Chincoteague Celebrates 50 Years of Love

Chincoteague Chamber of Commerce received a \$10,000 grant from the Virginia Tourism Corporation (VTC) for efforts to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Virginia is for Lovers tourism slogan, which was created in 1969 by Richmondbased advertising agency Martin & Woltz. The Virginia Tourism Corporation is the state agency responsible for marketing Virginia to visitors and promoting the "Virginia is for Lovers" brand, which is celebrating 50 years in 2019.

Chincoteague will be celebrating this great milestone with events, activities, and promotions that will take place from June 21 to Aug. 10. Some opportunities to celebrate include: the Historic Main Street Merchants "50 Things To Do On Chincoteague Scavenger Hunt"; visiting the Museum of Chincoteague Island's "50 Ways to Love Misty" exhibit featuring Misty, Stormy, books, Breyer horse models, and more; and stopping by the Virginia Welcome Center in New Church for its pop-up event to receive flyers and giveaways from local partners participating in the 50 Years of LOVE.

Watching a sunset at Robert N. Reed Downtown Waterfront Park is an activity I think everyone should stop and take advantage of. Isabella and I explored Main Street and ended our exploratory adventure on the dock of the park, soaking in the last of the peachypink, pre-summer rays.

There are plenty of shops and places to eat, and there were a few locals and tourists out and about, although I expect it to be much more crowded once the summer months hit in full swing.

Currently, you can view many of the Hometown Heroes banners on your walk through town. There are so, so many, and it was a humbling experience to walk through town and read them all, knowing these people have given their time—and some, even their lives—for all of us.

The local shops were filled with anything from beach gear and Chincoteague souvenirs to pony-themed gifts. Bella particularly liked the horse figurines in one of the shops, and she always enjoys reading, so Sundial Books was a must. Don't be like us, who forgot their hours and tried to go on a Tuesday when they are closedwhomp whomp—but they are open for business the rest of the week from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The store is hosting a book signing July 6 at 11 a.m. for "A Year on the Tump," and Saturday, Aug. 10, marks the "Island of Hope" book launch, the final book by Amy McWilliams Schisler in the Chincoteague Island Trilogy.

The Chincoteague Island Library is al-

so located on Main St., and was a "have to check it out" item on Bella's to-do list as she is all about books, and I'm definitely not opposed to her always wanting to add to her ever-growing collection that is taking over her room. They are open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., open Thursday, from 1 to 7 p.m., and they are closed on Sunday. The library is offering a summer reading challenge, "Lubbock's Learners," Thursdays, from 3 to 6 p.m., for kids in grades K-12. Registration is open through June 20. They also offer a selection of gently used books for sale!

Another pit stop on our walk was in front of a beautifully painted mural, dedicated to "Miss Ruby Lee," as printed on the wall, which sits on the corner of Cleveland and Main streets. The mural surrounds a garden, and is known as Watson Park. The Chincoteague Garden Club maintains the park, and it was created about 10 years ago as a member project. I ran into some ladies who were members of the garden club during one of my Chincoteague excursions and who gave me a little background info. At the entrance to the garden, there is a "free library" box, which was Bella's focus, and what drew us to stop in the first place, of course. She really enjoys seeing what treasures are inside.

Another Main Street attraction is the Island Theatre, and at the time of our walk, "Aladdin" was playing. This weekend, they will be showing "The Secret Life of Pets 2," which is also on her must-see list. We saw the first one and enjoyed it, so I'm sure the sequel will be just as fun. It will run until June 20, before transitioning into "Toy Story 4." Showtimes are listed on their Facebook page, as well as the Island Theatre website www.islandtheatres.com

Overlooking Main Street and the entrance to the Robert N. Reed park, is a statue of the famous pony Misty. As we walked along the bricks, we noticed names etched in many of them. We later found out that the memorial bricks can be purchased on the Historic Main Street Merchants of Chincoteague website at

www.chincoteaguemerchants.com for \$100, and the forms are available to download online. Anyone can purchase a brick to commemorate a loved one and have their name a part of the island. Bella wants to get one with her pony's name on it.

At the water's edge, there is an informational Chincoteague Timeline board, beginning with the first land purchase on April 1, 1671, from the Gingo-Teague Indians, who called the island, "the beautiful land across the water." The timeline runs until 1965, marking the date in which Mayor Robert Reed and the council successfully lobbied congress to create Assateague Island National Seashore. Neither Bella nor I knew about

any of the significant Chincoteague historical events on the board, other than the publishing of Marguerite Henry's book, "Misty of Chincoteague" (priorities, right?), so this was a neat history lesson, and one I am sure many visitors will appreciate. We also learned that every third Sunday of the month, the park holds "Shop the Dock" from noon to 4 p.m., with local vendors, kids' crafts, and music.

The park is a nice way to unwind and end your day. I took some fun photos of Bella on and around the LOVE Adirondack chairs. There is also a picnic area. We were once again greeted by ducks, who are obviously accustomed to being fed. As soon as we sat down at the picnic table, they waddled right on over, wanting to share. Yes, Bella shared.









