# Supervisors Conduct Public Hearings

The Northampton County Board of Supervisors conducted a series of public hearings at Tuesday.

Daniel and Charlene Weeks requested a special-use permit to operate an artisan studio for the purpose of making and selling furniture in Silver Beach. According to the request, there will be no retail sales from the site. The supervisors voted 6-0 to grant the request.

Andrew Barbour and Louise Orlando requested a special-use permit to operate a specialty food production operation from their home near Townsend. Several speakers, including neighbor William Parr, voiced support for the project, noting that it fits in with the county's Comprehensive Plan and that it would have very little impact on the surrounding residential community. Barbour said his business would not conduct retail sales from his home and no extra traffic would be generated by the business. His plans do not call for having additional employees. The supervisors voted 6-0 to grant the request.

Two special-use permits drew more attention. The first, a minor special-use permit requested by William Parr of Townsend, was to hold special events such as weddings at a 127-year old barn on his property. The most vocal of speakers against the project were neighbors Andrew Barbour and Louise Orlando, who said they are concerned over the noise and number of people attending such events. According to Parr, the Barbour property is a halfmile away. "I believe that any potential adverse impacts to adjoining property can and will be mitigated so that they are not substantial," he told the board. Parr noted that a letter of support he received in 2008 from Barbour did not mention noise. The only substantial

# March of Dimes Names New Ambassadors

Ashley and Kenneth Reese of Atlantic have three sons: 9-year-old Joshua, 3-year-old Jaxon, and 18-month-old Jaden. Although all three boys were born prematurely, theirs is a happy story.

The Reese family has been named this year's Eastern Shore Ambassador Family for the March of Dimes.

"They are just a great family!" said Susan Turner, Eastern Shore March of Dimes community director. "They've had three children who were premature, and they are all now very healthy,"

Ashley, who works for NASA Federal Credit Union, was the co-chair for the office March of Dimes team. It was during a conversation with Susan, to get information for the team walkers, that she was told her family had been chosen as the area's ambassador family.

Ashley met her husband, Kenneth, a police officer on Chincoteague, at church where his father was pastor. They will be celebrating their 10th anniversary in June.

Their first son, Joshua, was born a year later, after just 36 weeks of gestation. "He was admitted to Peninsula Regional Medical Center (PRMC) in Salisbury with a high fever and jaundice," said Ashley. He was in the hospital for a week, but there were no long-term effects.

With their second son, Jaxon, Ashley went into labor at 32 weeks. The doctors were able to stop the labor, but only for three weeks. Jaxon, born at 35 weeks, went into respiratory distress.

In the hospital, Jaxon received surfactant to enable normal lung function. According to marchofdimes.com, natural "surfactant is a foamy substance that lines the lungs in mature babies and keeps them from collapsing, making it easier to breathe in and out." March of Dimes has supported research on lung surfactant for premies.

"Widespread use of surfactant has contributed to a significant drop in deaths," according to marchofdimes.com

Jaxon was in the hospital in Salisbury for a week and a half before he was able to go home to his new family. Like his brother, Jaxon has had no long-term problems.

Ashley went into labor with their youngest son,

problem cited in the letter was the use of a farm road that is shared by many. Parr said that he would be installing a 3,000-foot private road on his property Barbour has pressed to insure that if the permit were requested, several riders would be attached governing what type of event could be held, the hours of operation and that Parr must continue to live on the site. After additional discussion by the supervisors, they agreed to continue the public hearing at their

May meeting.

A second controversial permit request came from Delsea Energy, LLC to erect a temporary Meteorological Tower (MET) near Kiptopeke. Speaking for the project, Stephen Volkert eplained that the tower would be used to gather wind data over the next two years to help determine the feasibility of constructing wind power generation towers in the county. Much of the opposition voiced at the meeting concerned possible bird

and bat collisions with the tower. Volkert said he would comply with requests by the county to install bird deflectors and bat detectors on the 197-foot tower to allay those fears. He stated that his company has several such towers installed in nearby states, as well as in Accomack County. The supervisors voted 6-0 to support the request.

The supervisors considered a request by Shore Christian Academy of Exmore to be granted non-profit status and voted 5-1 (Murray opposed) to grant the request.

David Kabler requested support for a resolution to help attract tall ships to the Cape Charles area as a way to increase tourism for the county. Kabler has been working to attract the vessels, which traditionally have visited Hampton Roads and Baltimore during the summer season. The supervisors voted to support the resolution.

County Finance Director Glenda Bradley announced that she would be resigning her position this year as she will be leaving the area.

The supervisors will take a walkthrough of the newly constructed courthouse and administration building prior to their meeting April 25. County Administrator Katie Nunez noted that construction on the new Court Services-Probation Services building has begun. The structure will be located just to the south of the current courthouse.

