# Homicide Victim Identified

Police identified the man who died from a gunshot wound last week en route to Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital as 25-year-old Belarmino Escalante of Greenbush, a Perdue employee.

Glen McBride of the Norfolk Medical Examiner's Office said Escalante's death from a single gunshot wound has been ruled a homicide.

Accomack County Sheriff's Office was called to the scene of the shooting at about 4 a.m. Thursday, July 21, at the former Godwin's Nursery on Lankford Highway. Maj. Todd Godwin said the man was found in a grassy area north of the old nursery building. The structure was most recently used as a church and community center. Last week, investigators were checking out the victim's blue-and-white pick-up truck, which was left at the scene.

Godwin asked that anyone with information regarding the incident call 787-1131 or 824-5666.

# Northampton Loses Fight To Halt Hospital Relocation

State Health Commissioner Dr. Karen Remley has denied the petition by the Northampton County Board of Supervisors to be named a party in the application for a the Certificate of Public Need (COPN) requested by Shore Health Services, Inc. (SHS) for a new hospital. The supervisors wanted to have legal standing to object to the relocation of Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital from Nassawadox to the Onley area.

In a letter to the supervisors' attorney, Stephen K. Fox of Fairfax, Va., Dr. Remley said she based her decision on a recommendation by state Department of Health Adjudication Officer Douglas R. Harris.

Fox, who grew up on the Shore, said

Tuesday that the Board of Supervisors has not decided whether to appeal the decision. Noting the 30-day deadline, Fox said he expects the matter to be taken up at the supervisors' regularly scheduled meeting Aug. 9. He said he has advised them on the matter, but would not disclose what he said, citing attorney-client privilege.

In a 16-page document, Harris presented his reasons for recommending to Dr. Remley that Northampton's request be denied.

Explaining the Board of Supervisors' first premise for opposition to the COPN and thereby its rationalization for being a party in the proceedings, Harris noted, "The Board states that it has 'reviewed this matter with a consultant in industry who has provided

a verbal opinion that demolition of the existing facility ... and remediation of environmental issues ... may cost several millions of dollars, and require an extended period for completion. ... The Board believes that since it is the local steward of conditions which may create hazards to health, safety and welfare of the residents, this issue should be part of the additional considerations of the [State] Health Commissioner."

But Harris found that the allegation "consists of a mere assertion of another's conjecture; it lacks a substantiality that would allow its meaningful consideration. Further, Riverside has not said it no longer has a purpose for the building or that its destruction is planned or imminent — an issue be-

yond the range of a public need determination. More generally, this ... ranges far beyond a customary public need determination performed under the authority granted by the COPN law."

In its objection to the hospital's move, the Board of Supervisors notes that while located in Northampton County, the hospital has been granted an annual tax exemption of almost \$93,000. But this issue, according to Harris, "ranges well beyond a customary public need determination. ... Customarily, such matters are not part of the subject-matter discourse on a proposed project. Further, I believe the Commissioner lacks authority to parse and analyze them to legal effect."

Harris also cited the supervisors'

# Businesses Denied License for Failure To Pay Taxes

Twenty-four Accomack companies were not issued business licenses this year because they are delinquent in paying business personal-property taxes, according to information released this week by the county's Commissioner of the Revenue's Office.

Figures supplied by Treasurer Dana Bundick show more than \$130,300 is owed by the businesses. She declined to say if any of the companies have signed payment contracts with her. The payment plans are not public information, Bundick said.

The company with the largest debt

is BaySys Technologies, LLC, which owes \$56,499 in business personal-property taxes and was not issued a business license in 2010 or 2011. A subsidiary of BaySys, Interad Limited, LLC, owes \$8,766 for personal-property taxes and was not issued a license in 2008, 2009, 2010 or 2011. The businesses now share office space in the industrial park in Melfa.

Bundick said that interest on the debts accumulates monthly. The next tax installment will be due Dec. 5, 2011.