Fishing from the Shore By Bill Hall

inch size range have been pulled from north end of the Assateague Channel, in front of the Curtis Merritt Harbor, up through the canal and into the Chin-

If the first week of June is any indication, this year may be one of the better fishing seasons in recent years. Already, the complete roster of summertime species has shown up, including spadefish as well as good numbers of cobia and Spanish mackerel. Gaffer dolphin (mahi), yellowfin and bigeye tuna, mako shark, and the first reported white marlin of the season have come from the offshore waters. More good news is that, with the exception of the black drum fishery, which has already peaked for the season, most of the other species populations should only improve, at least until the dog days of summer!

Chincoteague - Jimmy Vasiliou, of Captain Steve's Bait & Tackle, reported that the recent flounder fishing has been "really hot" and the shop has been selling Berkley Gulp 4-inch Ripple Shad for flounder at a "buy one pack, get one free" discount. Off the beach, bluefish to 36 inches have made sporadic appearances. and flesh bunker baits have been their top offering. Kingfish (whiting) have been the most dependable catch in the suds. The black drum fishing appears to be slowing down and Vasiliou thinks the bite will be over for the season in the next week or two. Spot and small croakers have made their early summer appearance and a couple of large sheepshead have been caught inside Chincoteague Bay. A little farther offshore, the shop's first spadefish catch of the season has come from a near shore wreck and good early season hauls of Spanish mackerel have been commercially caught, but he had not heard of any recreational catches. Vasiliou fished an unnamed wreck recently aboard a private boat and reported limit catches of black sea bass. The Close Enuf, with captain John Chenault, returned to port with an offshore catch of gaffer dolphin and a vellowfin tuna.

Donna Rae Roeske, at Captain Bob's Marina, reports that the flounder fishing is continually improving. Fish in the coteague Channel as far north as the carnival grounds. Live minnows, sweetened with a strip of squid, cut bait, or Berkley Gulp are all proving productive. The best fishing for flounder, according to Roeske, has occurred during a couple hours on each side of high tide. Kingfish (whiting) action is still good from buoys 14-11, with live bloodworms as well as bloodworm scented artificial baits. The inshore run of coastal sharks has already started, with several in the 3-to-4-foot size range landed during last weekend. A combination of chum and any oily fresh chunk of fish on your hook has a good chance of hooking up with one of the toothy critters.

Lower Shore - Jeb Brady, at Bailey's Tackle Shop, reports that cobia fishermen have done well since the opening of the season last Saturday, with lots of boats reporting multiple catches and releases. Brady expects the season to improve as the waters continue to warm. Spadefish have made their appearance along the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel, while the Cape Charles fishing pier has produced catches of spot, croaker, and sea mullet (whiting).

Mark Snook, at Chris' Bait & Tackle, reports that there are still a few black drum catches being made out of Oyster and off Fisherman's Island, but lots of red drum are swimming around the third and fourth islands of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel. The start of the cobia season was described as "awesome" with fish being caught by both sight casting and bait fishing. The shop has plenty of live eels in stock, along with periodic deliveries of fresh bunker. Snook added that there were a few mullet (whiting) and croaker being caught off Kiptopeke and spadefish are swimming around the rock islands of the bridge-tunnel.

Wachapreague - Captain Lindsay Paul, at Trident Tackle, confirmed that the flounder fishing was "picking up" out of Wachapreague, especially over the last five days, with a nice new run developing in front of the old Coast Guard Station, in Drawing Channel, and in Green Channel. A few black drum were still being caught in the inlet. Few boats have ventured offshore to take advantage of the recent dolphin bite, but boats running from the south were returning with large bigeye tuna and gaffer dolphin from the Norfolk Canyon.

Upper Shore - Captain Matt Abell, of the Sea Hawk Sports Center, reports that flounder fishing on the seaside has been "really good" this week, with the best bite occurring on the last of the flood time through the first part of the ebb, especially in the deeper water around the inlets. The new Gulp 5-inch grubs have been one of the better flounder baits. He described the cobia fishing as great, especially down along the Lattimore Shoal, with many boats getting their three fish per boat limits from the bridge-tunnel, all the way up to the mouth of Onancock Creek. Speckled trout fishing in the shallows has also been productive as far north as Bloodsworth Island. Several red drum have also been part of the shallow water catch. The Maryland striped bass river season is now open and catches of legal rockfish have come from the Annemessex River north. Offshore, catches of gaffer dolphin and a few yellowfin tuna have come from the Washington Canyon, while the first reported white marlin of the season off the coast of Delmarva occurred last weekend, out of Ocean City.

Bill Hall was the first Eastern Shore resident to achieve Virginia Salt Water Master Angler Status. He has been named Virginia Saltwater Angler of the Year and Virginia Saltwater Release Angler of the Year. Bill is an I.G.F.A. International Committee Representative and a longtime member of the Virginia Saltwater Fishing Tournament Committee. He is the Virginia Recreation Fishing representative on the ASMFC Striped Bass Management Panel and is a past recipient of the CCA-VA Virginia Outdoor Writer Conservation Leadership Award.


