92ND PONY PENNING GOES OFF WITHOUT A HITCH

A red flare pierced the pale morning sky just before 7 a.m. to signal the beginning of the 92nd annual Pony Swim.

It was one of the earliest swims “in a long, long time,” said Denise Bowden, Chincoteague vice mayor and spokesperson for the volunteer fire company.

The early swim time was not a deterrent to morning crowds which enjoyed a respite from the usual searing heat as they waited for the spectacle. Two additions to this year’s swim: drones jockeyed for position overhead, while those

who gathered to watch the swim at Veteran’s Memorial Park were treated to a Jumbotron broadcast of the event.

The swim is held on the last Wednesday of July. The Saltwater Cowboys awaited the flare to indicate slack tide — what NOAA defines as a time “when the water is completely unstressed and there is no movement either way in the tidal stream” — to ease the crossing of the approximately 150 ponies that swam the channel from Assateague Island to Chincoteague.

With encouragement of the cowboys, and mares nudging their foals into the water, the ponies began the approximately

four-minute swim as they and their ancestors have reliably done the last 92 years, although there are accounts of roundups dating back well before the 1900s.

As pony noses above the water took shape and ponies neared the Chincoteague shore, a young boy whooped, “Yip-pee-yi-o-ki-yay! Here come the ponies!”

The first foal to make it across each year is named King Neptune or Queen Neptune and auctioned at the carnival.

This year a king took the crown, with the winning ticket drawn Wednesday night at the carnival from the 2,000 or so tickets sold. *(More photos on page 17)*

Tyson Fine Rejected As Too Low

The State Water Control Board cracked down on Tyson Farm Inc.’s poultry plant in Temperanceville last week for violating its discharge permit. The panel told the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) it needed to assess higher fines despite that the agency had already increased the penalty by \$7,000 compared to similar issues for other businesses. Board members also want a more stringent plan for the future.

The action came after Jay Ford, executive director of Virginia Eastern Shorekeeper, complained about the proposal. “We let the facts speak for themselves ... and we are thankful the board found our arguments compelling,” he said in a prepared statement. “The bottom line is ... this consent order gave the commonwealth no reason to believe the pollution would not continue, and that is an unacceptable agreement. Both the fines and Tyson’s clean up plan were woefully inadequate to ensure they’d come into and stay in compliance with their permit, particularly given their history of violations.”

“We’re disappointed with the board’s

ESVBA ASKED FOR - AND GOT - INPUT ON EXPANSION OF SHORE BROADBAND

The Eastern Shore of Virginia Broadband Authority held two public town hall meetings earlier this month to discuss opportunities in Accomack and Northampton counties for broadband internet access. ESVBA Executive Director Robert Bridgham and Columbia Telecommunications Corporation CEO, Andrew Aflerbach, led the July 18 meeting at Eastern Shore Community College.

Under the authority of ESVBA, fiber optic cable has already been laid through the middle of the peninsula. According to ESVBA's website, it can "currently offer connections to any business, internet service provider, government agency, carrier or an end-user location within [the] network footprint."

ESVBA's network for residential broadband access is extremely limited. Fiber optic connections are available in some areas of Pungoteague, Keller, Machipongo, and Harborton. Service area maps can be viewed at <http://esvba.com>

Rates for residential access to ESVBA's fiber optic network are compa-

table to Verizon's rates for DSL, which is much slower. ESVBA customers with a 24-month service contract pay \$39.99 per month for broadband with download and upload speeds of 10 Mbps and 5 Mbps, compared to Verizon's offer of \$34.99 per month for DSL with download and upload speeds of 3.1-7 Mbps and 768 Kbps. Verizon is not offering its Fios service to the Shore.

ESVBA seeks direction in extending fiber optic broadband access to residences across the 75-mile long, 10-mile wide peninsula that over 45,000 people call home. ESVBA hired consulting firm CTC to research and write a strategic business plan to guide the future of broadband on the Shore.

The town hall meetings gave locals the chance to share their reasons why broadband is needed.

Alex Vargas cannot connect to broadband, though he lives several feet from existing fiber optic cable. "I telecommute every day, so it really matters to me," he said.

Terri Rose, of the Eastern Shore Association of Realtors, said that internet ac-

cessibility "directly affects my business." Home buyers want to purchase properties with internet access. Lack of broadband makes it difficult for Rose to show properties online. She says she often spends "many hours trying to upload the same photo."

Joe Betit, of Pungoteague, stated that broadband enabled him to conduct scientific research projects, but grandparents getting broadband so their grandchildren can watch Netflix is also a "legitimate use" of the service.

Betit voiced his concern to parents that "you export all your children," citing that broadband access is "crucial to the economy here and keeping young people here," because it "increases work flow and work opportunities."

Susan Martin agreed with Betit, saying that she wants "to keep kids here" on the Shore, but it was hard for her son to complete online homeschooling assignments using DSL, which was unreliable. The internet would go out while he was taking a test online, she said.

Martin's son, Andrew Ashby, of Exmore, said the cost of broadband service

on the Shore is higher than elsewhere in the U.S. Ashby stated he pays \$100 a month for speeds of 30 Mbps downloading and 10 Mbps uploading, which is "ridiculous" compared to what broadband customers pay in "a big city like Kansas City," claiming they pay \$75 per month for speeds of 1 Gbps (1000 Mbps).

Sue Mastyl, of Harborton, suggested that traditional students are affected by a lack of broadband access, saying kids are sent home from school and can't do their homework because of bad internet service. Without broadband, "We're not growing our economic opportunities," she said.

Cara Burton, director of the Eastern Shore Public Library, commended ESVBA for providing free Wi-Fi at key public locations. Many people cannot afford the internet, Burton said, and "we have lots ... of people that come to the public library so that they can apply for jobs ... do their homework ... communicate with their families ... file their taxes."

