options on how Virginia could comply with the federal mandate. The data collected from the new system will improve the quantity and quality of data available to manage fisheries sustain-

ably, and will help prevent the kind of stock collapses that have led to massive job losses, regional economic depressions, and serious environmental effects in the past.

The bill was reported from a conference committee and passed the Senate and House of Delegates on Wednesday. It will now go to Governor McDonnell for his signature.

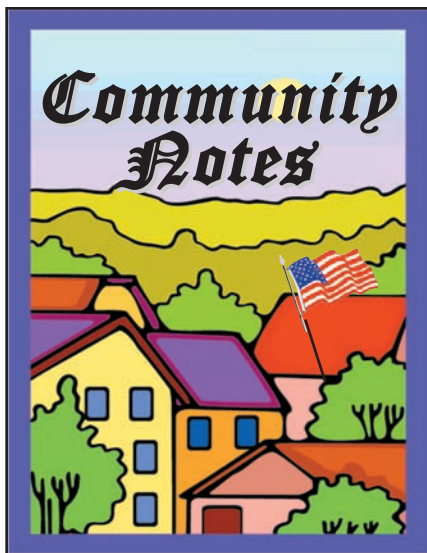

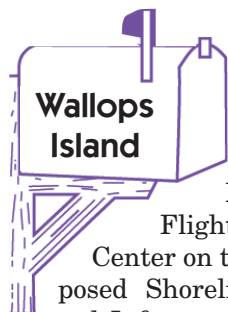

- Use a wheel chock, if available.
- Know your equipment and how to use it.
- Know and locate the proper jack points on the frame. If you don't know, consult your owner's

manual. There's a thin lip that runs along the side of your car. This is where the jack should go.

- Don't jack up a car unless you're on a cement surface. Watch out for soft shoulders and very hot pavement, which may not support the jack.

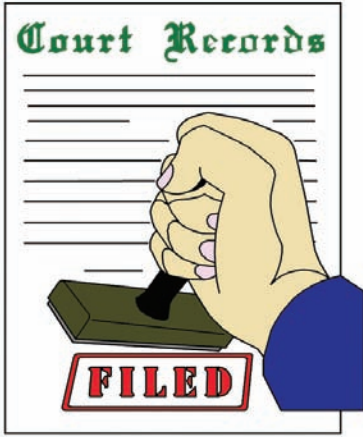

I urge my fellow Virginians to contact their representatives, urging them to work for the bipartisan redistricting plan.
