## Celebrating 75 Years of Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge

Native Americans who once inhabited northern Accomack County called their shellfish gathering place "Gingoteague" or "beautiful land across the water." The island, now known as Chincoteague, continues to produce the tastiest oysters and intoxicate residents and visitors with awesome sunsets.

Chincoteague is a stepping stone for "swiftly moving water," or Assateague, another island that has been the home of the Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge for the last 75 years. The refuge is one of the most visited parks in the country with 1.5 million people passing through annually. The park is so popular because of its pristine beach and its herd of wild

ponies made famous by Marguerite Henry's book, "Misty of Chincoteague."

The Chincoteague Volunteer Fire Company owns the herd. Firefighters are allowed to graze up to 150 ponies on refuge land through a Special Use Permit from the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. They graze in two designated areas on the refuge. The firefight-

ers, also known as Saltwater Cowboys, round up the herd during their annual Pony Penning. The ponies swim the channel to Chincoteague on the last Wednesday in July and run up the streets to the carnival grounds. This year the swim will be on July 25. Some foals and yearlings are sold at auc-

# Arts-Filled Weekend Kicks Off Chincoteague Summer Fun

The Chincoteague Cultural Alliance (CCA) has a full slate of entertaining events planned for Memorial Day weekend, including the first free Music at the Dock concert of the season.

The weekend entertainment starts Friday night, May 25, with Chincoteague Storytellers Guild. Giving a nod to the royal wedding in England, the theme of this month's Story Swap is "weddings near and afar." Stories on tap include a his-and-hers take on gender-segregated nuptials in the Middle East, a traditional North Seas tale of a princess who weds a dragon, and a story on the challenges of wedding planning in the age of Instagram. Admission is free, doors open at 6:30 p.m., and storytelling begins promptly at 7 p.m. at CCA's Community Center for the Arts, 6309 Church St.

Outside at the same location on Saturday, May 26, the Farmers and Artisans Market runs from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. Shoppers will find the best from farm, field, and bay, including clams, oysters, and crabs; produce, meat, and eggs, plus candy, soy candles, jewelry, pottery, and other handmade arts and crafts. Josh Barrett will provide live entertainment and Captain E's Hurricane Grill food truck will be on hand to feed the hungry hordes. The first Wednesday Market will be May 30. The markets will continue on Wednesdays and Saturdays through August and on Saturdays through October.

Sunday, May 27, CCA hosts a reception from 4 until 6 p.m. celebrating the opening of a new exhibit in the Kitchen Gallery. The show's theme is "Beaches," and it will feature paintings, drawings, and photographs by local artists.

At 7 p.m. Sunday, head to Robert Reed Waterfront Park in downtown Chincoteague for a free concert by Blue Crab Crossing. The band plays a blend of contemporary bluegrass with some traditional sounds, a little classic country, and their signature vocal harmonies. Bring a chair or blanket to enjoy the performance. tion on the following day to benefit the company.

Hundreds are expected to turn out at 6:30 a.m. for the Sunrise Pony Walk on Monday, July 23. The cowboys will escort a large group of ponies down the beach from the northern area and to a corral on Beach Road in preparation for the swim.

The Chincoteague refuge includes more than 14,000 acres of beach, dunes, marsh, and maritime forest. It was established in 1943 to provide habitat for migratory birds with an emphasis on conserving greater snow geese. Now it provides habitat for waterfowl, wading birds, shorebirds, and songbirds as well as other species of wildlife and plants. The refuge also provides wildlife-dependent recreational opportunities such as fishing, hunting, wildlife photography, observation, interpretation, and environmental education.

Crabbing is one of the most popular activities at the refuge. Crabbing is permitted in designated areas in Swan Cove and along Beach Road, as well as from the boardwalks near the entrance gates. All

one needs is a line, a net, a bucket, and bait.

Fishing is also allowed in designated areas of Toms Cove and Swan Cove or from the beach, outside life-guarded areas. Visitors may fish after hours by obtaining an overnight fishing permit from the Toms Cove Visitor Center. Anglers age 16 and older must possess a valid Virginia Saltwater Fishing or Potomac River Fisheries Sportfishing license.