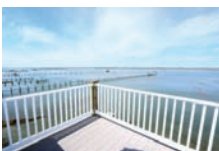

From Broadband to Water Works, Northampton Hears Capital Concerns

While the Northampton County Board of Supervisors attempt to juggle priorities for several big-ticket building and maintenance projects, citizens continue to demand broadband internet access.

The County needs a garage for six emergency medical services vehicles, including two ambulances. The board reviewed a memo from County Administrator Charles Kolakowski estimating that the project, including installation of electric and well and septic service, would cost nearly \$350,000 — \$100,000 more than the board anticipated.

The board discussed ideas for saving money on the 40-foot by 60-foot building, including framing it with wood instead of steel, and forgoing a 20-foot addition for office and storage space, a utility room, and a restroom. EMS Director Hollye Carpenter advised against eliminating the addition, emphasizing it will be needed in the future, and will cost more to construct later.

Chris Thomas, director of public works, said the county's government complex needs a water treatment system. The wells at the complex, supply-

ing water to the county jail, sheriff's office, courts, and social services building, contain levels of iron and manganese exceeding EPA requirements. A water ion exchange softener would cost \$48,375, plus \$2,240 annually for the salt used by the system.

The 125,000 gallon elevated water holding tank serving the complex has never been painted, and a 2013 inspection indicated the exterior is deteriorating. Painting the tank would cost at least \$30,000. Thomas recommended entering a maintenance agreement for a yearly cost of \$10,315. The agreement would cover painting the water tank immediately and every eight years thereafter, annual inspections, and all repairs, including emergency service.

Wastewater at the complex undergoes a "biological microorganism treatment process, in which bacteria in the water feed on the organic matter in the wastewater," Thomas stated. Extremely high and low temperatures in summer and winter hinder survival of the microorganisms, resulting in inadequate wastewater treatment and "pollutant

discharge requirements not being met." Thomas estimated a cost of \$75,000 to \$100,000 to enclose the wastewater tank for climate control.

Willis Wharf needs dredging, which will cost \$200,000. The Virginia Port Authority awarded a grant of \$141,000 for the project, of which \$98,000 remains after preliminary planning and engineering. Three docks at Morley's Wharf are rotting and missing deck boards, requiring complete replacement to eliminate the public hazard, at a cost of \$40,000 - \$50,000. There is not enough money in the Harbor Improvement Fund to complete either project. The nearly \$100,000 remaining from the VPA grant cannot be used to dredge half of Willis Wharf, as site preparation and equipment mobilization alone will cost \$70,000 - \$80,000.

Board chairman Spencer Murray estimated a cost of \$46,000 to demolish the 1914 jail.

Murray said Northampton has \$2.4 million in capital reserves, in two categories: \$1.3 million in unrestricted funds, to which the county adds \$300,000 each year, and \$1.1 million in

bond funds, restricted to construction of long-term projects.

The board will decide in August how to prioritize the projects, and how much capital will be spent — likely around \$750,000 to \$800,000.

Murray said he is constantly receiving phone calls from residents wanting broadband internet access. Board member Robert Duer shared an article about a method of broadband access that uses TV white space — the unused frequencies in between channels, originally implemented to prevent interference. Unlike satellite signals, white space broadband does not require a line-of-sight, penetrating through trees, walls, and other obstructions. According to the article, white space broadband is 80 percent cheaper than fiber optic broadband.

Microsoft is investing in white space broadband technology in 12 states, including Virginia. Supervisors recommended the Eastern Shore Virginia Broadband Authority "reach out" to Microsoft to test white space as an affordable, widely-available broadband internet alternative for the Shore.

Judge Considers Whether Muslimani Trial Should Move to Virginia Beach

A child molester who is already serving two life terms plus 20 years in prison, could have his next sex trial moved from Accomack Circuit Court to Virginia Beach.

At a hearing Monday, retired Judge Frederick Lowe, who sat on the bench in Virginia Beach for 24 years and lives on the other side of the bridge-tunnel, said he will decide in the next two weeks where the trial will be held. Court records show it is scheduled for October.

Khalil Mohammed Muslimani, also known as Lee, 70, of Onancock, is accused of raping his stepdaughter, Stacy Ann Spione, three decades ago. Her name is being used with her permission.

In 1990, Muslimani was convicted of a sex crime involving Spione when she was between 13 and 15 years old. She was 16 at the time of the last trial and says by then she had borne four of his children. At age 11, he and her mother took her to have

her first pregnancy by him aborted, she said.

Muslimani was also convicted nearly 30 years ago of sex crimes against another young relative. More recently, he was found guilty of four counts of molesting his niece when he lived with her family decades ago when she was a teenager.

Court records show Spione stopped going to school when she was 10½. The alleged incident in this case occurred between June 1 and Aug. 31, 1986.

Spione's mother, Ruth Ann Johnson, also known as Ruth Taylor Muslimani and Ruth Carpenter, 59, of Brady Street in Sulphur, La., was indicted as an accessory. She is free on \$25,000 bond and has been brought back and forth from Louisiana at taxpayers expense several times to testify against Muslimani, but the case has been continued over and over again.

Defense lawyer Trevor Robinson argued that an impartial jury could not be found locally due to extensive media coverage. He also complained a Google search of the defendant turned up 26

references. Robinson lives and works in Hampton Roads.

Commonwealth's Attorney Spencer Morgan wants Muslimani's trial to be held locally, so he could be judged by a jury of his peers. "A Google search of his name is not sufficient to justify" a change of venue, he said. "Articles were largely factual in nature," and did not editorialize the offenses. "Many of the sites on the search were articles as far away as Arizona and Wisconsin," said Morgan. "We've done it once before for this defendant ... we can do it again," the prosecutor said.

Lowe agreed the last case gave additional media coverage. "I'm trying to think outside the box here," Lowe said, explaining that if they were unable to get a jury, the trial would go to Virginia Beach anyway and that Accomack is in the same circuit.

