Summer Programs at Wallops NASA Visitor Center

The Wallops Flight Facility NASA Visitor Center has kicked off its summer programs for explorers of all ages.

The visitor center is open every day from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. through Aug. 31, and hosts free programs every Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday at 2 p.m.

STEAM Labs are every Wednesday exploring science, technology, engineering, art, and math activities. Each activity is approximately 45 minutes long and is for children from age 6 and up.

The Friday Rocketry activities give the children a look inside the NASA Sounding Rocket program at Wallops. Each model or water bottle rocket launching will follow a short discussion. This activity is for children ages six and up.

On Saturdays, the center will hold a tour of the solar system, presented in the Science on a Sphere theater. A Wallops informal educator will guide visitors

through the solar system with stops at the sun, planets, dwarf planets, and moons. This presentation is for ages eight and up.

"In addition to the public program offerings this summer, we will offer astronomy nights on the beach at Assateague Island National Seashore, two rocket launch viewings, rainy day activities, and pop-up programming," said Kim Check, director of the Wallops Visitor Center.

Keep an eye out for pop-up events. Drop in for a guided activity about how the Earth, the solar system, and beyond are being explored today. The dates and times for these activities are to be announced.

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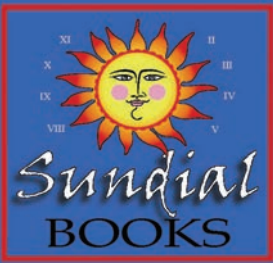

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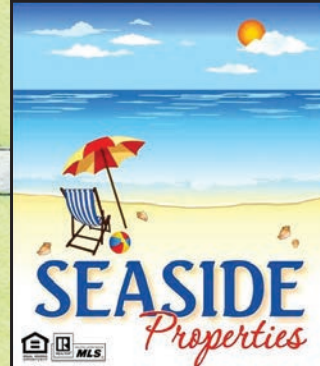

The beach walk on Assateague takes place every year when the Saltwater Cowboys (members of the Chincoteague Volunteer Fire Company) walk the wild ponies from the southern corral to the northern corral, where they wait for the Pony Swim and the pony penning auctions.

An estimated 3,000 people attended the event. The ponies and Saltwater Cowboys came into view just after 7 a.m., but a large crowd had gath-

ered by 6 a.m. Fortunately, the rain held off for the event and just before the ponies came into view, a rainbow appeared overhead.

Many folks saw a foal riding in the back of a small utility vehicle behind the herd and many people were worried that the foal was injured. As it turns out, the foal decided to run away from its mother just before the beach walk began. The cowboys decided to give the foal a lift and let it reunite with its mother in the corrals.

The Mane Attraction: The 93rd Annual Pony Penning

A smaller-than-usual crowd waited in the off-and-on rain for the red flare that would signal slack tide and the start of the 2018 Pony Swim. For some, it is the highlight of the Chincoteague Volunteer Fire Co. Pony Penning week.

At the signal, the Saltwater Cowboys began encouraging the world-renowned Chincoteague ponies — about 120 in all — to step into the Assateague Channel at 8:32 a.m. Wednesday.

The swim lasted about three and a half minutes, and anticipation grew as noses above the water gave way to ponies and foals as they emerged from the channel. The first foal to reach the Chincoteague side was crowned King Neptune.

The swim has grown in popularity and coverage has expanded correspondingly. This year's throng included a helicopter providing live television coverage and a scrum of reporters vying for the best photos and videos.

Fewer people waded into the marsh this year, perhaps deterred by the rain and muddy conditions. Actor Martin Clunes, who portrays Dr. Martin Ellingham on the British series, "Doc Martin," was spotted in the crowd of onlookers.

After a short rest, the ponies were paraded through town to the carnival grounds where a corral would hold the ponies until Thursday's auction. The ponies swam back to Assateague on Friday.

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Fishing from the Shore

Unstable weather moved in over the weekend bringing winds, intermittent rain, and limiting the fishing opportunities for most anglers. Let's hope the weather conditions improve for this weekend's Eastern Shore Marlin Club Annual Billfish Release Tournament out of Wachapreague.

This week is also Pony Penning week on Chincoteague, so most of the charter vessels have been booked for the pony swim. This coupled with the closing of the boat ramp on Queen Sound and the nearly impossible task of trying to tow a boat through the throng of tourist vehicles that have descended on the island has severely limited angling pressure in nearby waters.

Chincoteague – Jimmy Vasilou, at Captain Steve's Bait & Tackle, reports that the surf of Assateague is still producing catches of spot and kingfish/whiting on bloodworm and Fish Bites baits. There have also been plenty of sharks in the suds as well as in the back bay. One angler, fishing from a kayak, "boated" a five-footer long enough to have a picture snapped by a fellow kayaker. Hunter Durham boated a 10-pound, 12-ounce citation sheepshead off the pier at the Robert Reed Town Park. A limit of flounder was made off Inlet View by an angler fishing along the rocks. The inshore wrecks have been productive when the weather has been cooperative, according to Vasilou. The shop is planning a youth croaker tournament at the beginning of August.