Commissioner of the Revenue Leslie Savage said the companies listed have paid for the licenses, but they weren't issued because the previous year's taxes weren't paid. Savage said the only payment plan she was made aware of was for BIC, Inc. of Wattsville. She referred questions about such plans to Bundick.

The issue came up after it was realized that BIC was not issued a business license because of delinquency but was awarded a contract by the county to renovate Kegotank Landing Walk, Seawall and Boat Ramp in Modestown. Savage said that company was mailed a license Monday after the county issued payment for the work and Bundick was able to obtain the funds for the property tax. BIC owed more than \$9,250 in personal-property taxes.

Fletcher IV (Seafood and Produce) for 2011 with \$2,686; Eastern Shore Mini Storage, Inc. for 2011 with \$1,314; Eastern Shore Used Appliance & Repair for 2011 with \$142; Emiliano Raygoza (construction) for 2011 with \$1,676; Freddie's & Son Garage for 2010 and 2011 with \$1.844: Grounds Keepers Lawn Care, Inc. for 2011 with \$1,564; J&D Handyman Service listed as John Edgar Riddle 3rd for 2011 with \$601; J&K Auto Truck Repair, Inc. for 2011 with \$160; Jester Plumbing Co., Inc. for 2011 with \$1,827; KMX Chemical Corp. for 2010 and 2011 with \$28,663; Sue H. 

# Northampton Prepares for Loss of Supervisor

In view of the imminent downsizing of the Northampton County Board of Supervisors from six to five supervisors, the board began a review of the makeup of the 40 commissions and committees that handle a significant amount of work for the county.

It has been proposed that the School Board, which currently has one member from each district, plus two at-large seats, will drop to a seven-member board.

The nine-member Planning Commission may drop to seven members, one from each district and two at-large positions.

A third group likely to drop a member will be the eight-member Recreation Board.

The supervisors agreed to decide on the proposed changes at their regular August meeting.


Supervisor Richard Tankard recommended that the Board consider dissolving the Architectural Review Board, the Eastern Shore RC&D Council, and the Workforce Investment Board. He said recent inactivity by these groups was a reason to eliminate them. The matter was added to the agenda for the August meeting.

### Supervisors OK **Expenditures**

Accomack supervisors voted last week to spend more than \$21,000 to upgrade magistrate services and another \$15,000 for part-time help in the registrar's office.

Magistrate Jimmy Rowley told the Board of Supervisors the money he requested would be used to purchase video equipment to link Tangier Island with the mainland and for a barrier when confidential police information is being discussed, the public is waiting for services and suspected criminals are passing through his 7'x10' office.

Rowley explained that those under arrest verbally abuse citizens; and criminals have head-butted, kicked and spat at police in his office while drunks, mothers and children are waiting. He said the same chairs that drunks urinate and defecate on are used by other citizens. "It presents a real problem" with the life cycle of hepatitis B, Rowley noted.

The magistrate issues 90 percent of local search warrants and the lack of security in the office could cause a criminal to be tipped off, Rowley explained. Minors who are victims of sex crimes also are questioned there and need privacy.

Regarding Tangier, Rowley said islanders have to travel to make complaints and sometimes spend \$100 to \$150 and lose a day's work during the process. "Tangier can't afford \$8,000 for video equipment," he said.

The money will come from a special fund within the sheriff's budget. Supervisor Robert Crockett, former sheriff for the county, made the motion for the spending. Vice Chairwoman Laura Belle Gordy agreed with the expenditure but complained, "I heard a whole lot I didn't need to know" regarding the issue. Supervisor Jack Gray thanked Rowley "for being articulate."

Registrar Ann Loukx said she needs another worker to be trained to take over if she or her deputy clerk must be out of the office, particularly with the upcoming November General Election as well as two primaries, town elections and the presidential election in 2012.



