Accomack Superintendent To Step Down

Accomack County Superintendent of Schools W. Richard Bull Jr. announced to the School Board Tuesday that he will be retiring in June at the end of his third four-year contract.

Now 63, Bull said he decided to step down now, in part, because the commonwealth is looking to begin tying teacher evaluations to student assessments. "It's a lot of change ready to occur," said Bull. He explained that he doesn't want to leave in the middle of such a transition and he knows he doesn't want to continue as superintendent for another four-year term.

A 42-year veteran of the county school system, Bull has served as superintendent for the past 12 years. "I've enjoyed my career," Bull commented Wednesday, adding that he has no specific plans for his retirement.

School May Become Home to Dozens of Families

At a special meeting Monday, Accomack County supervisors unanimously agreed to hold a public hearing to receive comments on an offer to buy the property at Mary N. Smith Middle School to develop as many as 98 housing units for low-income residents.

The supervisors' main hesitation in supporting the project centered on their insistence that the unique heritage of the former middle and high school be preserved. "It is black education heritage, right there," said Supervisor Jack Gray, a retired Accomack County school administrator.

Gray said that he would not sup-

port transformation of the former Accomac school into apartments until he hears from the Mary N. Smith Alumni Association with respect to its wishes. "I think what they think should be done with it should be done with it," Gray said.

Supervisor Grayson Chesson expressed concern that the alumni association would not be able to raise the money to renovate the school without substantial help from some outside source.

In this case, that assistance is being offered by Dave Kugler of Mark Dana Management, the same firm which developed Accomack Manor near Parksley and Exmore Village I and II.

County Administrator Steve Miner noted that representatives of the alumni association have been involved in preliminary discussions about the development proposal for Mary N. Smith and will continue to be throughout the process.

According to the resolution passed by the board Monday, "There appears to be possible interest by the Mary N. Smith Alumni Association towards working with a private developer through the Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program (LI-HTC) to renovate the school, and add housing units there."

The resolution also notes that the alumni association is interested in retaining use of the gymnasium,

um, locker rooms and cafeteria.

"If this is worked out with the alumni, it could be a win/win for everyone," Supervisor Wanda Thornton told the board, throwing her support behind the call for a public hearing.

That hearing was tentatively set for 6 p.m. Jan. 5, 2011, when the Board of Supervisors will meet for its organizational meeting for the new year.

Meanwhile, a public meeting is being held on the Mary N. Smith school project Tuesday, Dec. 14, at the office of the Accomack-Northampton Planning District Commission on Front Street in Accomac, adjacent to the post office.

Stratton Murder Case Sent to Grand Jury

A preliminary hearing for Trawn Stratton was conducted in Northampton General District Court Thursday. Stratton is charged with first-degree murder, entry of an occupied dwelling with the intent to commit a crime and use of a firearm in the commission of a felony, all in connection with the death of Harold Moses, 48, of Cheriton.

Witnesses called by Commonwealth's Attorney Bruce Jones placed Stratton at the scene of the murder, which occurred just prior to midnight on Aug. 28 at 20247 Cheriton Crossing.

Sgt. Michelle Hallett of the

Northampton Sheriff's Department testified that upon arriving at the crime scene, she noticed that the door of the residence appeared damaged and that objects inside were in disarray, possibly indicating some type of altercation had occurred. Moses was found shot to death in the residence.

Quadrina Ellis, who lives at the address of the incident, testified that she and Moses were about to leave her residence when Stratton approached holding a firearm, entered her home, and confronted Moses, after which she heard two gunshots. Upon reentering the home, she testified that she saw the defendant and

the victim both on the floor, after which she called 911. Ellis said she and Stratton had had a long relationship but that it had ended earlier in the year, after which she became involved with Moses.

Stratton, who is being represented by Hampton Roads attorney

Eric Korslund, did not testify during the hearing.

Judge Gordon Vincent concluded that there was enough evidence to send the case to the Grand Jury.