"That was another case," said Morgan. "There was another victim. I don't think the court should be entirely dismissive ... that the citizens of Accomack could not give a fair trial ... it hasn't been a media blitz. It hasn't been

overbearing. I think there is a principle," Morgan continued. The crime "occurred in Accomack County and should be dealt with in Accomack County."

Lowe said he understood Morgan's point. "The only thing I'm trying to say to you is it just keeps plodding along. At some point we need to come to a conclusion ... my goal ... is to get this matter concluded as smoothly and as promptly as possible."

Robinson asked that Muslimani be moved from Accomack Jail to the Eastern Shore Regional Jail in Eastville. In order to prepare for his case, Robinson said his client needs access to his records. The lawyer has the papers now because he was told they had become a hazard at Accomack Jail.

"It's important that he has access to his documents ... it is difficult for him to rely on memory. We do have the distance issue. I know the Accomack Sheriff's Department wants my client to get a fair trial." Robinson said Muslimani believes that some of his papers have been taken and destroyed. In addition, the lawyer

Those wanting to clear their medicine cabinets and homes can bring unused or outdated medications to the lobby of the Exmore Town Hall during regular business hours, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, and drop the drugs in the "Safe Medication Disposal Bin." This includes the full range of prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medications, from pain killers and antibiotics to cold medicines and diet pills.

"Improper disposal of medications can create problems for the environment as well as for people," according to Chief DiMartino who is spear-

heading the program for Exmore. "When you flush antibiotics, mood enhancers or other drugs down the toilet, they eventually end up in the waste water treatment facility and disrupt the treatment process by killing the bacteria in the plant. If left in the medicine cabinet, they can end up in the wrong hands. Our drop-off box ensures the safe, correct disposal of all drugs."

This initiative, now underway for the community through the Exmore Police Department, is in partnership with Rite-Aid Foundation and KidCents Safe Medication Disposal Program, created to protect young people.

Chief DiMartino points out that in the U.S., approximately 60,000 children per year are treated in hospital emergency rooms for drug poisoning incidents involving prescription or OTC medications kept in the home. Child-proof caps and

medicine cabinets rarely offer adequate protection for curious children, says DiMartino. "According to a report by Safe Kids Worldwide, about half of the children poisoned by OTC medications each year climbed over obstacles to reach the drugs," he says. "And roughly 45 percent to 55 percent of reported incidents involve drugs with child-resistant packaging. The only true way to protect our kids is to get the medications out of the home as soon as they are no longer needed."

Town Hall is located at 3305 Main Street in downtown Exmore. A second drop-off point for Northampton County residents is the Northampton County Sheriff's office. complained that his client has not been receiving proper medical attention.

Lowe suggested Robinson talk to the sheriff. "I don't have jurisdiction over the sheriff's department. But, I have no objection to it. He very well might grant that request. If you do a little bit of legwork."

"A lot want to go to the regional jail because they have air conditioning," said Sheriff Todd Godwin, Wednesday. The sheriff is not going to transfer an inmate just because the inmate requests it. He said no records were destroyed and the health care he provided to the inmates is excellent.

Early in the process, Muslimani subpoenaed a long list of dignitaries including the governor.

"Use your discretion to the best of your ability," Lowe told Robinson. "Make sure people are subpoenaed who are people who have some knowledge of the facts of the case."

Other motions made by Muslimani, without benefit of legal counsel, will be reviewed and could be presented later, Robinson added. The defendant dismissed a lawyer who was appointed to the case and has been handling it on his own.

Quiet Indictments Made Public

Charges Reduced in Chincoteague Incident

Charges of abduction by force and robbery will not be prosecuted against three Chincoteague men initially accused of the crimes in May.

Commonwealth's Attorney Spencer Morgan told Judge Vincent Gordon

of Accomack General District Court Monday that the suspects were "overcharged" and that he would downgrade counts of felony malicious assault to simple assault and battery.

Austin Daniel Watson, 21, of Highland Park; Lesley Thomas Reid III, 21, of Joshua Lane; and Malik Alexander Cooper, 22, of Joshua Lane; pleaded guilty to the misdemeanor. Sentencing was deferred until Aug. 14 so restitution could be assessed.

Cooper and Reid were allowed to remain free on existing bond. Watson was also charged with possession of a Schedule I or II drug in connection with a July 3 incident. That charged was certified to the grand jury and he returned to Accomack Jail.

Zachary Ford, of Chincoteague, reported he was abducted, robbed and beaten with a stick and a bat by the three other islanders on May 20. Sgt. Thomas Hickman, of the Chincoteague Police Department, said Ford said that in addition to being assaulted by all three suspects, one at a time, he was dragged into a house and beaten when he tried to leave. They are also accused of taking his wallet and \$140 in cash.

"I think the officer did the right thing and did a thorough investigation," said Morgan. The prosecutor explained that the defendants "admitted there was an assault and battery but denied the other things that the victim said."

In another case, Raymond Charles Potoski Jr., 47, of Parksley Road in Parksley, was convicted of harassment by telephone, a misdemeanor. He was originally charged with making a bomb threat on May 23. Potoski was sentenced to six months in jail.

Hallucinogens Don't Fly on School Campus

A Cape Charles resident who was convicted of drug crimes, including attempting to distribute a hallucinogenic drug on school property, was sentenced last year in Accomack Circuit Court to a year in prison.

Christopher William West Walker, 22, of Randolph Avenue, got five years each for two counts of distribution of 251-NBOMe, which is sold as an alternative to LSD or mescaline, possession with intent to distribute the drug and possession with intent to sell the drug on school

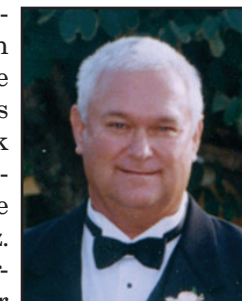

CAPITAL LETTERS

Summer is a quiet time in Richmond. We return there periodically for various committee and commission meetings, but, by and large, the capitol is quiet during the summer months. It is a little less so this year as the General Assembly has moved its offices from the General Assembly building to the Pocahontas Building on Main Street which will be temporary quarters for the legislature, the clerk's office and legislative services for the next four years while the old building is demolished and a new office building is constructed.