### Walking for the Troops

Al "Iron Grandpa" Slusser, a 72-year-old Arizona native (at left), is walking from Key West, Fla., to the Canadian border north of Maine to honor U.S. veterans and troops. He stopped at Melfa Volunteer Fire & Rescue Co. for a short rest Tuesday. Slusser said he's gone about 4,200 miles since April 5, 2011, when his eastern coastline walk began. A friend drove him over the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel earlier this week. A Navy veteran who served in Europe during the Vietnam Era, Slusser already has walked "from sea to shining sea." He went from San Diego to Annapolis last year while pulling his cart of belongings, which includes a cell phone, a satellite locator, flags from all branches of the service and pins in his hat from all but the Air Force. He dedicated that journey to seniors and disabled Americans, including veterans. Slusser said he hopes to walk the western coastline next year, completing 7,300 miles by age 73. "I don't mind the heat but the humidity" is a different story, he said. "I'm losing weight by the gallons." Slusser said everyone has been really nice to him. 

### Some Teachers Get Pay Hike

Four local public schools will be among 25 across Virginia participating in performance pay pilot programs during the next two years, according to Gov. Bob McDonnell.

In Accomack, grades 2-5 at Kegotank and Pungoteague elementary schools will be part of the state-funded performance award of \$3,000 for teachers. An additional \$2,000 is available to those earning an exemplary rating if schoolwide goals are met.

In Northampton, federally funded \$3,000 performance awards will be given for teachers earning an exemplary rating at Kiptopeke Elementary and Northampton High.

In the state program, participating schools must implement performance standards and a model teacher-evaluation system approved by the state Board of Education in April. Forty percent of the teachers' evaluations will



be based on student academic growth.

The Virginia Teacher Evaluation Work Group developed and proposed revised guidelines for use in the state pilot program.

"There is a growing consensus that public schools must move beyond a compensation model that equally rewards mediocrity and excellence and is rooted in a past when our young people did not face fierce global competition," McDonnell said. "Bipartisan support—at both the state and federal levels—is allowing Virginia to implement performance pay in some of the commonwealth's most hard-to-staff rural and urban schools."

### Fire at Ray's Shanty

Flames swept through the bar area at Ray's Shanty Restaurant in Watts-ville Monday, with smoke and water damage being reported throughout the metal structure.

According to <u>easternshorefire.com</u>, firefighters from New Church and Atlantic were alerted to the blaze on Chincoteague Road at about 4 p.m. Once those companies arrived on the scene, the blaze was upgraded to a commercial structure fire and units from Chincoteague, Greenbackville, Wallops, Oak Hall and Pocomoke, Md., were called. The fire was contained to the bar area.

State police are investigating.



### Developer's Plan Worries NASA

NASA has voiced concern regarding the wastewater treatment plant a developer has proposed for the northern portion of Acomack County, according to County Administrator Steve Miner.

"I don't know that they have determined this to be a problem, but they have flagged it for further investigation," Miner said in an email Tuesday. "At question are the rapid infiltration ponds used by the plant and whether they might attract waterfowl, particularly geese."

Miner referred to a Federal Aviation Administration policy cited by NASA Wallops Flight Facility, which is nearby. "Waterfowl should not be invited into a flight path, where they can cause trouble. Whether this design would attract waterfowl would need to be considered. With that said, our processes should look at all development, including the PUD (planning unit development at Wattsville and proposed wastewater plant in Atlantic) for any possible conflicts with FAA guidance," said Miner.

He further explained that the NASA airport is not FAA-funded and is not military, "so there are no standard rules. Therefore, FAA policy guidance is very important. If there is a problem, there is no federal power to mandate land-use decisions, but NASA hawks these as a good steward of the facility and keeps us informed as to their thoughts."

Developer Chris Carbaugh of Berlin, Md., requested a conditional-use permit for more than 62 acres of agricultural land near Atlantic where he wants to put a wastewater treatment plant to serve his project, Atlantic Town Center in Wattsville.

About 120 residents who live around the area have opposed the plant.

In a recent memo to interim Planning Director Tom Brockenbrough, County Zoning Official David Fluhart said the conditional-use permit is not applicable for the project. He suggested that Carbaugh ask for rezoning of the property.