Stratton continues to be held with no bond in Eastern Shore Regional Jail in Eastville.

Car Barge Resumes Operations

Gov. Bob McDonnell has announced that the Bay Coast Railroad Car Barge will resume service next week as a result of a partnership between the commonwealth, area localities, and the Bay Coast Railroad. The barge, which was removed from service last year, provides connecting service between the Eastern Shore and Norfolk/Virginia Beach.

Last year, the Bay Coast Railroad suspended service on the barge when it identified \$1 million in structural deficiencies critical to the barge's safety. To restore service, the commonwealth provided a grant through the Shortline Railway Preservation Fund, which in-

cluded \$700,000 in state funds and a \$300,000 match provided by Accomack and Northampton counties, as well as Bay Coast Railroad.

The rail-barge connects Bay Coast Railroad tracks on the Eastern Shore with its tracks in Little Creek (Norfolk/Virginia Beach) by barge, operating across 26 miles of water between the northern and southern shores of the Chesapeake Bay. While repairs were underway, shipments were diverted to trucks for transport through the bridge-tunnel, or to Norfolk Southern for rail shipment through Maryland and back down to Hampton Roads. Consequently, shipping times were longer.

Court & Police Postings

Wicomico Bureau of Investigation

Three young Accomack County men have been charged in connection with a Dec. 1 robbery at gunpoint of the "Dash In" Store on Main Street in Willards, Md.

According to investigators at the Wicomico Bureau of Investigation, Dalton Earl Entzminger Jr., 17, of Onancock is charged with armed robbery, conspiracy to commit armed robbery, robbery, conspiracy to commit robbery, conspiracy to commit first-degree assault, conspiracy to commit second-degree assault, theft under \$1,000, and conspiracy to commit theft under \$1,000.

Akeem Samir Mason, 17, of Painter is charged with armed robbery, robbery, conspiracy to commit robbery, first-degree assault, second-degree assault, having a handgun in a vehicle, carrying a handgun, and theft under \$1,000.

Both are charged as adults.

Takeyah La'Day Mason, 20, of Melfa, charged with conspiracy to commit armed robbery, robbery,

conspiracy to commit robbery, conspiracy to commit first-degree assault and conspiracy to steal less than \$1,000. All three were taken to the Wicomico Detention Center.

Accomack Circuit Court

According to Commonwealth's Attorney Gary Agar, sentencing was deferred recently in Accomack County Circuit Court until presentence reports are completed for Keenan Goodwine, 19, of Atlantic, convicted of robbery and use of a firearm; and Thomas Bunting, 27, of Melfa, found guilty of aggravated sexual battery.

Derrick Reid, 22, of Nassawadox was sentenced to five years each on counts of breaking and entering, robbery and use of a shotgun, for a total of 15 years to serve.

Jesse Mariner, 28, of Keller was sentenced for burglary and grand larceny to 10 years on each count, with all but three years suspended.

Keshawn Savage, 21, of New Church was sentenced for hit and run to three years, with all but one year suspended.

Jonathan Stevens, 27, of Quinby was sentenced for burglary and petty larceny to five years plus 12 months, suspended, and ordered to perform community service.

Joann Ball, 57, of Accomac was sentenced for possession of cocaine to 10 years, with all but 12 months suspended.

Michael Sample Jr., 25, of Painter, was sentenced on two counts of breaking and entering and two counts of grand larceny to 10 years on each count, to run concurrently, all suspended except for time spent in a detention/diversion center.

U.S. District Court

James C Alberts, 45, of Point Pleasant, N.J., pleaded guilty this week in Norfolk federal court to one count of conspiring to commit bank fraud. Neil H MacBride, U.S. attorney for the Eastern District of Virginia, made the announcement after the plea was accepted by U.S. District Judge Raymond A Jackson.

Alberts will be sentenced on March 21, 2011, and faces up to 30 years in prison.

According to court documents, Alberts was involved in a conspira-

cy to commit mortgage fraud on various properties located in the Cape Charles area.