Nunez announced that the public hearing on the county's redistricting plan will be held at the former Northampton Middle School on April 25 at 6:30 p.m. The proposal calls for several adjustments, including a reduction in the num-



# **Doughty Declares Candidacy for Northampton Sheriff**

David L. Doughty, who was appointed Northampton sheriff in January.


announced this week that he will seek election to the post in November.

The 41-year-old Northampton native was appointed sheriff on Jan. 1 to fill the unexpired term of Sheriff Jack Robbins, Doughty served as a deputy with the department for 17 years, beginning as a jail officer in 1994 under Sheriff W. Wayne Bradford. In 1996, he was promoted to patrol and in 1998, he became a criminal investigator. Robbins named him chief deputy in 2002, a position he held until taking the office of sheriff.

Prior to that, Doughty worked on the family farm, owned and operated by his uncle, Russell Kellam, and grandfather, Thomas "Boze" Kellam. He also was employed as a certified water and wastewater treatment

operator for the Town of Cape Charles. Doughty said his priorities as sheriff

> include being "dependable, accessible, responsive and accountable to the public." He also plans to start a traffic/drug interdiction team, develop neighborhood watch groups, provide crimeprevention education opportunities, initiate inmate work-



"I plan to continue building community relations through being accessible to the needs of the citizens and initiate programs to help the Sheriff's Office better serve the county," Doughty said. "I have been involved with every aspect of the Sheriff's Office and feel that through my experience. I not only have a firm understanding about how to properly manage the office, but have the respect of my employees. I am very proud of my staff and want us to continue to do the good job."

Doughty completed courses in basic correctional officers' school, basic law enforcement training, crime scene photography and evidence collection, homicide investigation and interview/ interrogation, basic radar training, firearms instruction, and Glock Armorers certification.

Doughty is a member of Cape Charles Lions Club, American Legion Post 56, the Barrier Islands Center and Cheriton Baptist Church. He also

serves on several boards and commissions, including Eastern Shore Boys and Girls Club, Eastern Shore Ducks Unlimited Chapter, the 9-1-1 Commission and Eastern Shore Regional Jail Board.

Doughty headed the Sheriff's Office Golf Tournament, which in the past 10 years has contributed thousands of dollars to charities. A 1989 graduate of Northampton High School, Doughty received his associate degree in 1991 from Virginia Tech.

He is the son of Peggy and Paul Rogers of Cape Charles and the late David L. Doughty Sr. from Willis Wharf. His wife, Cathryn Doughty, has been a teacher and coach for Northampton County Public Schools for 21 years.















# Paone Running for Supervisor

Onancock Mayor Bruce Paone will seek the District 7 seat on the Accomack Board of Supervisors in the November General Election.

"I pretty much accomplished what I wanted to do" as mayor, the 61-year-old barber said this week. In his fifth two-year term, Paone cited the town's new sewer plant as a major achievement that helped draw

"Sage, Walmart, the (Onley) medical center and the new hospital ... to the area."

"You have to be proactive in the county," said Paone. "You have to look at what you're going to need in the future."

The mayor said he agrees with Supervisor Robert Crockett that individual district funds are not needed. He also said that the number of supervisors could be reduced. "I think nine are too many. Five, or seven even" would be better. "Right now there are so many supervisors and bickering and posturing."

"When they start launching those rockets from Wallops Spaceport, it's going to make northern Accomack a tourist destination," Paone said. "We have to have services to offer people when they do come."

The mayor has lived in the area for 14 years. Originally from Pennsylvania, he got his first job at 9 years old "sweeping a broom in a barber's shop. I've been working ever since."

Paone was president of the Eastern Shore Mayors' Association for eight years and is now vice president. He is the owner and operator of Snips Family Hair Cuttery in Onancock.

A Navy veteran, Paone is a volunteer emergency medical technician with Onancock Fire Department, a member of the Elks Lodge in Accomac, the Moose Lodge in Belle Haven, the American Legion and St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church in Onley. He lives on Meadville Drive in Mt. Prospect with his wife, Marge, who works for Hospice, and their cat, Aztec. The Paones have four grown children.

He is a registered Republican. "But I tend to look at myself more as an Independent," he said. "I tend to vote for the person, not the party."

The District 7 seat is held by Laura Belle Gordy, who had previously announced she would not seek re-election but now is reconsidering.

Jaden, at 35 weeks. Throughout that pregnancy, Ashley had been given weekly shots of hydroxyprogesterone, a drug promoted by the March of Dimes to help prevent early births in women who have previously given birth prematurely. After Jaden was born, he also was given surfactant.

"We didn't know what to expect. Each time was different," recalled Kenneth. "One boy was born in just two hours and the other two she was in labor with forever."