Donna Rae, at Captain Bob's Marina, reported that the flounder bite improved with the appearance of clear water before the recent spell of nasty weather. Popular flatfish locations were in the Chincoteague Channel in front of Beebe

Road north to Daisey's Dockside and Waterside Inn and along the causeway near the Marsh Island exit in the old Black Narrows. Action inside Queen Sound was described as slow. Kingfish/whiting and a "scattering" of croaker were coming from the canal out toward the mouth of the inlet. Assateague Channel has produced "mostly crabs" over the last week. The structures off Blackfish Banks have been inconsistent on the few days that boats could fish them.

Upper Shore – Captain Matt Abell, of Sea Hawk Sports Center, reports that the rail cars have been "hit or miss" with anglers limiting out one day on flounder and almost getting skunked the next. One customer limited out on flounder on a recent trip to Quinby Inlet, while another customer boated three cobia off Cape Charles. Offshore runs, when conditions allow, have produced nice catches of black sea bass. Yellowfin tuna have been available to the north for anglers chunking at the Hot Dog. Spot have moved into the waters off Crisfield and are being targeted hard by both recreational and commercial fishermen.

Wachapreague – Captain Lindsay Paul, at Trident Tackle, reported that a few dolphin (mahi) have been caught along the 20-fathom line and a "handful" have been caught in the canyon. Paul reported the presence of "lots of pretty" water, just not much life, and he is hoping things improve for this weekend's billfish release tournament. There was one marlin release that he had heard of on Friday. Wreck fishing on the Monroe has produced catches of triggerfish, sea bass, and flounder. One angler found a nice school of triggerfish around a large piece of floatsam. The inshore wrecks have been productive

when anglers could get out to them. Most recent offshore trips have been cancelled due to the weather. Inside the inlet, flounder fishing was described as "way off" from what it should be.

Lower Shore – Chis Snook, of Chris' Bait & Tackle, reported, despite the weather, the cobia bite is still "good." Spadefish have still been available at the fourth island of the bridge-tunnel. Larger croakers, in the 12- to 14-inch range, have appeared outside of the concrete ships. Red drum have been hitting in the evenings off buoys 16 and 13. Flounder fishing has improved for anglers jigging along the pilings of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel and around the span's fourth island. There have been catches of spot off the pier at the Kiptopeke State Park and along the nearby concrete ships. Snapper bluefish catches have also been made off Kiptopeke.

Jeb Brady, of Bailey's Bait & Tackle, said that the weather has played a big role in the fishing recently. Cobia

fishermen have seen an abundance of sharks with a few keeper cobia mixed in. Big red drum are being caught off of buoy 13. Spadefish are plentiful around Plantation Light and the fourth island. The inside waters out of Oyster are producing a few croaker, according to Brady.

Bill Hall was the first Eastern Shore resident to achieve Virginia Salt Water Master Angler Status. He has been named Virginia Saltwater Angler of the Year and Virginia Saltwater Release Angler of the Year. Bill is an I.G.F.A. International Committee Representative and a longtime member of the Virginia Saltwater Fishing Tournament Committee. He is the Virginia Recreation Fishing representative on the ASMFC Striped Bass Management Panel and is a past recipient of the CCA-VA Virginia Outdoor Writer Conservation Leadership Award.

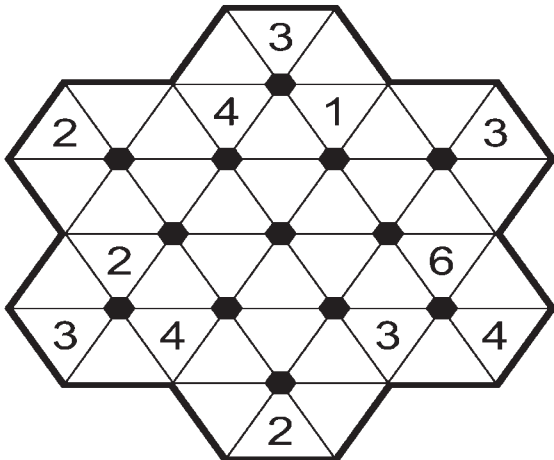

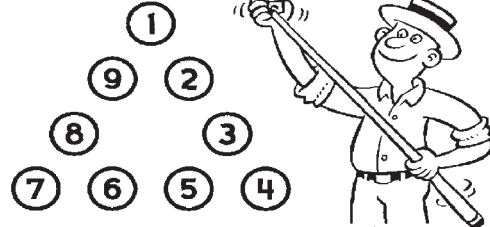

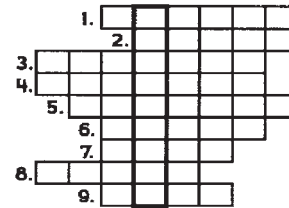

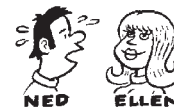