### Court Postings

### **Northampton Circuit Court**

Former Northampton County Deputy Charles Graham, 61, faced Circuit Court Judge Leslie Lilley last week regarding the wounding of a hunting dog.

According to Northampton court records, the case stemmed from an incident on Feb. 26 during which, according to Graham, he heard something bothering his chickens, which were in a fenced area of his Townsend property. Graham stated that he grabbed a pellet gun and fired it at a barking dog in an effort to protect his chickens.

The dog's owner, William Heath, stated that the dog was injured to the point that it had to be euthanized.

Defense attorneys Jon Poulson and Tom Northam said Graham was merely attempting to protect his property.

Lilley found Graham guilty of misdemeanor animal cruelty and dropped the felony malicious wounding charge.

Graham was sentenced to 90 days, with all but two suspended. Additionally, Graham must pay \$1,745 in restitution and serve 100 hours of community service.

Graham has resigned from the Sheriff's Department.

### **Accomack Circuit Court**

Ray Thomas Wise Jr., 48, of Daugherty Road in Tasley pleaded guilty last week in Accomack Circuit Court to possession of a residual amount of cocaine found in a pipe in his possession, court records state.

Wise was sentenced to two years in prison, with all but six months suspended. He also was ordered to pay \$1,185 in court fees. He was indicted by information in April 2010 and treated under First Offender Status. The offense occurred on March 10, 2010, the records show.

Eugene Terry Merritt III, 32, of Pine Drive in Chincoteague was convicted of a third offense of DUI, the records also note. He was sentenced to five years in prison, with all but six months suspended, and a mandatory 90-day minimum ordered. The offense occurred on Nov. 24, 2010, according to the records.

contention that the COPN staff report "fails to apply properly standards relating to travel distances for various categories of care to be provided, e.g., all categories which the SMFP (State Medical Facilities Plan) clearly state [sic] must be located within 30 minutes drive time of 95% of the population." The supervisors also argue that the report "improperly applies a standard for location of inpatient beds which focuses upon the impact of relocation upon other providers, rather than applying the regulatory standard which focuses upon access to care by patients. The improperly applied standard trivializes this issue, and is contrary to law."

Harris concluded that both arguments fail to identify particular "standards at issue." He contended, "These facts seem to put the decision-maker in the untenable position of guessing at the Board's apparent intent."

Harris countered, "The SMFP does not 'clearly state' that a particular service 'must be located' so as to comply rigidly with a travel time standard, despite the Board's insistence otherwise. Rather, the SMFP contains various statements that contain the public desire or aspiration that, across the Commonwealth, various services will be dispensed in such a way as to optimize accessibility. ... The Board's characterization of the statement as somehow mandatory is plainly incorrect."

The Northampton Board of Supervisors also contends that the COPN staff report "improperly focuses upon and centers on an isolated population to be served by the proposed facility (Accomack residents), noting that the application is deemed acceptable since the proposed facility ... is proposed to be relocated to a population center. Nowhere is this approach suggested or sanctioned by the SMFP. ... [This] approach is contrary to the SMFP mandates."

According to Harris, "The Board's allegation clearly mischaracterizes" the staff report, "but also misrepresents the law by suggesting that 'SMFP mandates' have been violated."

In his summary, Harris concluded, "Overall, the Board's petition ... is a fusillade of vague allegations, unmoored to the specific references necessary for a clear understanding of what is, in fact, being alleged.

Noting that the Northampton County administrator's signature on the board's opposition document was notarized, Harris concluded, "I do not believe this notarization complies with Virginia's COPN regulations" which require that such a petition "must be sworn ... under oath ... an action that occurs at a level of serious awareness and intent, and consists of a conveyance of truth that is evinced by something beyond the mere acknowledgement and subscription referenced in the notarization that appears at the foot of the Board's petition."

Commenting on the health commissioner's ruling against his client, Fox said. "I don't think the decision was fair in light of the issues we raised." He cited travel distances for patients and **Emergency Medical Services providers** and complained that the staff COPN report did not even consider various SMFP guidelines regarding medical service availability.