The Reese boys are all healthy and happy. Kenneth said it takes a lot of coffee to keep up with them. Joshua, a third-grader at Chincoteague, is very much the big brother and is looking forward to riding his bicycle in the March for Babies in May. Jaxon spends a lot of time in his police car cruiser in the yard and playing with his guinea pig, Stinky. Jaden likes to ride shotgun in the police cruiser. He's learning to walk and before long, he cer-

tainly will be racing big brother Joshua on the bike or Jaxon on the police cruiser.

"The March of Dimes raises funds to support research and education to help overcome birth defects," said Turner. "I hope that everyone who is able will come out to join us for the March of Dimes, March for Babies to take place on May 15th in Onancock."

# CAPITAL LETTERS

On Monday April 4, 2011, at noon, the Virginia General Assembly began its once-

a-decade task of redrawing legislative districts when it convened in a Special Session for the purpose of redistricting.

The House redistricting proposal, which is expected to be approved by the Senate, redraws the lines of our 100th House District and takes in a portion of what was the 87th House District in Norfolk, represented by Del. Paula Miller. That district is "moving" to Northern Virginia because of the explosive population growth there. Paula has been a great friend and a great delegate and she will be missed.

All together, there will be four new

House of Delegates seats in the Northern Virginia area, which were previously located in Hampton Roads and Southwest Virginia. While I have had the pleasure of representing a portion of the City of Norfolk since elected in 2003, the 100th District has now a larger portion of the city, and includes great neighborhoods. I am excited and pleased about the prospect of representing them. I have enjoyed representing my current portion of the city and have made many friends there. I enjoy a great relationship with Mayor Fraim and also with Andy Protogyrou who is the city councilman representing most of my new area.

At noon Wednesday, we recessed the Redistricting Session and went into the constitutionally-mandated reconvened or veto session to consider Gov. McDonnell's amendments and vetoes of various bills. The governor made 86 amendments to the budget bill; we considered them one by one. He also suggested 135 recommendations or amendments to a

number of House and Senate bills, each of which we considered. We fi-

nally adjourned at 10:45 p.m Wednesday and then immediately reconvened the special Redistricting Session for one final vote on the House redistricting plan. The plan passed, 86 to 8, then headed to the Senate. While I voted for the plan, our system would truly benefit from non-partisan redistricting.

At approximately 8:30 Wednesday evening, the House of Delegates recessed so the House Courts of Justice Committee could meet briefly to certify candidates for Circuit Court judgeships across the commonwealth. Revell Lewis, the Eastern Shore Bar Association's candidate, who was interviewed by the House Courts Justice Sub-Committee Tuesday evening in Richmond, was certified as the candidate to fill Judge Tyler's Circuit Court position as our resident judge.

Having been able to obtain funding for the position and having retained the status as a "resident judge," it looks now as though there may be some difficulty in the Senate because of a dispute between the Senate Democratic Caucus and the House Republican members from Virginia Beach over a Circuit Court position in Virginia Beach. The House has offered to put forward our Eastern Shore judgeship as a separate resolution so as to remove it from the other dispute, but that offer has not been accepted.

Should the Senate fail to approve Revell Lewis, then the seat would be filled by an appointment by Gov. McDonnell, who is free to appoint whomever he chooses. The governor's appointment would stand until the General Assembly reconvenes in January 2012, at which time the Assembly could appoint.

Obviously, it is very important to the Shore to have all of this uncertainty about our Circuit Court position finally come to an end and I am hopeful that the Senate will realize that our Circuit Court position, while technically a part of the Virginia Beach Circuit, is very much separate and distinct.

We will consider judges and the Senate redistricting plan, as well as Congressional redistricting, when the Assembly reconvenes on Monday, April 11, at 4 p.m.

I am planning my annual series of post-session Town Halls up and down the Shore on May 2 and 3, with the locations and times to be announced. In addition, there will be an additional Town Hall and meetings in the Norfolk portion of the district.

I expect our work in Richmond to be finished completely after the week of April 11 and I will then be back in my Accomac office full-time. I can be reached there at 787-1094 or toll-free at 757-866-1094. My e-mail address is delllewis@house.state.va.us






NASA has proposed the installation of up to 80 acres of solar panels on the Wallops Flight Facility

Main Base through an environmental assessment of alternative energy at the facility.

The project would generate renewable electricity to help NASA meet or exceed the requirements of the 2005 Federal Energy Policy Act and various executive orders. The project would also be expected to stabilize Wallops' growing utility costs and provide educational outreach regarding renewable energy technologies.

NASA would install up to an 80-acre system of solar panels at the Main Base that would be capable of generating 10 gigawatt-hours per year of electricity. Additionally, 2.4-kilowatt residentialscale wind turbines would be installed near the NASA Visitor Center and the gate/security guard station at the entrance to Wallops Island.

Given the large capital investment required for a project of this size, it would be built in smaller phases over time.