The court records indicate Alberts was a co-owner of Creative Property Development, a company involved in the purchase, development, and sale of real estate in Northampton County. The court documents state that Alberts sold real estate developed by Creative Property Developments to his fellow co-conspirators. To effect the sales, Alberts provided the co-conspirators with the necessary funds to make the down payments and qualify for mortgage loans, but did not disclose this arrangement on the mortgage loan applications. As a result of these sales, Creative Property Developments earned hundreds of thousands of dollars of profit.

Because of his actions, Alberts' co-conspirators fraudulently obtained mortgage loans valued in excess of \$2.8 million. This case was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the U.S. Secret Service, and Virginia State Police. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Robert J Seidel Jr and Joseph L Kosky are prosecuting the case.



Planners Review Standards That Would Apply to Wind Turbines

The Northampton County Planning Commission conducted a public hearing this week on a proposed amendment to the county's wind-turbine standards.

Bill Parr, the lone member of the public in attendance for the hearing, questioned wording that would limit antenna placement on wind turbines. Parr said that as worded, the amendment sounds as though everyone with a wind turbine on their residential property would not be allowed to have an antenna on their property.

Planning Commission Chairman Dave Fauber responded that the intention of the proposal is to prevent the installation of antennas such as might be found on a cell-phone tower on a structure located on residential property. The commissioners discussed possible wording for the amendment that might clear up the misunderstanding and eventually agreed to drop wording regarding antenna placement on the wind turbines before forwarding the proposal to the Board of Supervisors.

The commissioners reviewed a draft ordinance regarding the application of bio-solids on property in the county. Fauber noted that there are different categories of bio-solids. Some may be applied as fertilizer on agricultural land.

A concern raised by some members regarded possible legal action against a property owner's responsibility should contaminants from such an application reach the Chesapeake Bay.

Commissioner John Wescoat Jr. voiced a concern that a landowner who rents his farmland could end up paying to defend himself in a lawsuit filed by an aquaculture operator seeking damages as a result of such contamination. The commissioners agreed to study the issue further before forwarding any related proposal to the Board of Supervisors.

Prior to recessing the meeting, the commissioners elected Fauber and Martina Coker to serve as chair and vice chair of the Planning Commission, respectively, for the coming year.

relatively small number of staff people who handle a huge number of drafting requests. It is amazing that they often are able to turn around these requests without the need for extensive revision.

Legislators, like most of us, tend to procrastinate somewhat and so there is a deluge of drafting requests toward the beginning of the Session. Legislative Services will handle thousands of drafting requests. Fortunately, in the odd-numbered years, the House has imposed upon itself a limitation of 15 bills per member. While controversial when it was enacted a couple of years ago, I believe it is a great process for forcing legislators to prioritize and cut back on often unnecessary legislation. As I finalize my Legislative Package for 2011, I will share the legislation with you.

Certainly, I continue to be concerned about the possibility of our Circuit Court judgeship not being funded upon the mandatory retirement of Judge Glen Tyler at the end of this year. As you may recall,

the Assembly during the budgetary crisis last year left unfunded 17 judgeships across the commonwealth which were either vacant or would become vacant, in an effort to save money. Ours is a unique situation which I think and hope is uniformly realized within the budget committees. While it may be unlikely that all 17 positions are funded, I am hopeful that a system of prioritization will be used and those with the most acute need will receive funding. I have been working with the two counties and other groups, as well as other legislators, to garner support for the funding of our Circuit Court judgeship. I believe that a resident Circuit Court judge is vitally important for the administration of justice on the Shore. I will be in Richmond on Dec. 17 for the governor's presentation of his proposed amendments to our commonwealth's budget.

While the economic indicators are such that the economy may have bottomed out and stabilized in Virginia, we are still thus far on track to fall short of the revenue estimates upon which our two-year budget was based. While at

present we appear to be headed for a \$200 million shortfall, the slightly improved economic indicators may erase a portion of that prior to the adoption of budget amendments in February 2011.

I will be holding my annual pre-session town hall meetings with Sen. Ralph Northam on the following schedule:

- Tuesday, Jan. 4, 2011, 6 p.m., Chincoteague Center;
- Wednesday, Jan. 5, 2011, 5:30 p.m., Saint Charles Church, Cape Charles;
- Wednesday, Jan. 5, 2011, 7 p.m., Eastern Shore Community College.

It is helpful to us as legislators for people to join the discussion of issues that face our commonwealth and the Eastern Shore. And look for a survey from me which should reach you by mail in early January seeking your thoughts and suggestions regarding particular issues before our commonwealth's government.







Exmore Councilmen Seek Ouster for Mayoral Losers

At Monday's meeting, Exmore Town Councilmen Charles Massey and Charles Ward recommended that Council members who run unsuccessfully for mayor should step down from their Council position.

Currently, no other Shore town includes such a clause in its charter.

Ward and Massey stressed that this recommendation was not aimed at anyone currently serving. Councilman David Scanlan, who was unsuccessful in his bid for mayor in the previous election, noted that he had been elected by town citizens to a four-year Council term and he saw no reason to step down before his current term expires. Scanlan pointed out that there are more pressing issues facing Council than changing the town charter.

Interim Town Manager Artie Miles interjected that any recommendation by Council would need to be forwarded to the General Assembly before the charter could be

changed. Council agreed to conduct a work session to review this and other proposed changes to the charter prior to submitting such a request to the General Assembly.

In other business, Council selected a medium blue for the repainting of the town water tank, to be completed next spring by Southern Corrosion, Inc.

Council agreed to form a committee to review the town's personnel policy. The committee will include members of Town Council as well as department heads.

New Shellfish-Growing Zones Expected To Be Established

The Virginia Marine Resources Commission is trying something new to expand the ecologically beneficial farming of oysters and clams on state-owned water bottoms.

The VMRC is expected to approve the creation of 15 new Aquaculture Opportunity Zones. Roughly half of the total zone acreage of more than 1,000 acres is near Tangier.

These zones, which will set aside prime state-owned water bottoms for the farming of shellfish in cages, were identified through extensive, on-site commission inspections. They are located on hard bottom, in clean shallow waters that are without underwater grasses that must be protected to preserve their value as nurseries for fish and crabs. These zones also are sufficiently sheltered, within reasonable distance of off-loading sites and are not within the riparian areas of waterfront property owners.

The zones are not on privately leased oyster grounds nor on public oyster grounds known as Baylor Grounds.

"These are excellent locations for

the farming of oysters and clams in on-bottom cages," said Doug Domenech, Virginia's Secretary of Natural Resources. "Shellfish have an amazing ability to purge the water, which will help clean the bay, and the economic benefits from an expanded aquaculture industry are potentially quite substantial."

In the new aquaculture opportunity zones, the commission will waive the normal costs to lease water bottoms for private oyster growing, including surveying, advertising, deed recording and the payment of annual rent. These costs typically range from \$600 to \$1,100.

A streamlined permitting process will eliminate surveying and advertising requirements. A simple application will be required.

"Shellfish aquaculture is more dependable than going out and catching oysters," said VMRC Fisheries Chief Jack Travelstead, "and reduces pressure on our wild stocks that have been suffering under the pressure of two oyster diseases."

The new aquaculture zones will be divided into a maximum of five-

acre blocks and assigned on a first-come, first-served basis to any Virginian. A one-time application fee of \$100 will be levied. Harvest reporting is mandatory. Other permits may be required.

Some annual fees apply for use of this state-owned property in a for-profit venture, just as they do for privately leased water bottoms for shellfish farming. Only on-bottom cages will be permitted in the new aquaculture zones, marked by

one buoy each. The cages cannot be placed near navigation channels or private piers without the consent of the property owners.

The VMRC has scheduled a public hearing and a vote on the creation of the new zones at its Jan. 25, 2011, meeting.