All ages can go clamming at Toms Cove. A bucket or basket and a clam rake are needed. Visitors may take up to 250 clams a day. Talk to the refuge workers about any other restrictions.

The refuge's objective is to provide habitat for the conservation and protection of all species of wildlife. The harvest of surplus animals is one tool used to manage wildlife populations at a level compatible with the environment, provide wholesome recreational opportunities, and permit the use of a valuable renewable resource. The various habitats found on the refuge include dune-grass community, shrub community, upland maritime forest, freshwater marsh and salt marsh. The refuge manages hunting through a permit system. For questions

about regulations, contact Chase Sands at 757-336-6122, ext.2315.

The refuge offers miles of biking or hiking trails. Activities include wildlife/wildland observation, photography, education, and sheer enjoyment of the outdoors. About half of the trails are paved while the rest are open to foot traffic only. Trail maps are available at

the Herbert H. Bateman Educational and Administrative Center or on the refuge's website [www.fws.gov](http://www.fws.gov)

The Wildlife Loop is 3.5 miles around moist soil management and is a great place to observe waterfowl and wading birds. It is open to walkers and bikers throughout the day. Vehicles

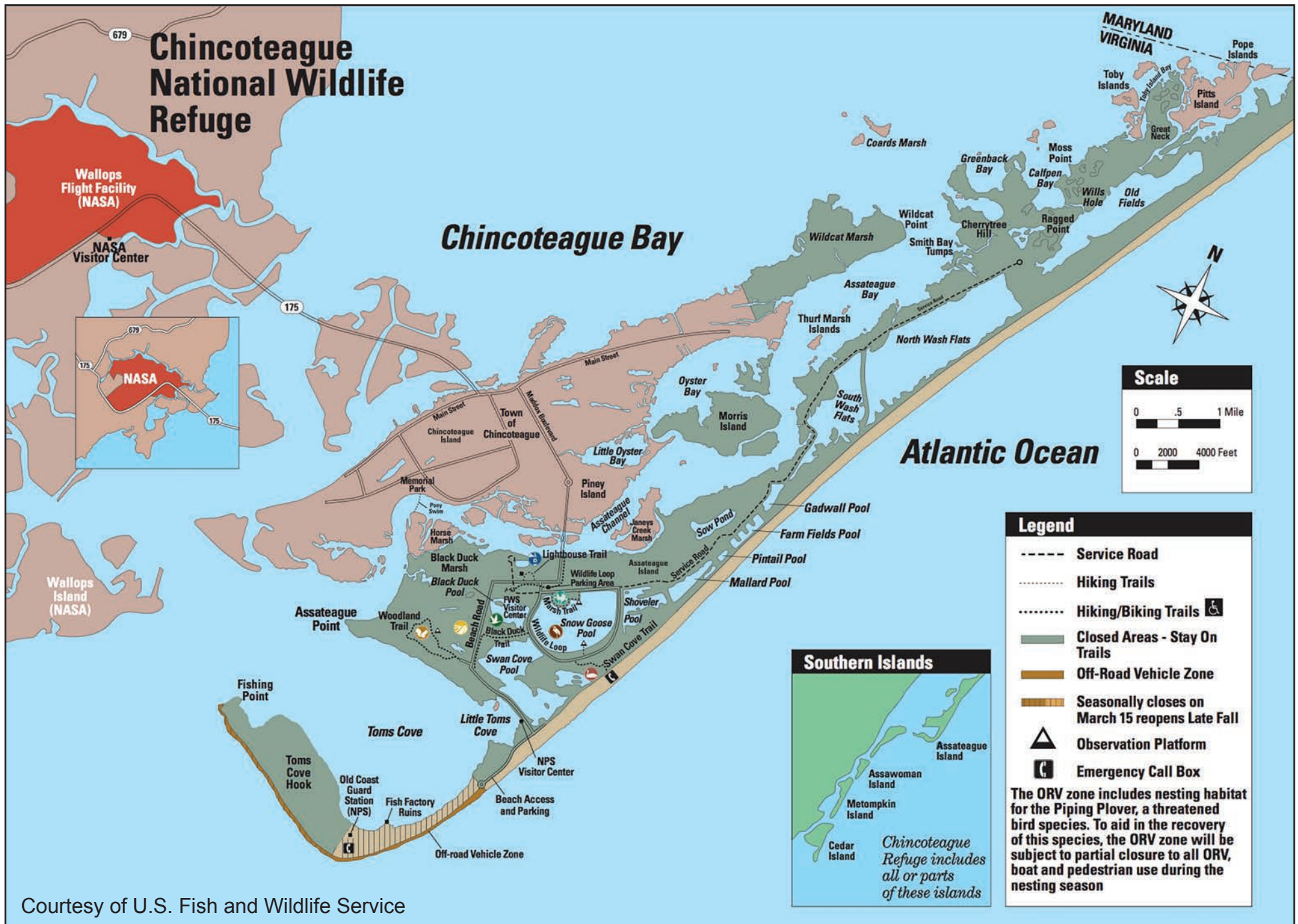

are permitted to drive it from 3 p.m. to dusk. The trail is paved and is wheelchair accessible.

The Lighthouse Trail is a quarter-mile footpath through the woods to the historic Assateague Lighthouse. It is for walking only.

Swan Cove Trail, which branches off the Wildlife Loop, is about a half-mile long and leads to the beach. Swan Cove Trail is paved and open to both walkers

and bikers and is wheelchair accessible.

Black Duck Trail also branches off the Wildlife Loop. It is about a mile long and provides access between the Wildlife Loop and the Woodland Trail. This paved trail is for walking and biking and is also wheelchair accessible.

Marsh Trail is a half-mile trail along the Wildlife Loop. It is unpaved and includes an observation platform overlooking Snow Goose Pool. It is only open to walkers.

Woodland Trail is 1.5 miles and goes

through a pine forest and includes an overlook where wild ponies can sometimes be seen. The trail is wheelchair accessible.

Just off the beaten path of Woodland Trail is Bivalve Trail, where one can take a self-guided hike through the maritime forest leading to Toms Cove where a glimpse of the old lifesaving station can be had. This trail is not paved or wheelchair or bicycle accessible.

Foot traffic is also permitted on the 7.5-mile service road. Bicyclists can access the trail for 1.25 miles to the D-Dike Beach access area. Cars are not permitted with the exception of over-sand vehicle permit holders, who are accessing the North zone for fishing.

Some of The Federal Junior Duck Stamp Program's winning artworks from Virginia are being displayed at the refuge visitor's center. The most current junior duck stamp can also be purchased at the center for \$5. The program was specifically aimed at getting children outside and familiar with wetlands and waterfowl.

Waterfowl Weekend will be Nov. 22-25. Thousands of snow geese from the northern tundra breeding grounds

come to the milder climate of the Chincoteague refuge for the winter. A variety of ducks and swans also show up.

Entry to the refuge is free for several days during the year. Sept. 22 is one of those occasions and will offered as part of the celebration of National Public Lands Day. Free admission will also be offered Oct. 14, to kick off National Wildlife Refuge Week; Nov. 11, for Veterans Day; Jan. 21, 2019, for Martin Luther King Jr. Day; Feb. 18, 2019, in celebration of Presidents Day; and May 11, 2019, in honor of World Migratory Bird Celebration.

The refuge will remain open all night on Aug. 11 for the Perseid Meteor Shower so visitors can discover the night sky. On July 13, NASA's Wallops Flight Facility, the Delmarva Space Sciences Foundation, and Assateague Island National Seashore will offer presentations at 7:30, 8, and 8:30 p.m. at the Herbert H. Bateman Center auditorium. Space is limited to 140 per session. Then from 8:30 to 9:45 p.m., join the Delmarva Space Sciences Foundation and the Assateague Island National Seashore for stargazing with telescopes and binoculars.

## Fishing from the Shore

Despite the recent trend of rainy weather, which would have had Noah contemplating building another ark, local fishing activity has been on the productive side.

Drum action from both the red and black varieties continues to be strong, with an 84-pound black drum coming from the surf! Along with the drum, striped bass continue to be caught in the surf.

Most of the early summer species have arrived, including speckled trout, bluefish, and whiting.

Lower Shore – Mark Snooks, at Chris' Bait & Tackle, reported that drum fishing has held up, despite being

impacted by the recent run of late afternoon storms. Drum anglers are now having to deal with a recent influx of sea mullet, which have become proficient at stealing the sea clam baits that are intended for the larger drum.

Bloxom's Josh Yunker has served notice that there is a new fisherman on the block as he held on to win the shop's 4th Annual Black Drum Chase Tournament. Yunker actually had the two largest fish in the tournament, the largest tipping the scales at 80.2 pounds. Parksley's Ray Willet finished in second place with a fish weighing 66.9 pounds, with Tommy Hastings claiming third place with a 58.0-pound drum.

Red drum continue to be abundant on the seaside, especially behind the breakers of Fisherman Island and on Nautilus Shoal. Flounder action has slowed due to dirty water conditions from all of the recent rainfall. Sheepshead fishing has also slowed, but the shop did recently register a citation for a fish breaking the 15-pound mark.

Wachapreague — Debbie Shrieves, at Trident Tackle, reported that flounder fishing continues to be productive when not being affected by the wind and rainy conditions. Black drum action has been good out of Quinby, with the shop's Capt. Lindsay Paul recently weighing a couple of fish for customers that were just shy of the 80-pound citation mark. The shop did register a release citation for Stewart Hall for a red drum released from the barrier island surf.

Chincoteague — Donna Rae, at Captain Bob's Marina, described the recent fishing conditions as "horrible," with the recent heavy winds and rain keeping most of the local charter trips in port. The shop is hoping for better conditions as it gears up for

its upcoming flounder tournament which starts on June 7 and runs through June 10. The heaviest flounder will earn the lucky angler a cash prize of \$1,500!

Jimmy Vasilou, at Captain Steve's Bait & Tackle, announced the winners of his recent surf fishing tournament, which was held last weekend. In the striped bass category, Cain Taylor took first place with a 29-pound, 14-ounce rockfish, second went to Brandon Morgan (29 pounds, 11 ounces), in third place was Kenny Cross (28 pounds, 4 ounces) and Sung Ho Chung (26 pounds, 15 ounces) finished fourth in the division.

Dave Holtzman proved that you don't have to have a boat to catch a monster-sized fish as he took the black drum division with an 84-pound behemoth! "Lucky" Chucky Leganeaux (30 pounds, 12 ounces) fishing in second and Sung Ho Chung (24 pounds, 12 ounces) took third place. Dave Holtzman took the bluefish category with a snapper weighing 1 pound, 12 ounces.

Upper Shore — Captain Matt Abell, of SeaHawk Sports Center, reported that black drum and rockfish action was still good on the beach. Josh Barfield and a group of surf anglers had brought in a mixed catch of rock and drum. Matt had returned from running three flounder charters out of Wachapreague and Gargathy, with clients returning with five to eight keepers, while Atlantic's Jeff Oshaven had a recent eight-keeper trip. Silversides were the most productive baits.

On the Chesapeake, red drum catches were being made in Pocomoke Sound, while a few speckled trout have been caught in the shallows by anglers soaking peeler crab baits. Rockfish and specks were also hitting lures. The State of Maryland has lowered the minimum length for legal rockfish to 19 inches this week.

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. To make the marinade put all of the ingredients, excluding the steak, into a 1-gallon sealing plastic bag. Shake the bag thoroughly to combine the ingredient.
2. With a knife or a fork, poke holes into the steak and add it to the marinade. Once the steak is thoroughly coated, press out any air bubbles in the bag.
3. Place the bagged steak in the fridge and let it marinate for two hours. Shake the bag occasionally to ensure the steak stays coated.
4. Now place the steak onto the hottest area of the barbecue grill.
5. Grill for five minutes on each side.

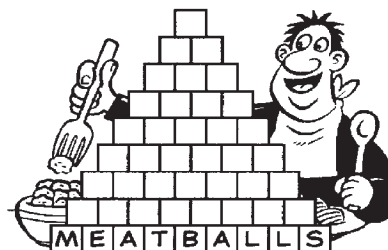