Fox also ascribed strong significance to the tradition and subsequent infrastructure of certain medical services having been provided at a particular location for decades. He noted the ancillary facilities and accommodations, such as ambulance routes and budgets, which have been established over the vears in accordance with the hospital's location in Nassawadox.

Said Fox, "I'm going to go out on a limb and say the process is somewhat flawed. They argue throughout the application and the staff report that the facility in Nassawadox is obsolete ... and almost crumbling," yet never released a Virginia Beach architect's report to that effect, saying it was a private document.

The ruling denying Northampton's request to be named a party to the proceedings relative to the COPN application is separate from a decision on the COPN itself. Approval of that application is required before relocation of the hospital can proceed. SHS CEO Joseph Zager said he expects that ruling to be handed down shortly, perhaps within a few weeks.

### Post Offices May Close

Ten Eastern Shore post offices are among 3,700 being studied for possible closure nationwide as part of revenue review, Michele Martel, district communications coordinator for the U.S. Postal Service, said this week.

The offices are Assawoman, Craddockville, Harborton, Locustville, Marionville, Sanford, Saxis, Townsend, Willis Wharf and Withams. Eighty-five other offices in Virginia also will be studied.

"It doesn't necessarily mean these offices will close," she said. Before any changes are made, community meetings will be held and written feedback will be collected. "In all the other changes, we have never had to lay off any people," she added, noting that job shifts and retirements occurred instead.

"Please remember this is just that: a study list," Martel said. "No decisions have been made about the future of these offices at this point. No decision will be made until the studies are completed."

# **Shore Fighting EPA Mandate**

Nitrogen is a colorless, odorless, unreactive gas that forms about 78 percent of the earth's atmosphere. About 30 percent of the nitrogen in the Chesapeake Bay comes from the air.

Accomack-Northampton Planning District Commission Director Elaine Meil told Acccomack supervisors last week that in local waters, the amount coming from the air is more like 60 percent. In Tangier Sound it is about 100 percent.

Even so, a watershed plan supported by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is calling for the two Eastern Shore counties to reduce nitrogen going into the bay by 25 percent — a feat Meil said would drastically affect farmers. Meanwhile, in more urban areas like Northern Virginia — where officials concluded runoff from lawn fertilizer is abundant — the reduction of nitrogen being imposed is only 4 percent.

The supervisors voted to join with Northampton and other localities to fight the reduction limits. Meil said a major problem is that the EPA won't link the Clean Air Act with the Clean Water Act. She urged the supervisors to get expert opinions on the matter to fight the reduction effort.

County Administrator Steve Miner suggested the county join forces with other counties to fight the issue. "We are not going to have an effect alone ... try with the Virginia Association of Counties ... we all agree with the goal of cleaning up the bay ... politics is in the mix ... it's a big mess." Miner said the Farm Bureau is taking a strong stand against the issue.

In addition, Miner said some of the urban areas also might want to get involved in arguing the reductions. "Just because they got the better end of the bargain, doesn't mean they like the bargain they got."

County Attorney Mark Taylor said he became frustrated with the subject at a recent meeting conducted by the state because of a "lack of knowledge and ability. It's like throwing rocks at a jumbo jet."

Just finished watching the famous movie, "Misty," about the Assateagueborn pony who swam across the channel to Chincoteague with the rest of the herd during Pony Penning. And of course, I loved it. Yippee!

The major motion picture taught me a few things I didn't learn when I attended at least eight such swims and auctions back in the 1980s while working for another newspaper.

I never knew that the Chincoteague Volunteer Fire Department (CVFD) excluded girls and women from riding in the roundup and that there used to be a race between some of the faster regional ponies during the week of Pony Penning at the carnival.

Regarding the first new fact, one must remember that Misty was foaled

in July of 1946 and the film was made in the early 1960s. And ... "We've come a long way, baby."