In conjunction with the Eastern Shore Chamber of Commerce, I have been having meetings with various local stakeholders as well as the Secretary of Technology and the Virginia Economic Development Partnership regarding efforts to expand broadband service on the Eastern Shore. These meetings have been fruitful and productive and we hope to cap it off with a public meeting to provide information to the public and hopefully map out some ideas for a path ahead as to how best to expand coverage. I am

hopeful that this public meeting will take place some time in late August or perhaps early September.

There are a number of transportation projects that have received new funding on the Eastern Shore. This is the result of the transportation compromise bill that was passed a few years ago by the General Assembly. It has provided much needed funding for many infrastructure projects across the Commonwealth and particularly in the Hampton Roads and Northern Virginia regions. In addition to the recently completed "Church Road" project, from Accomac to Onley, four additional projects on the Shore have been funded.

As always, as a member of the Recurrent Flooding Study Committee, we continue discussions about how best to prepare for what will be an inevitable increase in coastal flooding in the decades ahead. I am hopeful that Gov. Terry McAuliffe will provide funding for the Coastal Resiliency Fund which my legislation established two sessions ago and also that we can find ways to minimize the dispersion of Virginia's flooding resiliency activities by reorganizing those activities within some of our Executive departments. Those discussions will be ongoing throughout the summer and into the fall as we prepare for the

2018 legislative session which will begin in January 2018.

Revenue and employment numbers for the commonwealth continue to improve. June revenue receipts were up and the fiscal year ended with a \$132 million surplus. The last reported state unemployment rate was 3.8 percent. The Virginia Retirement System posted great returns of 11 percent for the last fiscal year with a current value of \$74 billion. In addition, the Commonwealth moved back into the Top 10 states for business as ranked by CNBC. We were

placed at seven after having slipped out of the Top 10 for a few years.

I hope that everyone is having a wonderful summer and enjoyed a great Eastern Shore 4th of July. The parade in Cape Charles continues to grow in number and in enthusiasm each year and it was great to participate again.

ZONING BOARD OKS 78'-HIGH YACHT BUILDING

The Northampton County Board of Zoning Appeals unanimously approved a variance to construct a 78-foot high building for yacht refit and repair on the south side of Cape Charles Harbor. The town's zoning ordinance restricts the height of industrial buildings to 45 feet. The July 20 decision by the zoning board immediately followed a public hearing on the matter.

Three members of the public attended the hearing, but gave no comments. The board voted 4-0 to approve, with member Kevin Hoffman absent.

In a June 26 letter which accompanied the variance application, Daniel Brown, of Cape Harbor Holding Company LLC, said the yacht building was needed to advance "a continuing effort to attract super yachts to our deep water harbor." The 36,000-square-foot building will occupy an 18.4 acre lot.

Brown said the building would not be visible to boaters, as it would be situated behind a 50-foot span of trees, and would be painted a forest green color. The ship and yacht repair shed would be set back 400 feet from the shoreline, and would not exceed the height of "silos and other structures on the adjacent property."

decision, but remain committed to environmental compliance and reaching a resolution," Public Relations Manager, Derek Burleson said in a prepared statement Thursday. "We're now seeking guidance from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality on next steps. We previously submitted a corrective action plan, which was approved by the state, and had additional engineering assessment performed, focused on ways to enhance the treatment process."

John Brandt, a regional DEQ air compliance and monitoring manager, said the company exceeded biochemical oxygen demand (BOD), a measure of health of the water for the aquatic environment. The limit was 187 pounds per day and a sample showed 491.

"It is a lot over the limit," Brandt said.

Permit holders have to sample monthly and be analyzed by a certified laboratory. "They have to run blind samples, they have to be inspected," he added. In addition, Tyson reported 51 milligrams per liter for their concentration average and the limit is 26 milligrams.

A chart included with the proposed consent order shows Tyson was also out of compliance for ammonia, fecal coliform, E. Coli and total suspended solids.

DEQ issued a warning letter on May 14, 2015, citing the March 2015 violations and for failure to provide a letter of explanation for non-compliance with its permit limits for ammonia. A notice of violation was issued on Oct. 27, 2015, for those issues and for failure to provide a letter of explanation for non-compliance with its permit limits for the August and September 2015 reporting periods.

"The company consists of a poultry hatchery, which supplies chicks to contract growers, and the processing of live chick-

ens," according to the proposal. "Poultry processing includes slaughtering, de-feathering, eviscerating, chilling, packaging, and shipping of poultry products for human consumption to an off-site destination. Tyson also renders offal (the entrails and internal organs) and feather waste into usable animal feed ingredients."

"We have an internal document," said Brandt. "Then we draft a consent order ... we send it to them and ask them to sign and agree to the civil charge." The first order called for a total fine of \$11,305.

In the meantime, he talked to Ford. "They didn't think the civil charge was high enough for a company Tyson's size," Brandt said. So DEQ "went back and increased some of the values — some were listed as moderate and were changed to serious."

The new consent order, which was turned down by the board, had a total penalty of \$18,312. "We try to be responsive to public comments," Brandt said.

Still, the board did not agree with the figure saying it was not high enough and sent it back for further study.

Brandt said he was unsure if the agency would be ready to present a new order by the meeting scheduled for October. The date after that is in December. "It's a negotiation process with the board and Tyson" through the workers, Brandt said.

"Virginia Eastern Shorekeeper wants to see our poultry industry thrive, but we want them to do so legally and sustainably," Ford continued. "We continue to encourage the state and Tyson to explore ways they can have a positive impact on waters around the Eastern Shore through water quality enhancement projects ... For now, we look forward to seeing an agreement with financial penalties that serve as a deterrent, rather than as an incentive to pollute," he added.

You've found a buyer or a terrific deal on Craigslist, Facebook or other online marketplace, now what? Meeting strangers to execute a transaction can be intimidating, especially when cash is involved. Relax! The Exmore Police Department and the Town of Exmore just made it safer and more comfortable for ESVA residents to buy or sell online by providing a designated "Meetup Spot" in the parking lot of the Exmore Town Hall, 3305 Main St. in downtown Exmore.

The location is open to everyone, not just Exmore residents. It is well-lit, under 24-hour video surveillance and within steps of the Police Department. "The internet is an excellent, legitimate commercial platform, but it also provides a level of anonymity that attracts bad apples," says Police Chief Angelo DiMartino. "Too many transactions are

a ruse, and deals can take a bad turn."

Establishing a safe meet-up spot, or Internet Purchase Exchange Location (IPEL) as they are officially known, is a concept that is gaining national support. As a deterrent to criminal intent and activity, the IPEL locations seem to be working, helping lower the rate of negative incidents. The Exmore Police Department has proactively undertaken the project using its own resources. Signage for the site, a 12" x 18" green aluminum plaque, was donated by OfferUp, a large mobile online marketplace. OfferUp also showcases the Exmore meet-up spot on its mobile app.

"This is another step toward the Exmore Police Department's goal of maximum protection for our citizens," says Chief DiMartino. "We plan to ensure that exchanges take place without a hitch, and that both parties leave happy."

Judge Hears FOIA Case in Accomack

Judge Gordon Vincent of Accomack General District Court took a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) dispute under advisement last week after hearing a complaint filed by a local man against the state attorney general's office and the office of the executive secretary of supreme court of Virginia.

Vincent said he will rule on the case by early August.

Dr. William H. Turner, a retired dentist, local sculptor, painter and former Accomack supervisor, claimed Nerissa N. Rouzer, an assistant attorney general, failed to direct him to statutes that would grant immunity to state judges in

regard to \$1,500 advances they could receive annually prior to 2016.

Rouzer testified that it was her legal opinion that the judges did not fall under FOIA and that by asking her to clarify her response he was asking for a legal opinion that she did not have to give him.

"Those judges ... they are outside the scope of FOIA," she said.

Turner said the attorney general is attempting to block his probe into \$1.8 million in funds that were given to about 175 circuit court judges in recent years.

Beginning in 2015, he also sent many FOIA requests to the supreme court executive secretary.

property. The terms were set to run concurrently with four years suspended.

Walker was ordered to be on good behavior for 10 years upon release. Supervised probation was set for three years. His driver's license was suspended for six months for each of the four charges. Secured bond was set at \$7,500 for Ray Thomas Fitchett, 26, of Dreamland Trailer Park in Accomac. He was indicted recently on a count of possession with intent to distribute between a half-ounce and five pounds of marijuana on April 29, 2016; buying or receiving or aiding in concealing

a stolen firearm on April 29, 2016; and selling cocaine on Oct. 19 and Nov. 2, 2016.

Secured bond was set at \$10,000 for Frederick Demond Bull, 39, of Boggs Road in Painter. He was indicted last month on a count of distributing cocaine on Nov. 9, 2016.

Unlawful Wounding Conviction

A Cape Charles resident was convicted Monday in Northampton Circuit Court of the unlawful wounding of another man.

Jose Antonio Ortiz-Alarado, 39, of Trailer Circle, was initially indicted on a count of maliciously wounding Joseph Samuel Davila on July 24, 2016. He denied the charge and was found guilty of the lesser felony.

Cheyenne Khiji Addison, 23, of Exmore, was sentenced to four years each on credit card theft and credit card fraud convictions in connection with Feb. 19, 2015, incidents. The terms were set to run concurrently with all but a year suspended. Supervised probation was ordered for eight years.

Disposition was withheld in the case of Kevin Kentral Wilson, 23, of Onancock, who pleaded no contest to possessing a controlled substance on Nov. 4, 2016. In accordance with first offender consideration, the case will come up again in July 2018.

Drug Task Force Seeks Three Still at Large

Fishing from the Shore

Fishing, with just a few exceptions, took a turn for the worse this week as the bay's water temperature continues to climb through the 80s and the offshore yellowfin tuna bite has been consistently inconsistent.

Depending on who you talk to, flounder fishing improved over the previous week, particularly offshore, as did the offshore black sea bass catch. Inshore whiting (kingfish, sand mullet) remain plentiful in the Chesapeake Bay, inside the seaside inlets, and in the ocean surf. Sharks are still plentiful on the seaside for anglers willing to chum them up.

Lower Chesapeake Bay – James, at Chris' Bait & Tackle, reported that the cobia bite, which has been exceptional this year, has finally showed evidence of slowing down. Flounder fishing has been hit or miss lately as the largest reported flatfish of the season was taken last week by J. P. Spinner and weighed an impressive 11-1! Spinner caught the huge doormat while wirelining along the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel. The fish was weighed in at Ocean's East Bait & Tackle in Virginia Beach. Sea mullet (kingfish, whiting) remain the most consistent catch, with anglers able to fill their coolers with the tasty bottom fish. Anglers cruising the pilings of the bridge-tunnel are working schools of spadefish, most of which are small, but fish up to six pounds have been brought in. Spadefish are also available along the third and fourth islands of the span. On the seaside, croakers remain in relatively small sizes and in short supply.

Wachapreague – Captain Lindsay Paul was fishing aboard the Foxy Lady with Captain Nat Atkinson when I called. They had a good day on Thursday with a mixed bag of yellowfin and dolphin, but the tuna bite had dissipated going into last weekend. A few dolphin and some false albacore made up the bulk of catches throughout the first part of this week. Debbie Shrieves reported

that the offshore fleet was flying numerous dolphin (mah-mahi) flags. Flounder fishing success was dependent on the tide and water clarity, with the most consistent catches coming on the last half of the flood (incoming) tide, near the inlets, in depths of 10-25 feet. Captain Matt Abell led a charter consisting of Captain Curtis Johns and his two sons to a catch of 30 flounder inside Metompkin Inlet, of which only three fish met the legal size limit. On Monday, the Foxy Lady landed 25 flounder, keeping only two fish. Their best action occurred two hours into the ebb (outgoing) tide, near the Coast Guard station.

Chincoteague – Pete, at Captain Steve's Bait & Tackle, and Donna Rae, of Captain Bob's Marina, were in unison when describing the local angling action. Many flounder have been caught inside the inlet, but few have been big enough to keep. The north end of Chincoteague Channel has produced a few keepers. Among the undersized flounder have been undersized seabass and swelling toads (southern pufferfish). Small croakers were coming from near the inlet. Sea mullet (kingfish, whiting) were the most plentiful keepers and were biting inside the inlet and in the surf. Shark catches were made by chummers in Cackle Creek and a mixed bag of sharks were coming from just outside the inlet, including bonnetheads, Atlantic finetooth, sandbar, and blacktips. Offshore, larger flounder were being landed near the Blackfish Banks wreck, several weighing in the 4-5 pound range. Triggerfish and spadefish were abundant over the wrecks. Large "knothead" black sea bass were boated at the Parking Lot Wreck and the Marine Electric. Tuna fishing was described as "hit or miss" at the Lumpy Bottom and the Parking Lot.

Upper Chesapeake Bay – Captain Matt Abell, at Sea Hawk Sports Center, reported that the rockfish population has started to dwindle in number,

but one client did land a 25-inch fish. The speckled trout population remained stable, though they seem to be trending smaller in size. A few sheepshead have been pulled from the Tangier Target Ships. Matt also said that the offshore flounder fishing among the wrecks and railcars had picked up and said that anglers using Berkley Gulps and Spros buck-tails were having the best success. Offshore action was described as "spotty" with a lot of boats stowing their tuna gear away to deep drop for tilefish.

Bill Hall was the first Eastern Shore resident to achieve Virginia Salt Water Master Angler Status. He has been named Virginia Saltwater Angler of the Year and Virginia Saltwater Release Angler of the Year. Bill is an I.G.F.A. International Committee Representative and a longtime member of the Virginia Saltwater Fishing Tourna-

ment Committee. He is the Virginia Recreation Fishing representative on the ASMFC Striped Bass Management Panel and is a past recipient of the CCA-VA Virginia Outdoor Writer Conservation Leadership Award.

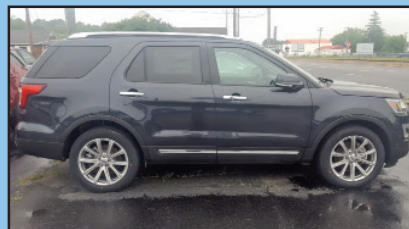

Cape Charles' Dog Days of Summer

Paws for Reading program brings children and pet pals together in literacy and love

Every month at the Cape Charles Memorial Library, pets pause to hear children read their favorite stories. "Paws for Reading" uses trained therapy animals to help children ages 6-12 improve their reading, emotional and social skills.

A child chooses a book from the main area of the library on the ground floor, then heads upstairs where a comfy chair and a cuddly dog or cat awaits.

Children can expect to meet Diesel or Talon, both German Shepherds, or Ben, a Birman cat (a long-haired, Siamese-like breed). Marita Patterson, their handler, brings one of the three animals to the library each month. Diesel was present at the July session.

The story of Diesel's involvement in Paws for Reading began when Patterson was active in the U.S. Army, stationed at Fort Bliss in El Paso, Texas. Diesel and Talon were originally trained to be show dogs. Their trainer worked for the William Beaumont Army Medical Center, where many Iraq War veterans were treated. Patterson was convinced that therapy animals would benefit recovering veterans, and began training her animals for therapy in 2006.

All of Patterson's animals are registered with Pet Partners International. They passed a rigorous, 23-point test to gain credentials. Patterson's Birman cat, Ben, was the first of her pets to earn qualifications as a therapy animal in

2006. Her elder German shepherd, Talon, earned his credentials in 2008.

Diesel was originally intended to be a guide dog for the blind and visually impaired. When he was 16 months old, Patterson took him to New York to train in the Guiding Eyes for the Blind program. After eight months of training, Diesel was ready to be assigned to a client. An examination prior to placement found that Diesel had cataracts, disqualifying him from guide dog service. Patterson welcomed Diesel back home, and he began his therapy career in 2014. Paws for Reading at the Cape Charles Memorial Library began in 2016.

Bark in the Park is Canine Competition at Its Best

Bay Creek hosted its third annual Dock Dogs event, also called Bark in the Park, from Thursday, July 20 through Sunday, July 23.

Dogs of all breeds, sizes, and ages participated in four unique competitions to see who could jump and swim the highest, farthest, and fastest. The multiple-day event was fun for competitors and spectators alike. Dock Dogs was deemed a huge success by organizers, attracting 500 attendees in four days – including a few pups.

Kiersten Downing, owner of Oakley, a chocolate lab in his third year as a "dock dog," shared the story of how he became involved in the Bark in the Park competition.

Downing, who previously attended Tidewater Dock Dogs, was accompanied by Oakley when visiting a friend at a Virginia Beach residence. There was a private swimming pool on the property, which Oakley enjoyed jumping into repeatedly. The friend observed Oakley's raw talent for leaping into the water, and the rest was history.

Oakley's training consists mainly of weight pulling — to strengthen his hind end muscles — and practice runs swimming across the pool. Downing attributes Oakley's skills to repetition and muscle memory.

In the "Dueling Dogs" portion of the competition, which Downing terms as "doggy drag racing," dogs get a running start on a long platform divided into two lanes,

The program helps children improve their reading skills, allowing them essential practice by narrating to a furry friend. It also promotes emotional skills, as the presence of a pet is calming, giving children confidence to read aloud. A pet will not judge a child for mispronouncing a word. Petting an animal while reading reduces stress and anxiety, improving performance.

A child can feel like a leader by playing "teacher," reading aloud to the pet and turning the book towards him so he can see the pictures. Children feel accomplished when they finish reading a book to

their animal audience. Participation can inspire children to read more at home, often to their own pets.

Paws for Reading promotes social skills as children wait their turns and talk about what books they like to read. Interacting with the animals helps teach children empathy. When Diesel finished one session, he played fetch with the reader until the next child arrived.

Paws for Reading is held at the Cape Charles Memorial Library on the third Saturday of every month, from 10:45 a.m. to 12 p.m. To register your child for a 15-minute session, call 757-331-1300.

jump into a rectangular pool more than 30 feet long, and swim its entire length. The first dog to grab the "bumper" hanging at the end of the pool is the winner.

A judge monitors all competition, recording each dog's reaction time and overall time. The reaction time is the length of time each dog takes to get from the starting line (at the far end of the platform) to the point they land in the pool. The judge also notes any instances of a "false start," in which any part of either dog (such as a nose) crosses the starting line before the official start of the race is called.

The "Big Air Wave" is probably the most recognizable Dock Dogs competition, featured in ads and on YouTube. It tests how far dogs can jump into the water, rather than how fast they can dive and swim. The distance of each jump is measured by the point where the base of the dog's tail hits the water.

"Speed Retrieve" is just what it sounds like – a competition to determine which dog is the fastest retrieving swimmer.

The "Extreme Vertical" event tests competitors' ability to jump as high as possible before landing in the water. Dogs get a running start, shorter than in "Dueling Dogs." Their motivation is to reach a bumper or other item hanging overhead. The dogs are challenged to push themselves to their limits as the target item is moved higher and higher. The record for the highest jump was set by Bo, from Florida, whose best attempt was an astronomical 8 feet, 2 inches.

Another standout was Hatteras, from Cape Charles, who competes under the team name, "A Shore Thing." He was recently invited to compete in Dock Dogs on the national level.

Linda Buskey, sales director at Bay Creek, is credited with organizing Dock Dogs in Cape Charles since its inception three years ago. Dock Dogs was brought to the Eastern Shore to attract visitors to Bay Creek, known for its golf courses, and "to highlight the love our residents have for the outdoors."

"I wanted to get to know the community and my neighbors," said Bagg on doing the show locally, and who refers to the Shore folks in his act as the "Bridge-Tunnel Bridge-Tunnel" people.

"The first time I saw Ian Bagg was last fall. I laughed so hard that tears were flowing down my cheeks," said Amanda Daughtrey Heath of Townsend. "Of course, he called me out and called me a crybaby in front of the crowd! That just sent me into hysterics, and made my friends laugh even harder — at me! This is a show that should definitely be seen with friends."

Last Comic Standing propelled Bagg into the spotlight and he soon found himself being followed around like the Grateful Dead. I'm sure Jerry Garcia isn't the first person most think about when talking about the Canadian transplant, whose very nature lends itself to talk of hockey playoffs and maple syrup, but seeing the regulars at his shows does conjure memories of tied-dyed hippies traveling miles to see their favorite performer.

He tours constantly all over the world. He went on tour with Gabriel Iglesias to Australia and Europe, aboard a private jet. He played in front of crowds of more than 7,000 people on a regular basis. He just went back to his hometown of Terrace, British Columbia, for a two-night fundraiser for a mom battling leukemia.

"I initially didn't want to do Last Comic Standing," said Bagg. "But my wife made me."

His reasoning was that he didn't want to be in a contest. But he ended up enjoying the experience and the exposure it presented.

"I got a whole new fan base from people who watch TV from 8 to 10 p.m. Now I have people in Ohio who know who I am," he said.

Everything snowballed from there. He has hundreds of thousands of hits on many performances on YouTube. He's been touring non-stop since the show aired.

Three of the judges, Roseanne Barr, Norm Macdonald and Keenan Ivory Wayans, thought he was great and their votes helped him become a finalist on the show. Although, according to Bagg, they were sometimes fickle.

"It was like doing comedy for your great aunt. They'd sometimes forget they'd even seen me the day before," he laughed. "But then they'd love me and

say I was doing great. And I was like, 'Oh, finally, they're back on their meds.' I just love Roseanne. I would just comb her hair if I could."

"The class of 1997 is beyond thrilled that the hilarious comedian Ian Bagg will be performing at the Palace Theatre on Aug. 4," said NHS class of '97 alumni Laura Morgan, of Quinby. "After you see him once, you are sure to never miss another show when Ian is in town. You WILL laugh your face off."

Bagg loves the Shore, but there are two things that really stand out for him: "First, there is SOOO much family.

"And watch your speed limit on the Shore, people. Do not do 62. Do not do 65," he commented on the commitment by law enforcement officers to keep it 55 mph on the highway.

"We saw Ian Bagg when he was in town at The Funny Bone in Virginia Beach," said Crystal Sturgis Hart of Exmore. "It was a girls' trip and I laughed so hard I thought I had lockjaw. I bought four tickets for his show in Cape Charles. I will be there with my girls!"

"We've been working on a sitcom based

on the reality show. Scripts are being written right now," said Bagg. "It's basically blue state meets red state," he joked. The reality show referenced was one he and his in-laws made a pilot for three years ago. The premise was that he would get a "real job" if this comedian thing didn't work out. His brothers-in-law are watermen and entrepreneurs. He worked on the water a few days with the Caisons, whom he refers to as "tough-living people."

"They made me pick oysters and clams for a few days," he said of the early-morning work routine. "I'm pretty sure clams are there mid-afternoon. So why did we have to go so early?"

When quizzed on his knowledge of the Shore and seafood he said, "I don't know things about crabs except they're blue sometimes."

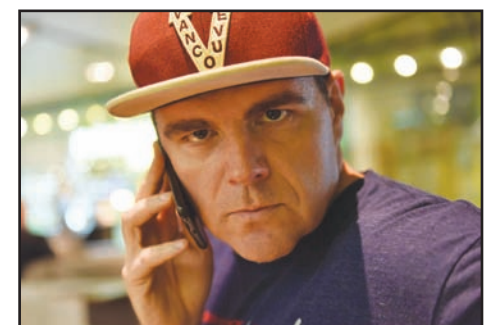
The readers will just have to use their imagination on his definition of a sook.

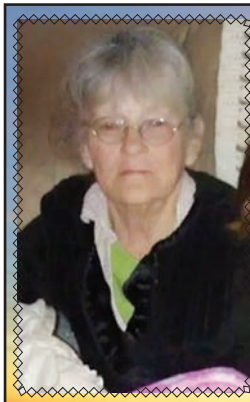

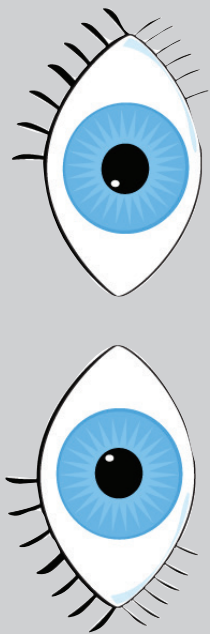

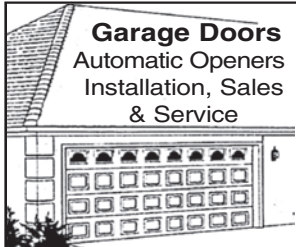

Couldn't it just be possible that I get more mosquito bites because the flying vampires know a good thing when they see it?

I try very hard not to sweat. I don't drink beer or eat bananas very often. I'm not a heavy breather. I couldn't possibly be pregnant and I'm too much of a germaphobe to have too much bacteria lurking on my skin. Oh by the way, those are the things said to bring the pests swarming.

So it just has to be that the little darlings adore me. Earlier this month, I had 27 mosquito bites on one leg below the knee and about the ankle. The other leg had about five bites. I got them while trying to photograph lightning from my front porch one night. I was wearing a white nightgown so the

dark clothing theory is not acceptable for this.

The next night, I was sitting at a town council meeting on Chincoteague, trying not to scratch, when someone said, the mosquitoes on the island weren't bad this year. The audience cheered. Well folks, I'm here to say, they must

have moved to Painter. Whoever sent out the welcome basket needs to get it back. ASAP! Please!

My boyfriend drinks beer and obviously wouldn't be pregnant and he never ever gets bit by a mosquito. He's not a heavy breather either. Plus he loves this hot weather and bastes in it while I am mostly inside in the air-conditioning trying to feel cool, calm and collected.

A 12-ounce bottle or can of beer can make one more attractive, one study found. I have to laugh here. I bet you have to too. Researchers seem to be at loss as to why exactly this is. Maybe the mosquitoes are just beer lovers?

Perhaps the mosquitoes know I hate summer. Maybe it is Mother Nature's way of further punishing me, as if the blazing sun was not enough.

But MOM, I love winter and fall and even spring. I love storms, snow, rain, and even hail. Mom, you're not listening.

Here's another thing to ponder. I've never been stung by a bee. A hornet and a wasp have gotten me. But, I've never been stung by a bee. They love me too much to hurt me. Yippee! Still, I can't imagine why they don't like me as much as sugar water.

The universe is so mysterious.

It's all about the blood for mosquitoes. I've read that female adult mosquitoes rely on the protein in our blood for the production of eggs. People with Type O blood are found to be twice as attractive to mosquitoes than those with Type A blood, while those with Type B were about average. I have no idea what type of blood I have.

Scientists also say that 85 percent of people produce a secretion that signals what blood type they are; mosquitoes are drawn to those 85 percent more than the non-secretors, regardless of blood type. I have no idea what it means to be a blood secretor. I couldn't possibly be one of those could I? I mean, YUCK.

So how do we stop getting bitten with-

out covering ourselves with insect blockers that we will probably find out in ten years causes some disease? I looked to the Old Farmer's Almanac and here's what I learned. Please use at your own risk.

If you take in enough apple cider vinegar by putting it on foods you eat, you'll develop a body odor that will repel insects, including black flies."

"Some people swear garlic works," the almanac stated. "No, it doesn't," says this Italian.

Others apply onion or radish juice for the same purpose.

To get the mosquitoes out of your yard burn a little sage or rosemary over coals. Of course, make sure you eliminate standing water. Marigolds, chrysanthemums, asters, and pyrethrum daisies, as well as herbs such as basil, anise, and coriander, are all thought to repel insects. Or you can add a bat house to your yard since a small brown bat can eat as many as 600 mosquitoes in one hour. Just cover your neck.

Seeking Help To Refinish Gym Floor

Dear Editor:

Our county parks department relies on use of an older school building for many of its recreational activities, such as its basketball league. Just the basketball program provides over 200 participants with a community place to play ball and the entire parks program has over 1,500 persons participating. The old school gym used for these programs has been heavily used for many years and the floor badly needs refinishing. Our county is one of the poorest in the state, and the board of supervisors has not been able to allocate the funds to refinish the gym floor. We are concerned the gym may have to be shut down because of liability concerns if we fail to generate the funding to refinish the floor.

So the members of the Parks Board decided to try and take matters into our own hands and apply for grant funding to refinish the floor. We did receive a form of grant, called crowdfunding, to refinish the floor. This type of grant does not actually provide the money to fix the floor. Instead, it helps publicize the project needing funding, in hopes that people will go online and make contributions towards the project. This is where you and I come in. We need to send this information to