Still there aren't any females riding in the roundup. "We've had women ride in the past," said Denise Bowden, who does public relations for the fire department. But, she added, right now there aren't any women who have expressed an interest in helping with that portion of the event.

They must be like me. They don't like getting up before the crack of dawn and they love the nightlife. The carnival is fun. Yes, there are plenty of women, like Bowden, who are working in other capacities.

Bowden remembered a quarter of a century ago when rides on the wild ponies were offered. But that was stopped and some years earlier the races — which were done with horses that were already trained — were discontinued.

I also learned that some of the people in the movie pronounced Chincoteague like they were foreigners with that "Chink" sound at the beginning instead of the "Shink" natives and locals use.

It kind of explained why I have yet to get my friend, Julie, from Kentucky to say the name of the island correctly. Yep, she saw the movie as a kid.

My family moved to the Eastern Shore in 1968 and lived in Painter. We had to learn to say that town's name correctly. Emphasis on the first syllable, not the second with the syllables divided between the "n" and the "t" and the "t" being silent. Mom never could get that. She'd say Paint-ter and someone would repeat her word with their Pain-ner.

It drove her crazy. And now it makes me wonder how many times Chincoteague was repeated for those movie stars who weren't listening. I have to think it was thousands of times since they never did seem to get it right.

By the way, whenever I mention "Chincoteague" to Julie, she has to chant her "Chink" word. It never fails.

Pony sales seemed to do well for the fire company in the last few years. In 2008, 74 foals were sold for \$104,625. The high bid for a pony was \$9,500 and the lowest was \$400, with an average of \$1,414.

In 2009, 67 foals were auctioned for a total of \$94,100, with the high bid being \$11,700 and the lowest being \$500. The average that year was \$1,404. Last year, 57 ponies were sold for \$71,725, with the highest bid being \$8,100 and the lowest being \$375. The average bid was \$1,258.

Call me old if you must, but I remember when ponies went for under \$100. In the Misty movie, the Beebe kids got two ponies for that price. Can

you pronounce "inflation"? Or in the immortal words of Abraham Lincoln can you say, "I can make more generals, but horses cost money?"

The foals are typically 4 to 6 months old when they are sold. Due to a federal grazing permit with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, only 150 head of adult brood stock are permitted on the Virginia portion of Assateague Island.

Of course I'm in total awe of the equines. I mean after all they just take to water. I've never learned to swim, so perhaps I could get a hint or two from those wild creatures. Can a pony do the dog paddle? I bet Misty could have. She could do anything.

There are other great horse quotes that I want to use in conversation. Winston Churchill said, "There is something about the outside of a horse that is good for the inside of a man." Does that mean, when the unfair sex gets on my last nerve, I can tell 'em to go ... look at a horse? Hey, Lloyd dear ..."

There's an Arabian proverb that goes like this, "The wind of heaven is that which blows between a horse's ears." Someone from there must have visited Chincoteague.

Hope you get to see the ponies swim back to Assateague today. And remember, "If you want a stable friendship, get a horse."

### Citizens Must Check Behind Officials

Dear Editor:

Since the departure of Accomack County's director of planning, the department has existed without professional leadership. This became obvious recently in the processing of a request for a conditional-use permit for Atlantic Town Center.

The planning staff incorrectly concluded that the county municipal code would permit the developer to operate a wastewater treatment plant on property currently zoned Agricultural. It was only after a town meeting, and a petition signed by 120 residents of Atlantic, that the error was corrected.

The director of zoning intervened, citing the exact Accomack County Code section referenced by the petitioners, as the reason for denial of the developer's conditional-use permit.

The active involvement of citizens is required to ensure that government decisions are made in accordance with established law, and in the best interest of county citizens. The planning staff's failure to understand county policy and law could have adversely affected the Board of Supervisor's decision on this matter.

The handling of this matter and others involving tax collection and government operations is truly troubling!


In view of this year's plans for Friends of Eastern Shore Public Library (Friends) to complete some refurbishing projects for the Accomac library building, we would like to thank:
